Dear Sir:

I would like some information in regard to the rights of a Water Permit or Application covering the same. Reference is made to my Application No. 7493 of November 18, 1920. The spring from which this stream derived its source is on private land and was at the time I made my filing, The location of my dam is on my own property and the water is taken from the stream at this place.

Supposing the land was purchased between my dam and the spring by a party who wished to use this water, such purchase including the land through where the stream flowed, Would it be possible for such party to put in a dam in the Creek and take the water when the stream was only supplying the Maximum amount of my filing and the amount that was necessary for my use.

Would the State protect me in case of this kind where the facts are as stated, If the party put in a pipe line during my absence would it give him any right, and what would be your advise be to prevent such occurrence. Thanking you for this information

Dear Sir:-

In reply to your letter of April 25th with reference to your water right under Permit No. 4828.

You understand your permit from this source of supply is subject to all prior rights and no one would have a right to deprive you of water except prior appropriators from the same source of supply.

Any owner of the land above who attempts to apply the water to a new use should secure a permit from this office, and his permit will of course be subject to all prior rights from the same source of supply. The owner of the place above could not deprive you of water except when there was not sufficient water in the source of supply for his prior right.

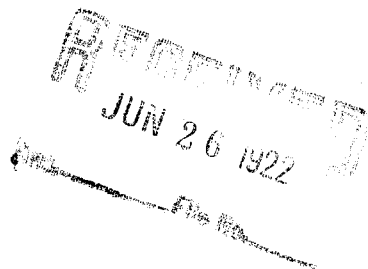

Dear Sir:

While preparing a new indexing system in this office it has been discovered that there is possibly an error in the descriptions of the points of diversion and place of use in your water right Certificate No. 2850, Permit No. 4828 under which this certificate was issued states that the point of diversion and place of use are in Township 10 South, Range 5 East, while the map submitted in connection with the permit indicates the locations to be in Township 10 South, Range 6 East.

The water right certificate when issued described the locations as being within Township 10 South, Range 6 East. In view of the fact that the certificate and map do not agree with the permit I believe it advisable for you to check the location of your property to ascertain whether it is in Range 5 or 6 East. If you find that the property is in Range 5 East instead of 6 East a correction certificate should undoubtedly be issued so that it will properly describe your water right.
