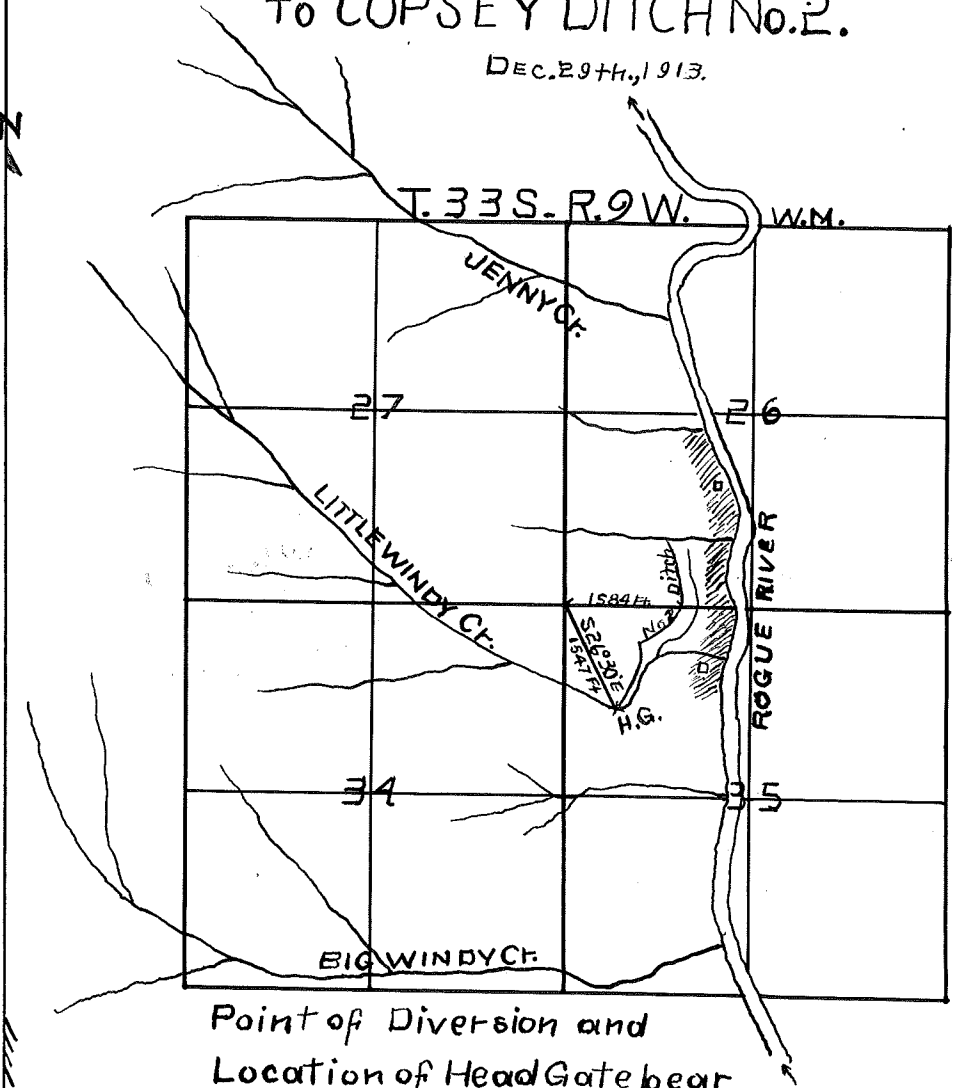

 Cor. Sec. 35, 1547 Feet.

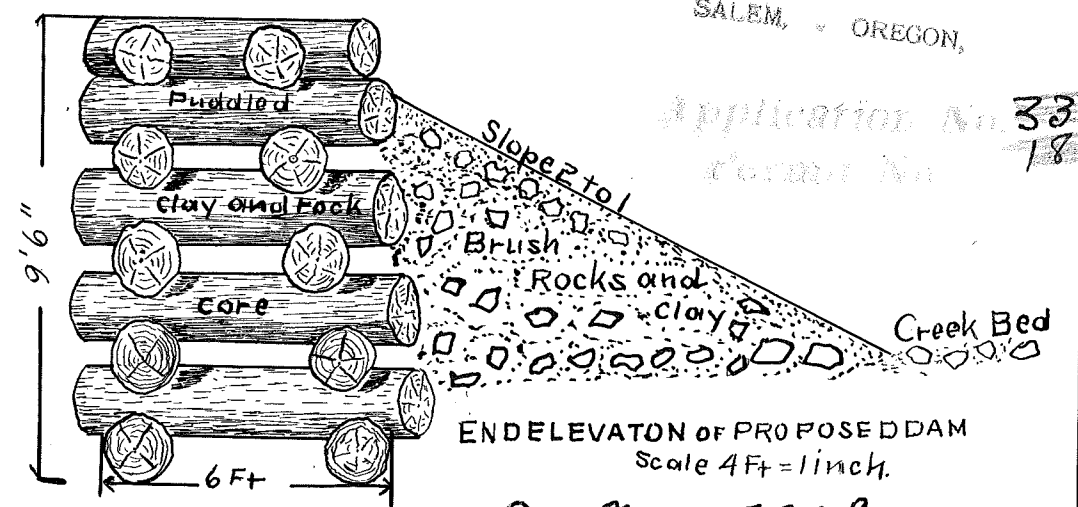

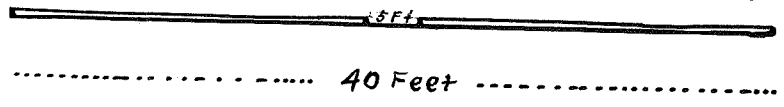


The number of acres under irrigation are three and they are situate near the center of the forty acre tract.
