Water Rights Application
Number S-87507

Proposed Final Order

Summary of Recommendation: The Department recommends that the application be denied because water is not available for the proposed use.

Application History

On August 5, 2009, Roselawn Seed Inc. submitted an application to the Department for the following water use:

- Amount of Water: 160.0 acre feet (AF)
- Use of Water: irrigation of 64.0 acres
- Source of Water: Bill Rose Reservoir, a tributary of Rock Creek
- Area of Proposed Use: Clackamas County within Section 20 and Section 21, Township 5 South, Range 1 East, W.M.

On September 4, 2009, the Department mailed the applicant notice of its Initial Review, determining that "*the use of 160.0 AF of water from Bill Rose Reservoir, a tributary of Rock Creek, for irrigation of 64.0 acres is not allowable, and it appears unlikely that you will be issued a permit.*" The applicant did not notify the Department to stop processing the application within 14 days of that date.

On September 8, 2009, the Department gave public notice of the application in its weekly notice. The public notice included a request for comments, and information for interested persons about both obtaining future notices and a copy of the Proposed Final Order. No written comments were received within 30 days.

In reviewing applications, the Department may consider any relevant sources of information, including the following:

- recommendations by other state agencies
- any applicable basin program
- any applicable comprehensive plan or zoning ordinance
- the amount of water available
- the rate and duty for the proposed use
- pending senior applications and existing water rights of record
- the Scenic Waterway requirements of ORS 390.835
- applicable statutes, administrative rules, and case law
- any comments received

Findings of Fact

The Willamette Basin Program allows irrigation.

Senior water rights exist on Bill Rose Reservoir, a tributary of Rock Creek, or on downstream waters.

Bill Rose Reservoir, a tributary of Rock Creek, is not within or above a State Scenic Waterway.

Bill Rose Reservoir was constructed under Permits R-13163, R-2144 (Certificate 31437), and R-5821 (Certificate 50459). Permit R-13163 allows the storage of 200.0 AF; the full amount being appropriated for irrigation under Permit S-53839. Certificate 31437 allows the storage of 10.7 AF; the full amount being appropriated for irrigation under Certificate 31438. Certificate 50459 allows the storage of 339.3 AF; the full amount being appropriated for irrigation under Certificate 50460. Therefore, stored water is over-appropriated (OAR 690-400-0010(11)(a)) and additional water is not available from Bill Rose Reservoir.

In accordance with OAR 690-033-0330, an interagency team reviewed this proposed use for potential adverse impacts on sensitive, threatened and endangered fish populations. This team consisted of representatives from the Oregon Departments of Water Resources (WRD), Environmental Quality (DEQ), Fish and Wildlife (ODFW), and Agriculture. WRD and ODFW representatives included both technical and field staff. The interagency team recommended that additional limitations or conditions of use be imposed on this application as follows:

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a totalizing flow meter at each point of diversion. The permittee shall maintain the meter in good working order.
- B. The permittee shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month, and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the permittee to report general water-use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the permit.
- C. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter; provided however, where any meter is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

- D. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative measuring and reporting procedures for review and approval.

Conclusions of Law

Under the provisions of ORS 537.153, the Department must presume that a proposed use will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest if the proposed use is allowed in the applicable basin program established pursuant to ORS 536.300 and 536.340 or given a preference under ORS 536.310(12), if water is available, if the proposed use will not injure other water rights and if the proposed use complies with rules of the Water Resources Commission.

The Willamette Basin Program allows the proposed use.

No preference for this use is granted under the provisions of ORS 536.310(12).

Water **is not** available for the proposed use.

The proposed use **would** injure other water rights.

The proposed use complies with other rules of the Water Resources Commission, not otherwise described above.

The proposed use is compatible with applicable land use plans.

For these reasons, the required presumption **has not** been established.

The Department therefore concludes that the proposed use will impair or be detrimental to the public interest as provided in ORS 537.170.

Recommendation

The Department recommends that the application be denied.

Protests

Under the provisions of ORS 537.153(7) (for surface water) or ORS 537.621(8) (for ground water), you can protest this Proposed Final Order. Protests must be received in the Water Resources Department no later than **January 8, 2010**. Protests must be in writing, and must include the following:

- Your name, address, and telephone number;
- A description of your interest in the Proposed Final Order, and, if you claim to represent the public interest, a precise statement of the public interest represented;
- A detailed description of how the action proposed in this Proposed Final Order would impair or be detrimental to your interest;
- A detailed description of how the Proposed Final Order is in error or deficient, and how to correct the alleged error or deficiency;
- Any citation of legal authority to support your protest, if known;
- If you are the applicant, the protest fee of \$300 required by ORS 536.050; and
- If you are not the applicant, the protest fee of \$600 required by ORS 536.050 and proof of service of the protest upon the applicant.
- If you are the applicant, a statement of whether or not you are requesting a contested case hearing. If you do not request a hearing, the Department will presume that you do not wish to contest the findings of the Proposed Final Order.
- *If you do not protest this Proposed Final Order and if no substantive changes are made in the Final Order, you will not have an opportunity for judicial review, protest or appeal of the final order when it is issued.*

Requests for Standing

Under the provisions of ORS 537.153(7) (for surface water) or ORS 537.621(8) (for ground water), persons other than the applicant who support a Proposed Final Order can request standing for purposes of participating in any contested case proceeding on the Proposed Final Order or for judicial review of a Final Order.

Requests for standing must be received in the Water Resources Department no later than **January 8, 2010**. Requests for standing must be in writing, and must include the following:

- The requester's name, mailing address and telephone number;
- If the requester is representing a group, association or other organization, the name, address and telephone number of the represented group;
- A statement that the requester supports the Proposed Final Order as issued;
- A detailed statement of how the requester would be harmed if the Proposed Final Order is modified; and
- A standing fee of \$150. If a hearing is scheduled, an additional fee of \$350 must be submitted along with a request for intervention.

After the protest period has ended, the Director will either issue a Final Order or schedule a contested case hearing. The contested case hearing will be scheduled only if a protest has been submitted and either:

- upon review of the issues, the director finds that there are significant disputes related to the proposed use of water, or
- the applicant requests a contested case hearing within 30 days after the close of the protest period.

If you do not request a hearing within 30 days after the close of the protest period, or if you withdraw a request for a hearing, notify the Department or the administrative law judge that you will not appear or fail to appear at a scheduled hearing, the Director may issue a Final Order by default. If the Director issues a Final Order by default, the Department designates the relevant portions of its files on this matter, including all materials that you have submitted relating to this matter, as the record for purpose of proving a *prima facie* case upon default.
