Request for Water Right Transfer

Dear Water Resources,

I am writing this letter to you in order to explain why my neighbors and I are requesting a transfer of surface irrigation water rights into pond maintenance water rights. These rights, dating back to 1888, were adjudicated in 1926. At that time, the sitting judge decided that we had so much water in the Metolius River valley we did not need any extra or "carrying" water allocated to convey our water rights through the diversion. Therefore, the only water we have is that which is allocated to the ten of us, with a very small amount for stock watering rights.

In 1991, the Metolius Meadows Development in which we live had to reallocate all of our water rights. The water master at the time could not have foreseen the current salmon restoration project and the impact it would have on our water rights. He assured me that we would always be allowed to have water running through our diversion year round. Therefore, he did not advise me to transfer any Metolius Meadows surface water rights into maintenance water rights for the pond you see in the photos. If I had known about pond maintenance water rights, I would have requested the transfer at that time. We also were not required to install a headgate on our diversion as the unused water flows back into Lake Creek. These decisions have now become a major issue with the salmon restoration project under way.

I have included several photographs to show you that we have diligently used this pond not only for irrigating our properties, but also as the only source of water (from the in-ground trough) for the horses, and as a wildlife area for all the birds, waterfowl, and native wildlife in the area to use freely. The Great Blue Heron visits frequently, as do the otters. The Canada Geese nest nearby and bring their goslings to swim and feed in the pond every spring. We also have four mated pairs of Wood Ducks every spring, along with Hooded Mergansers, Mallards, and Barrow's Goldeneye ducks. Deer have given birth to fawns close to the pond in the willows. We have frequent visits from raccoons, an occasional river mink, muskrat, and beaver.

Last fall we closed off the diversion at Lake Creek and began dredging the pond in preparation for lining it. The diversion has sat empty all winter. As you can see in the photos, some water remained in the pond over the winter. This water is an accumulation of groundwater, rain, and snowmelt over the winter. It appears that we have a water table that is several inches above the bottom of the pond, but not enough to keep the pond filled to the point of flowing through the culvert and down the rest of the canal. It is also not enough water to fill the horse trough, but enough to pose a danger as a muddy pit for the neighbors to walk by in the wintertime.

We have obtained a written approval from our homeowners' board to make the transfer of water for pond maintenance. I have had many conversations with our local Water Master Jeremy Giffin, Mathias Perle of Upper Deschutes Watershed Council, Ted Wise of Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, and Michelle Sims, our surveyor. Everyone has been very helpful and supportive of what we are attempting to do. It is everyone's hope that we will be able to keep our diversion full of flowing water year-round. It would be most unfortunate to have to close it off for nine months of the year.
