Dear Mr. and Mrs. Cameron:

On June 5, 2002, the Department approved your request for an administrative hold on processing of the above referenced application until August 1, 2003. On January 26, 2004, the Department received an additional request for another 180 day administrative hold on the processing of your application.

This additional request for administrative hold with the Department will be longer than the 180 days allowed under OAR 690-310-270. However, also under OAR 690-310-270, the Department may grant a longer administrative hold if the Director finds that a longer period is reasonable and necessary.

Based upon the review of the information you have provided, the Department has determined that a longer administrative hold on the processing of the above referenced application is reasonable and necessary. The Department has approved your request for an additional 180 day administrative hold. The Department will not take any action on this application until **July 27, 2004**. Please let us know if you are ready to proceed sooner.

If you need to request additional time your request will again need to show justification for why additional time is reasonable and necessary, that substantial progress is being made towards being ready to proceed with application processing, and a general time line, which identifies when you anticipate being ready to continue with the application process.

On January 16, 2001, the Department received your request for an administrative hold on the processing of the above referenced application until a solution is met.

The Department is in the process of submitting to the upcoming Legislative Session a proposed legislative concept to provide state authority to "broker" stored water released under contract with the Corps of Engineers or Bureau of Reclamation. A copy of the Departments Legislative Concept is attached.

This letter is in response to your preliminary analysis of the water use permit I have applied for.

I am informing you that the options you have proposed do not meet my needs for water required to operate Marial Lodge adequately. The bulk of my business is in operation during the time you say I cannot have water. Therefore, I wish to proceed with the original application and the amount of water stated.

Marial Lodge has been in this location for 60 years. Marks Creek is our only source of water. The creek already has a DEQ approved water system that was approved in the mid 1980's.

I feel again that I must stress to you how important it is for me to have water to put on the lawns and garden. In the summer months when it is hot and dry, using water outside around the premises is the most sensible for fire prevention. It seems to me, it is only common sense to use water for that purpose. Marial Lodge has always been an appealing place to stay in my opinion. Without water, the lodge will lose all of the appealing qualities it has been known for. In conclusion, these are very important issues to daily operations of Marial Lodge.

(hereinafter called the Holder) is hereby authorized to use or occupy National Forest System Lands, to use subject to the conditions set out below, on the Siskiyou National Forest.

This permit covers 2.1 acres and/or is described as shown on the location map attached to and made a part of this permit, and is issued for the purpose of:

A tract of land located in Lot 5, Section 9, T33S, R10W, W.M., as designated on the ground and shown on the attached plat which is made part of this permit. The attached plat shows the relative location and use of all authorized structures.

The above described or defined area shall be referred to herein as the "permit area".

Operating a commercial resort with public capacity (including guides) not to exceed 36 people at one time. This permit also includes a water system and a water treatment shed, as shown on the plat.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

I. AUTHORITY AND GENERAL TERMS OF THE PERMIT

A. Authority. This permit is issued pursuant to the authorities enumerated at Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations, Section 251 Subpart B, as amended. This permit, and the activities or use authorized, shall be subject to the terms and conditions of the Secretary's regulations and any subsequent amendment to them.

B. Authorized Officer. The authorized officer is the Forest Supervisor or a delegated subordinate officer.

18. No fire works shall be stored or used on the land covered by this permit, or in the structures thereof.

19. No fences shall be erected upon the premises, except by written permission of an authorized officer.

20. Nothing in this permit shall be construed to imply permission to build or construct any structures not specifically approved by an authorized officer in the form of an amendment to this permit or a new permit.

21. No animals or fowls, other than household pets, shall be kept upon the premises.

22. This permit is for the occupancy of the land for the purposes set forth and does not provide for the furnishing of road maintenance, water, fire protection, or any other such services by a government agency, utility, association, or individual.

Public reporting burden for collection of information, if requested, is estimated to average 1 hour per response for annual financial information; average 1 hour per response to prepare or update operation and/or maintenance plan; average 1 hour per response for inspection reports; and an average of 1 hour for each request that may include such things as reports, logs, facility and user information, sublease information, and other similar miscellaneous information requests. This includes the time for reviewing instructions, searching existing data sources, gathering and maintaining the data needed, and completing and reviewing the collection of information. 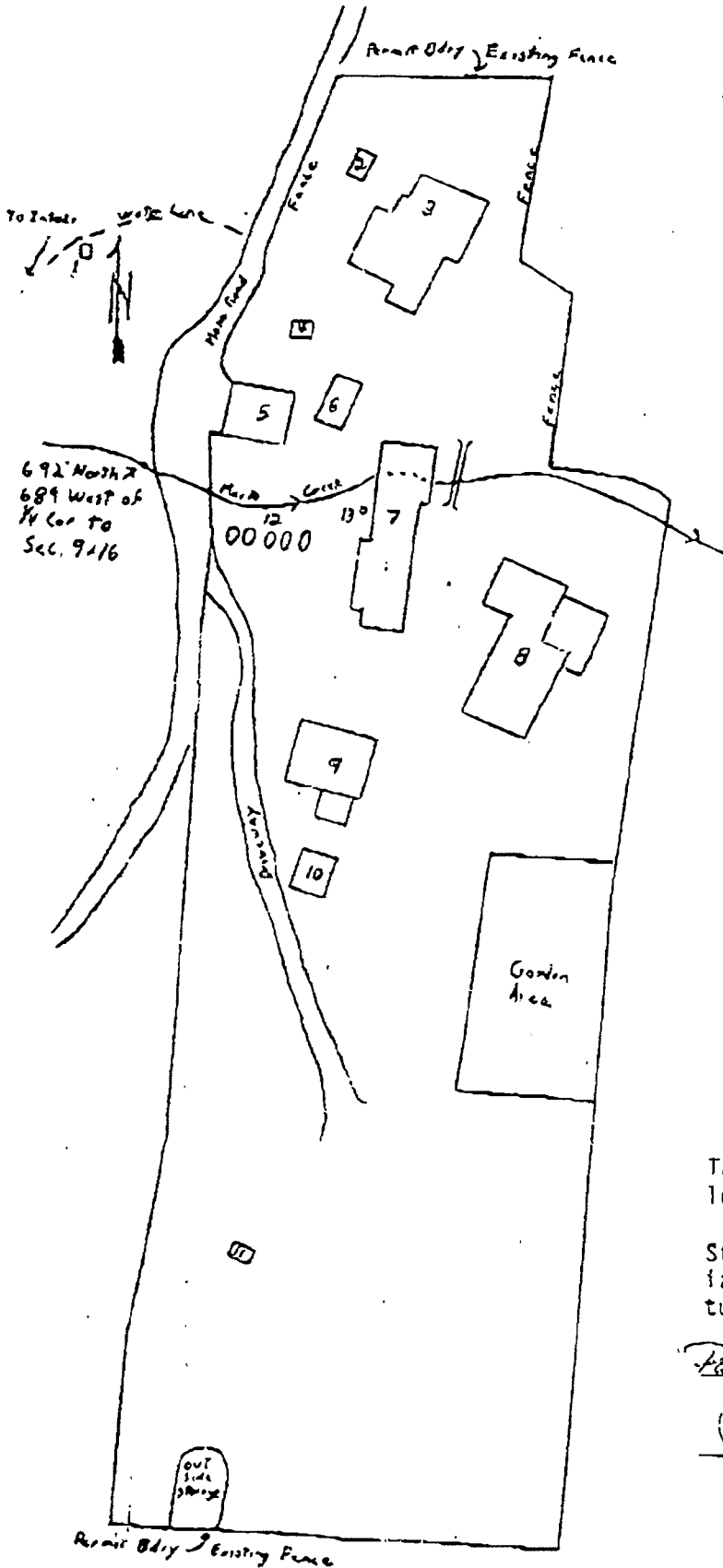
(SITE PLAN FOR MARIAL LODGE)

To: Oregon Water Resources Department:

Marial Lodge has been in business since the 1930's. Our only source of water is Marks Creek which runs through the property. We do business with several commercial outfitters every year. We serve somewhere around 3,000 to 3,500 guests a year in our 6 month season.

There is no alternate source of water due to the location. Jack Anderson who used to own the Rogue River Ranch tried to drill a well in 1971 and went 284 ft. and didn't find a drop of water. The ranch is located just up River from me. Marial itself is located 60 or more miles of logging roads to town, which would be Grants Pass. If I do not have water, the economic impact would be devastating to many other businesses.

Marks Creek is a small creek generally having between 40 and 90 gpm depending on what time of year it is. Fish cannot use this creek because where it makes its way to the river, the water fingers out and goes into the ground around rocks to which there is no channel.

I have contacted the Corps of Engineers, but that has not been very fruitful, because they generally only deal with large municipal water sources. They have no applications for small water users like me.

In conclusion, the lodge cannot operate without water, therefore I am asking for a water right to Marks Creek.

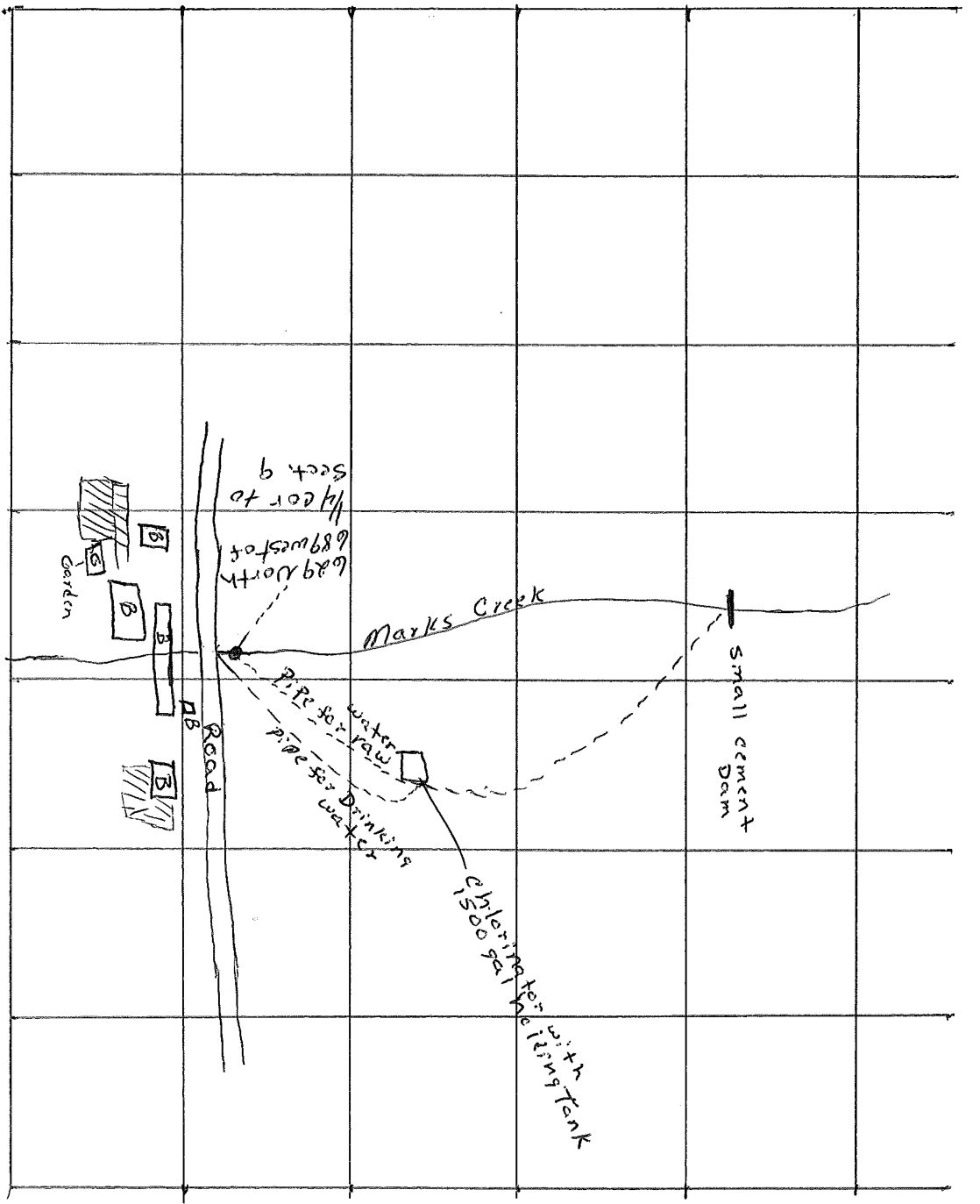

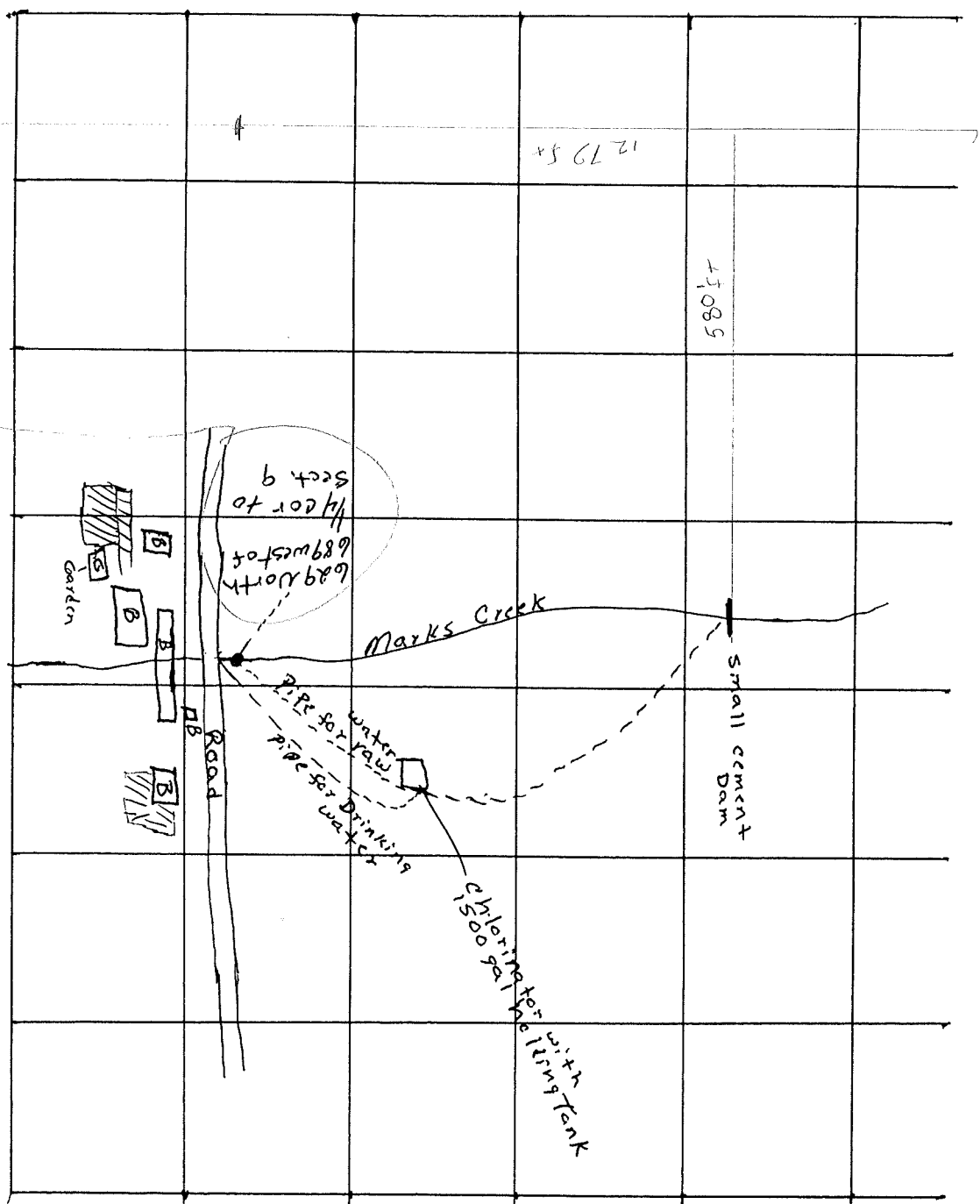
