
PLEASE READ CAREFULLY THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS:

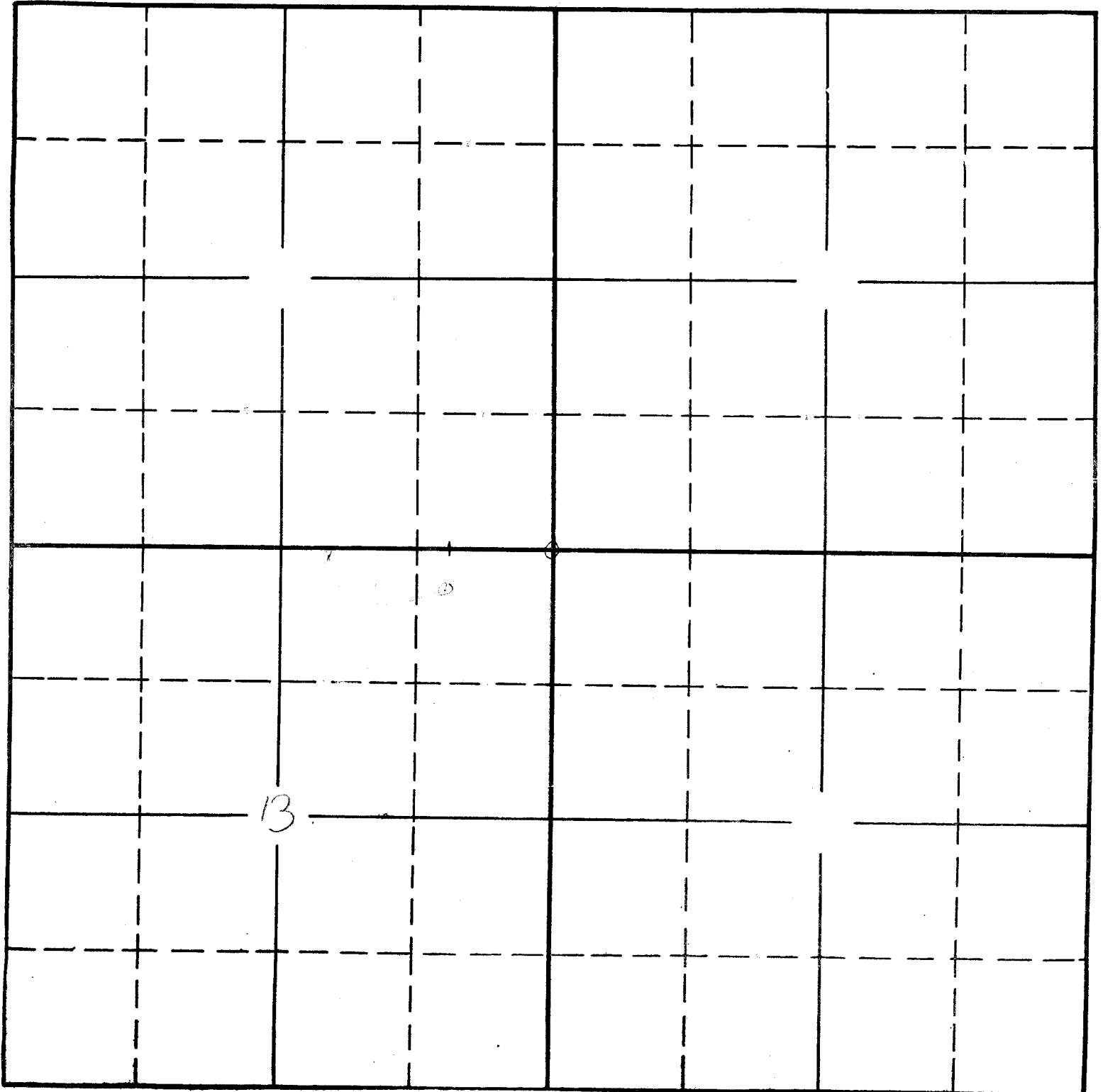




