Gentlemen:

Fnclosed is the final proof in connection with the incomplete water right represented by your permit No. G-1466.

The well driller reports that the well did produce more water than it presently does. The quantity of water in the enclosed proof is based on the capacity of your irrigation system to deliver water to the land. Our watermaster lists your equipment as including 90 sprinkler heads which would deliver 1.22 cubic feet per second at 40 pounds pressure.

The data contained in the proof, which is based on an inspection and survey of your project made by a representative of this department, defines the extent to which your water right has been completed within the terms of your permit. The proof should be dated and signed by you and returned to this office.

Upon receipt of the proof, properly executed and accompanied by the statutory recording fee of \$1, a certificate of water right will be issued confirming the right thereunder and, after being recorded in the county records, will be forwarded to you.



Dear Mr. Bartels:

In regard to the artesian well, located on Three Mile Creek, in The Dalles area, owned by Robert E. and Arthur E. Sanders, with permit number G-1466.

In October, 1965, we asked for, and were granted, extra time to recover, a diminished supply of water. Our original permit granted us 2.64 cubic feet per second, but since that time, we have experienced some loss of water.

Last fall, we began operations to recover it, by the installation of a pump, but weather, and weeks of hospitalization of both owners, have delayed our plans.

We have every intention of going ahead, as soon as possible, to try to increase the flow of water, by pump installation, to proportions, more in the neighborhood, of what we, originally, were granted. This has been described in previous letters to the State, and to the local water master.

In the hope that the State Water Office will bear with us, because of our difficulties, for additional time, I remain.

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of August 27, 1965, in regard to permit G-1466.

Your request for additional time to develop your well back to the maximum flow which you enjoyed when it was completed, has been considered and it has been decided that this office will try to determine through checking our records of pressure head on the well and the various discharge measurements made by Larry Jebousek to determine what may be a more nearly correct amount of water to be granted on the confirming water right certificate. Therefore, you do not have to execute the proof of appropriation which has been mailed to you. I would appreciate it if you would return the proof of appropriation to this office.

You are advised that you will not be granted a certificate of water right which would allow you more water than you had put to beneficial use by October 1, 1962, which was the time limit for completion on your permit. Installation of a pump would not be objectionable so long as it does not result in the diversion of more water from the well than you have made proof on.

It is possible that we may have to make some more discharge measurements on the flow of the well at different pressure heads to make a reasonable determination of how much the flow of the well was at the time proof was made.

Gentlemen:

In answer to your letter of August 24th, regarding our failure to contact your office in regarding to copy of proof under permit number G-1466.

Around the first of August, we laid 640 feet of 6" pipe down hill and on the end of that a valve. By filling this line and releasing air at the well, we created a siphon. valve at the end of this new line is at a considerable lower elevation.

On August 11th, Larry Jebousek came out and measured the water flow under this new setup. His check showed an increase from .70 CFS to .83 CFS. He stated that he would write you that day and inform you of this increase.

We are now in the process of installing an electric pump at this lower valve with the hope of getting a further increase of water flow. We are requesting additional time to complete this last mentioned project.

I went out to the Sanders Brothers well this morning. at their request; to make another measurement. Since the last time I was out there they have installed a new pipe line to the creek which carries the water from both well casings. This is half of the project to install a pump on the well to try and develop the water that was lost several years ago.

This morning I measured the discharge from both well casings at 374 gallons per minute or 0.83 cubic feet per second. The measurement was made approximately 600 feet in a southeasterly direction from the well.

I would imagine you will hear from the Sanders Brothers within the next week or so in regards to the draft of their certificate.

Dear Larry:

I received your letter and computation of October 28, concerning Robert and Arthur Sander's permit 0-1166.

Your measurement of 123.36 gallons per minute is considerably less than the 2.62 c.f.s. which was applied for, so I doubt if the Sanders would be willing to accept proof for that amount. Jack informs me that a measurement of artesian pressure and subsequent flow at this time of the year would indicate probably the lowest head and flow of the season. Conversely a measurement during the peak of the spring runoff and recharge would probably indicate the maximum head and discharge. It is our thinking at this time. that neither the maximum artesian nor the minimum artesian flow should be granted under this permit. We would instead like to have discharge measurements of this well ranging from the maximum flow in the spring throughout the summer and down to the minimum flow in the fall. Having this information, we will attempt to select a suitable quantity of water to be granted on the certificate.

As you can see, this will require several measurements starting next spring and continuing throughout the irrigation season and into next fall. If you will get the required measurements, we will issue a certificate on this permit during the winter of 1965.

Enclosed you will find the measurement and computations which I made on the Sanders Brothers well, Permit No. G 1466 on October 28. The well is artesian and I used the open flow discharge method. The quantity of water has been drastically reduced during the past 12 to 16 months.

Approximately a year ago I accompanied Robert DeBow on his measurement of this well and at that time the  $4\frac{1}{2}$  inch pipe would shoot water out approximately 15 to 20 feet.

I spoke with Mr. Arthur Sanders in regards to the quanity allowed for this permit. He knows that the amount of water has fallen off and does intend to do something about it, either install a pump in the well or do some drilling. In any case he would not be satisfied with the 123 gpm presently flowing from the well.



Dear Mr. Van Valkenburgh:

Reference is made to your protest on behalf of Milton F. Martin in regard to the well interference in Martin's well caused by the operation of the Sanders's well.

The shallow depth of water in a well or the artesian head encountered in a flowing well is a privilege that can be enjoyed by the well owner while available, but it is not a privilege that is protected by a ground-water right. The Legislative policy set forth in ORS 537.525 states that "Beneficial use without waste, within the capacity of the available sources, be the basis, measure and extent of the right to appropriate ground water". As it is physically impossible to develop a ground-water reservoir to capacity without some lowering of water tables, the Ground Water Act provides that the determination of the lowest permissable water level will be a matter of determination in an adjudication (ORS 537.685). After such a determination, the State Engineer shall regulate the conrol works on wells so as to maintain water levels in order to secure the equal and fair distribution of the available water supply. The regulation of wells in order to maintain water levels or artesian pressure without such a determination would indicate that the State Engineer has arbitrarily made the determination of the "lowest permissable water level" without statutory authority.

If a problem of well interference appears substantial, the State Engineer can initiate a proceeding for the determination of a critical ground-water area. If after an investigation and hearing, he finds that two or more wells interfere substantially with one another, he may declare the area "critical" and enter an order containing corrective control provisions.


Since there has been no apparent annual decline of the artesian pressure in the Martin well, it appears that the ground-water reservoir has the capacity to supply sufficient water to meet all the existing water rights without an over-appropriation of the supply. It may be necessary, however, that Mr. Martin install additional pumping equipment in order to obtain the quantity

Dear Mr. Wheeler:

Please be advised that we are writing at the request of Milton F. Martin, of The Dalles, Oregon, who has an artesian well.

We wish to lodge a protest in his behalf with your Department. A neighboring artesian well, on property owned by Arthur and Robert Sanders, has as its source of water two stratas. When water is being released that comes from the upper strata of the Sanders well, the pressure and the flow of the water from the Martin well is reduced considerably.

Inasmuch as the Martin well is prior in time, we assert, in Mr. Martin's behalf, that he is entitled to the full flow and pressure of his well and that the Sanders should be instructed that the reduction in pressure and flow caused the Martin well by the use of the Sanders well should be terminated.

Would you advise this office if any further filing should be made with your office in regards to formalizing this complaint.



Come now the protesta

Come now the protestants, Milton F. Martin and June Martin, husband and wife, and respectfully present their protest against Application No. G-1600 and Permit No. G-1466, filed by and issued to Robert E. Sanders and Arthur E. Sanders, Route 1, Box 123, The Dalles, Oregon, authorizing them to drill a well and appropriate therefrom 2.7 cubic feet of water per second, said well to be 8 inches in diameter and of an estimated depth of 200 feet near Three Mile Creek, a tributary of the Columbia River, located 480 feet South and 150 feet East from the One Quarter Section corner of Sections 32 and 33, Township 1

North, Range 13 East of the Willamette Meridian in Wasco County, Oregon, to be known as the "Sanders Well". The application for the permit was filed in the Office of the State Engineer October 12, amended November 3, 1959, and the permit issued November 20, 1959, with a priority date of October 12, 1959.

This protest is filed for the following reasons:

- 1. These protestants received no notice or opportunity to be heard or protest the application and subsequent issuance of the permit above described, and were thus effectively deprived of their right to protest the application for the permit while the same was pending.
- 2. That these protestants are the owners and holders of Application No. G-8 and Permit No. G-482 with a priority of April 16, 1947, covering a well located 2650 feet South 44° 33' West from the corner of Sections 28, 29, 32 and 33 in Township 1 North, Range 13 East of the Willamette Meridian in Wasco County, Oregon. The protestants permit authorizes the appropriation of water from an artesian source of not to exceed 4.44 cubic feet per second.

That the protestants have constructed a well at said location, known as Martin Well No. 1, which has a diameter of 8 inches and an estimated depth 1.

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of 336 feet. That these protestants are also the owners and holders of Application No. G-66 and Permit No. G-485 covering a well located 1736 feet South and 2097 feet West from the Northeast corner of Section 32, Township 1 North, Range 13 East of the Willamette Meridian in Wasco County, Oregon, with a priority date of April 4, 1955. This permit authorizes the protestants to appropriate not to exceed 3.0 cubic feet per second from an artesian source. The protestants have constructed a well at said location with a diameter of 10 inches for a depth of 207 feet and a diameter of 6 inches for 220 feet with an estimated depth of 427 feet. That in connection with both wells protestants have installed 15,000 feet of buried main-line pipe and approximately 5500 feet of portable lateral line complete with sprinklers and valves, a 75-horsepower centrifugal booster pump and a 20-horsepower centrifugal booster pump, and have prepared land for irrigation, all at a cost of approximately \$65,000.00, and are now appropriating water from said wells through the above described irrigation system for said purposes, and are irrigating a total of 355 acres of land.

- 3. That the wells belonging to these protestants are located approximately one-quarter mile from the location of the proposed well of Robert E. and Arthur E. Sanders and that if said individuals are permitted to construct the well described in their application and permit, it will drain the water from the area of these protestants' wells, destroy their value and cause these protestants a financial loss of more than \$65,000.00 and deprive them of future potential profits and benefits to which they are justly entitled.
- 4. That while the well proposed to be constructed by Robert E. and Arthur E. Sanders is located in the Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 33, Township 1 North, Range 13 East of the Willamette Meridian, said individuals propose to irrigate only 30 acres in said Section 33, and propose to divert the water to be obtained from their well at said location into Three Mile Creek and to irrigate approximately 180 acres of land located in Sections 22 and 27, Township 1 North, Range 13 East of the Willamette Meridian, a distance of approximately three miles from the location of the well. That if Robert E. and Arthur E. Sanders are permitted to divert underground water from the basin area in which the wells of these protestants, and that proposed to be 2.

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constructed by the Sanders, are located and use the same on land which is in no way connected with the underground water reservoir from which the water is to be withdrawn, these protestants will suffer irreparable damage. That this protest is filed for the purpose of asking that the State Engineer halt any proposed construction under Permit No. G-1466 and afford these protestants and others similarly situated an opportunity for a full and complete hearing on the questions and issues set forth in this protest.

5. A copy of this protest has been served upon Robert E. Sanders and Arthur E. Sanders by mail addressed to them at Route 1, Box 123, The Dalles, Oregon.

WHEREFORE, these protestants pray that any well-drilling work proposed under the Sanders' permit be halted or postponed until such time as the State Engineer shall set a time for a hearing on the matters and issues herein raised, and give these protestants and others similarly situated an opportunity to be heard.



PROTEST OF S. A. SKIRVING and CECYL SKIRVING, HUSBAND AND WIFE; and JOHN H. SKIRVING and BETTY JANE SKIRVING, HUSBAND AND WIFE.

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Come now the protestants, S. A. Skirving and Cecyl Skirving, husband and wife, and John H. Skirving and Betty Jane Skirving, husband and wife, and respectfully present their protest against Application No. G-1600 and Permit No. G-1466, filed by and issued to Robert E. Sanders and Arthur E. Sanders, Route 1, Box 123, The Dalles, Oregon, authorizing them to drill a well and appropriate therefrom 2.7 cubic feet of water per second, said well to be 8 inches in diameter and of an estimated depth of 200 feet near Three Mile Creek, a tributary of the Columbia River, located 480 feet South and 150 feet East from the One Quarter Section corner of Sections 32 and 33, Township 1 North, Range 13 East of the Willamette Meridian in Wasco County, Oregon, to be known as the "Sanders Well". The application for the permit was filed in the Office of the State Engineer October 12, amended November 3, 1959, and the permit issued November 20, 1959, with a priority date of October 12, 1959.

- 1. These protestants received no notice or opportunity to be heard or protest the application and subsequent issuance of the permit above described, and were thus effectively deprived of their right to protest the application for the permit while the same was pending.
- 2. That these protestants are the owners and holders of Application No. G-161 and Permit No. G-233 and Application No. G-712 and Permit No. G-620, covering a well located 2862 feet South and 430 feet East from the Northwest corner of Section 32, Township 1 North, Range 13 East of the Willamette Meridian in Wasco County, and being located less than one mile from the well proposed to be constructed by Robert E. Sanders and Arthur E. Sanders under Permit No. G-1466. The protestants' permit authorizes the 1.

PHIPPS AND PHIPPS ATTORNEYS AT LAW THE DALLES, OREGON appropriation of water from an artesian source, and the withdrawal of 3.46 cubic feet per second with a priority date on the last numbered permit of July 31, 1957. That the protestants have constructed a well at said location of a diameter of 8 inches with a depth of 805 feet, and have installed 2,000 feet of buried 6-inch pipe and 4,000 feet of buried 4-inch pipe and additional footage of portable lateral line complete with sprinklers and valves, and a 15-horsepower booster pump, and prepared land for irrigation, all at a cost of more than \$25,000.00, and are now appropriating water from said well through said irrigation system for said purposes, and are irrigating a total of 277 acres of land.

- 3. That the well belonging to these protestants is located less than one mile from the location of the proposed well of Robert E. and Arthur E. Sanders and that if said individuals are permitted to construct the well described in their application and permit, it will drain the water from the area of these protestants' well, destroy its value and cause these protestants a financial loss of more than \$25,000.00 and deprive them of future potential profits and benefits to which they are justly entitled.
- 4. That while the well proposed to be constructed by Robert E. and Arthur E. Sanders is located in the Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 33, Township 1 North, Range 13 East of the Willamette Meridian, said individuals propose to irrigate only 30 acres in said Section 33, and propose to divert the water to be obtained from their well at said location into Three Mile Creek and to irrigate approximately 180 acres of land located in Sections 22 and 27, Township 1 North, Range 13 East of the Willamette Meridian, a distance of approximately three miles from the location of the well. That if Robert E. and Arthur E. Sanders are permitted to divert underground water from the basin area in which the well of these protestants, and that proposed to be constructed by the Sanders, is located and use the same on land which is in no way connected with the underground water reservoir from which the water is to be withdrawn, these protestants will suffer irreparable damage. That this protest is filed for the purpose of asking that the State Engineer halt any proposed construction under Permit No. G-1466 and afford these protestants and others 2 -

similarly situated an opportunity for a full and complete hearing on the questions and issues set forth in this protest.

5. A copy of this protest has been served upon Robert E. Sanders and Arthur E. Sanders by mail addressed to them at Route 1, Box 123, The Dalles, Oregon.

WHEREFORE, these protestants pray that any well-drilling work proposed under the Sanders' permit be halted or postponed until such time as the State Engineer shall set a time for a hearing on the matters and issues herein raised, and give these protestants and others similarly situated an opportunity to be heard.


