Provide a description of the proposed means of diversion, construction, and operation of the diversion works and conveyance of water. <u>There is an irrigation system in place</u>. The RV park area uses a 1-1/2 inch PVC pipe with faucets, hoses and circular spray type sprinkler heads. The larger park area has an underground line with risers that take impact sprinkler heads. The larger park area is currently irrigated with surface water using a pump from Slyfe Creek.

B. Application Method

What equipment and method of application will be used? (e.g., drip, wheel line, high-pressure sprinkler) <u>Current system will be used for the immediate future.</u> Long range plans include replacing current system with a permanent underground pop-up impact heads and timers to use water more efficiently and possibly less water.

C. Conservation

Please describe why the amount of water requested is needed and measures you propose to: prevent waste; measure the amount of water diverted; prevent damage to aquatic life and riparian habitat; prevent the discharge of contaminated water to a surface stream; prevent adverse impact to public uses of affected surface waters.

<u>The water is necessary for the irrigation of Depot Park RV Park and lawn and grass areas. We have</u> asked for more water than the typical maximum amount due to soil type and grass verities. Based on previous experience watering this park, we are aware that it takes a lot of water to keep the park area green. We have a conservation plan in place. Also, water usage will be monitored and controlled by City Public Works employees until such a date when the permanent irrigation system will be installed. The permanent system may integrate a timer into the system. The irrigation system and park are monitored by City Public Works employees in order to assure that no damage occurs to Aquatic life, riparian habitat, surface streams or surface waters.

Water right is being requested as supplemental water for Depot Park. There are lawn areas in the RV Park as well as the larger park area that require additional water in order to keep the public area green further into the summer.

We currently pump water out of Slyfe Creek on a primary right (C-75494) to irrigate the larger grass area. Slyfe Creek water is John Day River water diverted per C-75494. Once a permit is granted we will plumb the ground water from the well into the underground system currently in place in the large park. We also anticipate integrating a timer into the works to help with efficiently of the system.

Our experience is that due primarily to soil type the park takes a larger amount of water than the maximum allowed. I have based the annual cfs on 3 rainbird impact sprinklers running with 3/16 nozzles.
