CLAIM NO. 3

Contestee, H. J. Benham, filed herein Statement and Proof of Claim No. 24, wherein he asserts a right to the use of 0.29 cubic foot per second of water from Mill Creek for the irrigation of 85.0 acres of land within the NE₁/4 SW₁/4, Section 27, Township 8 South, Range 2 West, U. S., with a date of priority of June 7, 1924, the water to be diverted by means of a pump and water wheel.

To said statement and proof of claim, Contestants, Oregon Pulp and Paper Company, The Thomas May Woolen Mills Company, and the City of Salem, Oregon, filed herein Statement of Contest No. 3, wherein it is alleged: (1) That Contestants deny each and every statement set forth in Contestee's claim, except as stated in this Contest. (2) That Mill Creek for the most part of the irrigation season has no natural flow past the premises of Contestee. That whenever there is any natural flow of Mill Creek during the irrigation season it is trivial in amount and Contestants are entitled to the same and that said water right certificate of said Contestee is a meaningless thing leading only to misunderstanding and the same should be cancelled. (3) That the Territorial Legislature of Oregon in the year 1856 granted to Contestants' predecessor in interest, The Willamette Woolen Manufacturing Company, the exclusive right to the water it takes from the North Santiam River for power and manufacturing purposes. That said Territorial Legislature granted to Contestants' said predecessor the privilege of carrying said water through the channel of Mill Creek, and said

Contestants and their predecessors in interest have diverted Santiam River water through the channel of Mill Creek since the year 1857. That Contestee used said Santiam River water for irrigation under pretense of irrigating with the water of Mill Creek to the injury of Contestants. That said facts justify a special finding to the effect that Contestee has no right to take any water from the channel of Mill Creek or said race for irrigation.

It appears that the Contestee first began the use of water from Mill Creek for irrigation purposes in 1922 and on June 7, 1924 made application to the State Engineer for a permit. Said application was approved by the State Engineer on July 16, 1924 and on January 19, 1928 final proof was made and a certificate of water right issued on March 19, 1928, for which a corrected certificate of water right was issued on April 28, 1928. Said certificate of water right is recorded in Volume 7, at page 7567, State Record of Water Right Certificates. It further appears that said corrected certificate does not correctly describe the lands upon which the water has been used.

The survey and maps prepared by the State Engineer showing the lands irrigated with water diverted from Mill Creek show the total area irrigated by the Contestee to be 11.9 acres. It appears from the evidence that the area irrigated by the Contestee prior to 1930 varied between 5.0 and 15.0 acres.

The Contestee, W. J. Danbom, in accordance with said certificate of water right as modified herein and subject to the provisions of Paragraph 115 herein, hereby is allowed a right to the use of 0.183 cubic foot per second of water from the natural flow of Mill Creek for the irrigation of 15.0 acres of land as described in the tabulation herein with a date of priority of June 7, 1924, said water to be diverted by means of pumping and water wheel.

It is further provided that the certificate of water right recorded in Volume 7, Page 7567, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is modified, as to the area of land irrigated, description of lands to which the water is appurtenant, and the quantity of water, to conform to this finding.



Dear Mr. Gerspacher:

The certificate of water right issued to W.J. Denham, recorded at page 7567 State Record of Water Right Certificate, was modified by the findings and order of determination in the matter of the determination of the relative rights to the use of the waters of Mill Creek and its tributaries, which were approved by Decree of the Circuit Court of the County of Marion dated January 30, 1945, to describe the water right as being appurtenant to the lands illustrated within the red bounded area on the map accompanying your letter of July 28, 1977.

The water right as modified allows the use of 0.188 cubic foot of water per second from the natural flow of Mill Creek for the irrigation of 15.0 acres of land with a date of priority of June 7, 1924.

The lands in the Southeast quarter of Section 27, Township 8 South, Range 2 West, were also included in the permit No. E-82 held by the Santiam Water Control District. It would be best to check with the district to determine if they are delivering water to the property in question.

A completed and perfected water right as evidenced by a certificate of water right remains valid so long as it is not lost through non use. If any portion of the water right has not been used for a period of any five successive years, that portion would be forfeited.


