C O N T R A C T

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into at Salem, Oregon, this 7th day of Jan., 1948, between the City of Salem, by and through the Salem Water Commission of Salem, Marion County, Oregon, hereinafter referred to as the Commission, party of the first part, and the City of Turner of Marion County, Oregon, hereinafter referred to as the City of Turner, party of the second part,

WITNESSETH:

THAT WHEREAS, the City of Turner, the surplus water purchaser, party of the second part, desires to purchase water from the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the said Salem Water Commission expects to have a surplus of water available to sell to parties outside of said city; and

WHEREAS, the City of Turner has agreed to construct and pay for all water lines used by it and its water customers;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission and the City of Turner for the considerations hereinafter named, agree as follows:

1. That the City of Turner shall charge rates not less than the outside of the city rates charged by the Commission.

2. That the Commission shall not be held liable for any damage resulting from an interruption of service.

3. That the Commission shall furnish water service by providing a four (4) inch tap from its gravity supply line pipe at a point shown on the Commission's records as Station 398 + 94, near the City of Turner.

4. That when any surplus water is available, then any such surplus shall be metered at said four (4) inch tap for the use of said City of Turner and its said water customers.

5. It is understood and agreed that the City of Turner shall pay for such tap in accordance with the ruling of the Water Commission established December 3, 1937, which reads as follows: "For service pipe sizes larger than  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches the amount shall be the actual cost of labor and materials, exclusive of the meter plus ten (10%) per cent for overhead expense".

6. It is further understood and agreed that such water shall be paid for at that rate charged to such customers outside the city limits at this date, but that the Commission shall reserve the right to change the outside city rate at any time after giving said City of Turner thirty (30) days notice in writing of their intentions so to do.

7. It is further understood and agreed that either the Commission or the City of Turner shall have the right to cancel this contract at any time after giving the other party ninety (90) days written notice of such intention.

8. It is further understood that the City of Turner shall pay for and install all necessary piping, pumping equipment and other material necessary to be used beyond the water of the Commission, which is to be the source of supply of said City of Turner.

9. It is further understood and agreed between the parties hereto that this contract is for the sale of SURPLUS WATER ONLY, as such surplus water sale is provided for in the Charter of the City of Salem and as the term surplus water can reasonably be defined by consideration of said Salem City Charter and the laws of the State of Oregon.

# AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made by and between the City of Salem, Oregon, of the one part, and the City of Turner, Oregon, of the other part, both parties hereto being municipal corporations duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of Oregon;

## WITNESSETH:

The City of Salem is laying a second waterline leading from the Santiam River above Stayton to the City of Salem, and desires to pass through the City of Turner and across and under some of the streets of the latter city, and for that purpose have reached an agreement which they desire to and do hereby set out in writing.

## THE CITY OF TURNER AGREES AS FOLLOWS:

In consideration of the stipulations and agreements herein contained, to be performed by the City of Salem, the City of Turner does hereby grant and convey to the City of Salem an easement for right of way to install and maintain a 48-54 inch water transmission line to serve the City of Salem, in, across, and through the public streets of the City of Turner, the streets involved being described, and the course of the pipeline being defined, as follows:

Street area in the City of Turner in the North  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the SW $\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 29, T. 8 S., R. 2 W., of the Willamette Meridian, and being a portion of the street right of way belonging to the City of Turner, being such part of the street area as is necessary for construction purposes and being required for permanent easement purposes in the installation and operation of the water transmission line, which centerline is described as follows:

Beginning at Engineer's centerline Station 467+31.57, said Station being 1,205.35 feet north 89° 57' 30" east of the center of Section 29 in T. 8 S., R. 2 W., of the Willamette Meridian in Marion County, Oregon, said point also being 21.95 feet east of an iron pipe marking the

intersection of the centerline of Market Road No. 27 and the centerline of Battle Creek Road; thence north  $89^{\circ} 29' 25''$  east 653.39 feet along an easterly extension of Battle Creek Road to Engineer's centerline Station 473+84.96; thence south  $9^{\circ} 16' 40''$  east 7.47 feet to the north line of Philip G. VanValkenburgh and Lena Opal Van Valkenburgh's property at Engineer's centerline Station 473+92.43.

Street area in the City of Turner in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 29, T. 8 S., R. 2 W., W.M., Marion County, Oregon, and being a portion of the street right of way belonging to the City of Turner, being such part of the street area as is necessary for construction purposes and being required for permanent easement purposes in the installation and operation of the water transmission line, which centerline is described as follows:

Beginning at Engineer's centerline Station 475+84.94, said Station being 58.40 feet north  $89^{\circ} 57' 30''$  east along the north line of Lot 19 from the northwest corner of Lot 19 in Turner Heights Addition to the City of Turner as shown on the duly recorded plat of said addition in the office of the County Recorder for Marion County, Oregon, said point also being on the South Boundary of "C" Street; thence north  $9^{\circ} 16' 40''$  west 60.11 feet to the north line of "C" Street and the south line of Philip G. Van Valkenburgh and Lena Opal Van Valkenburgh's property at Engineer's centerline Station 475+24.83.

Street area in the City of Turner in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 29, T. 8 S., R. 2 W., Willamette Meridian, and being a portion of the street right of way belonging to the City of Turner, being such part of the street area as is necessary for construction purposes and being required for permanent easement purposes in the installation and operation of the water transmission line, which centerline is described as follows:

Beginning at Engineer's centerline Station 477+83.32, said Station being 30.92 feet north  $80^{\circ} 38' 30''$  east along the south line of Lot 17 from the southwest corner of Lot 17 in Turner Heights Addition to the City of Turner as shown on the duly recorded plat of said addition in the office of the County Recorder for Marion County, Oregon, said point being on the north boundary of "A" Street, said point also being on a 325 foot radius curve to the left, the long chord of which bears south  $30^{\circ} 15' 07.5''$  east 232.68 feet; thence along said curve to the left 68.02 feet to a point of tangency at Engineer's centerline Station Equation 478+51.34 back and 477 66.13 ahead; thence south  $51^{\circ} 13' 35''$  east 7.50 feet to the south boundary of "A" Street and the north line of Lot 20 of said Turner Heights Additions at Engineer's centerline Station 477+73.63.

THE CITY OF SALEM AGREES AS FOLLOWS:

1. The City of Salem will make such alteration as are required in the Turner water distribution system by reason of the construction and installation of the water transmission line, such alterations to be made without cost to the City of Turner. Such alterations shall be made so as not to adversely affect the operation or service of the Turner distribution system.

2. To restore street, sidewalk, driveway, and other surfaces, culverts and ditch lines, which are disrupted by the transmission line, to a condition at least equal to that existing prior to the construction.

3. To specify in construction contracts, that there shall be a minimum of interference with traffic within the City of Turner. To this end all excavation for trenches shall be loaded into trucks and not dumped at trenchside; backfill shall be placed and consolidated as soon as possible after pipe-laying; surfacing shall follow compaction of the backfill to permit traffic to pass over the excavated area; not more than 250 feet of open trench (except for joint inspection) shall be permitted within the City limits.

4. To furnish one valved and metered connection to the transmission line, to which the City of Turner may connect its water distribution system. This connection shall be of such size, not less than 8 inches in diameter, as to permit the draw-off of sufficient water to supply the average daily domestic water uses of the City of Turner. For water so taken by the City of Turner, said city shall pay the City of Salem such rates or charges as are made to other wholesale water consumers served by the City of Salem and, until a definite rate is fixed, shall continue to pay the rate that the City of Turner is paying at the present time.



5. To the greatest extent reasonably possible, to cross private property within City limits parallel and adjacent to property lines so as not to interfere with the use of the property for building purposes.

6. That this easement shall apply to the installation of one transmission main, only.

7. For the convenience of the City of Salem, the City of Turner shall locate and establish the location of its water lines and for that purpose shall engage the services of one man, and the City of Salem will reimburse the City of Turner for the amount of money paid such man for such services, such amount not to exceed \$50.00.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the City of Turner has caused this instrument to be signed and executed in its behalf, pursuant to authority granted by its council, by its mayor and to be attested by its recorder and the seal of the said City of Turner to be affixed thereto, and the City of Salem has caused this instrument to be signed and executed in its behalf pursuant to authority granted by its council, by its mayor and to be attested by its recorder and the seal of the said city to be affixed thereto, in duplicate, this 24<sup>th</sup> day of May, 1957.

Dear Mr. Guenther:

This will acknowledge receipt of your report of complete application of water under Permit No. 15164 in the name of the City of Salem.

It was my impression gained from talking with you at the time complete application of water was reported under the City's Permit No. 12033 and proof made under that permit, that the city was using at that time only about the 22 cubic feet per second covered by the permit.

Unless the city is now using the 40 cubic feet per second specified in Permit No. 15164 in addition to the 22 c.f.s. covered by Permit No. 12033, it seems doubtful if you would wish to consider water as completely applied under Permit No. 15164 because such complete application would indicate the desirability of making proof, and if proof is made under Permit No. 15164, a certificate would be issued covering only the quantity of water now used in addition to the 22 C.F.S. covered by Permit No. 12033, and the balance of the 40 c.f.s. covered by the newer permit would be eliminated from the water right evidenced by the newer permit No. 15164.

If with the above information before you, you deem it advisable an application for an extension of time should be submitted in connection with permit No. 15164, and the time should be extended rather than certificate issued as explained above.

You have submitted for my consideration six applications for permits to appropriate water returned to you by the State Engineer.

Application No. 9055

has been completed and returned to the State Engineer's Office. The application covers 40 second feet of the waters of the North Santiam River, the point of diversion being at the present intake at the head of the island through which water has been heretofore diverted in the open canal. The date of priority of this right is July 5, 1923.

A check of the Water Commission in the sum of \$44 covering the fees on this application was turned over to the State Engineer with instructions to acknowledge receipt to you. The City has a water right certificate from the State Engineer's office covering 22 second feet of additional water from the North Santiam River, making a total appropriation of 62 second feet.

North Fork water appears that this filing is of no value to the City and it is recommended that this application be cancelled.

Application No. 9713  
Filed July 24, 1924  
Covers storage water  
in Marion Lake

It is, in my judgment, impractical to consider the direct diversion of waters stored in Marion Lake for a municipal supply, not only because of the great distance but also because the water of this lake becomes periodically turbid and carries a large quantity of organic matter. However this filing may be of substantial value to the City of Salem in supplementing the flow of the Santiam to compensate for water which the City may divert and which would otherwise infringe upon rights to the waters of this stream which exceed the low water flow in many seasons.

A very low dam at Marion Lake would doubtless provide the 5,000 to 10,000 acre feet of water that would be required for the purpose of supplementing the water supply during the low water season.

Should the Detroit dam be constructed, it would doubtless eliminate the necessity of the construction of the Marion Lake reservoir as a large quantity of water would then be available to supplement the low water flow of the North Santiam. With the foregoing in mind I have returned application no. 9713 to the State Engineer's office with the request that it be held for the benefit of the City until there is a more definite determination of the above matters. I have been advised by telephone that this application will be held in the State Engineer's office until further notice.

It was proposed to divert the waters in T. 11 S., R. 7 E. This is above the proposed Detroit reservoir and therefore any water stored in the Detroit reservoir would not be available for power development at this site. This would seem to be of no value to the City and I would recommend its cancellation.

Application No. 13694  
Filed Aug. 26, 1930.

This is primarily an application for Power development as it seeks to appropriate a large quantity of water from the North Santiam and Breitenbush Rivers. It contemplates three points of diversion: 1. In T. 9 S., R. 3 E., which would be below the proposed Detroit reservoir and 2. In T. 10 S., R. 7 E., which would be above the proposed Detroit reservoir and apparently above the high water line of the reservoir, and 3. From the Breitenbush river located in T. 9 S., R. 5 E.

The State Engineer has been requested to hold this application until the position of the Government is more definitely determined and the State Engineer has advised by telephone that this will be done.


With the large amount of power which can be developed at Bonneville and Grand Coulee, it seems unlikely that municipalities will develop power on their own account, but will more likely purchase power developed at Grand Coulee and Bonneville and distribute the same. However Salem, with its 150 h.p. hydroelectric plant operating within the city limits, has a rather valuable standby unit to supplement power which may be obtained from any other source. It would, of course, be totally inadequate to supply the City's needs but would supply some vital power demands.

As we note the vital part that water supply plays in defense, especially at Hong Kong and Singapore, we naturally think of our own water supply. We have a long supply line difficult to protect, but we are not solely dependent upon that, particularly if the two wells in North Salem and the Minto Island supply are kept in an operating condition. All these sources are, of course, vulnerable to individual attack but the more sources of supply there are, the less possibility of having them all shut off at one time. The third well in the Southeastern part of the City might be worthy of some consideration in this connection. The comments made in this paragraph have nothing whatever to do with the report on the water rights and are placed here as the observation of an interested citizen who has given some study to the Salem Water system.

Since dictating the above and before the same was written press reports indicate that the Detroit Dam will probably be constructed. However even though this should become a reality, the Marion Lake reservoir application above referred to should be held until it is determined what the government costs will be of securing the necessary water supply from the Detroit Reservoir.

Enclosed are the original copies of your report of complete application of water under Permit No. 1316, by the City of Salem.

It was my intention to talk with you at the time complete application of water was reported under the City's Permit No. 1316 and permit said water that permit, that the City was using at that time only about the 22 cubic feet per second covered by the permit.

Since the City is now using the 40 cubic feet per second specified in Permit No. 1316 in addition to the 22 c.f.s. covered by Permit No. 1316, it seems doubtful if you would wish to require water as completely applied under Permit No. 1316 because complete application would indicate the desirability of making permit and if good to make under Permit No. 1316, a certificate should be issued covering only the quantity of water now used in addition to the 22 c.f.s. covered by Permit No. 1316, and the balance of the 40 c.f.s. covered by the water permit would be eliminated from the water right withheld by the water permit No. 1316.

It with the above information before you, you may find it advisable an application for an extension of time should be submitted in connection with Permit No. 1316, and the time should be extended rather than certificate issued as explained above.
