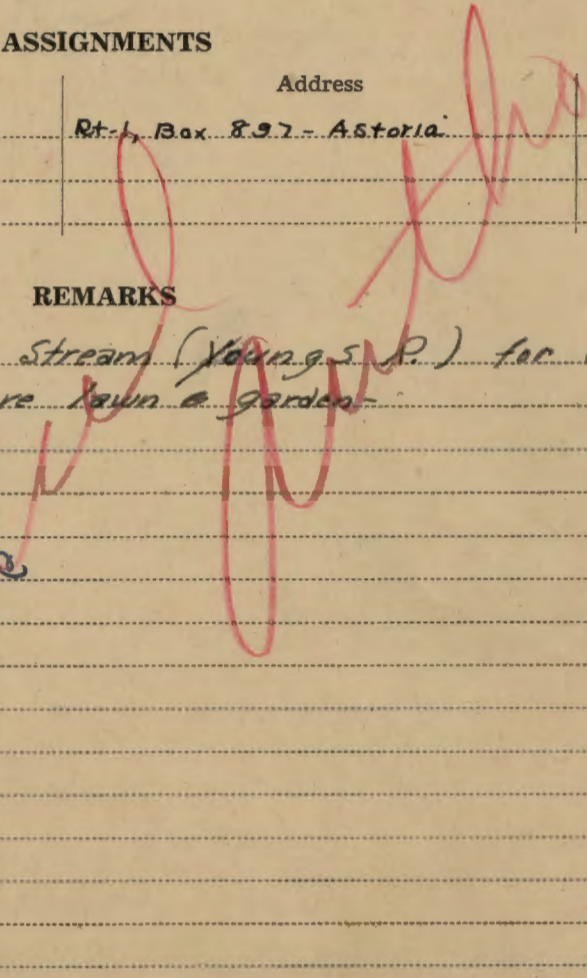





Pursuant to your request of May 8, I am enclosing herewith two Forms C for use in reporting complete application of water to the proposed use under Permit No. 14455 in the name of T. A. Leahy.

As I interpret your letter, water is being completely applied to the proposed use under the permit in question to the full extent of the proposed use and, if this is the case, Form C should be executed and mailed to this office.

When the field engineer was in the vicinity of the site of the appropriation contemplated under Permit No. 14455 on July 27 of last year; for the purpose of making the usual survey preparatory to final proof, he was unable to locate the property in question, and has a note on the proof to the effect that "this permittee is unknown in locality."

It will be appreciated if you can give us directions by some local landmarks so that the field engineer can find the property in question on his next trip.

As provided by Oregon Law, a permittee is entitled to make proof under a State Engineer's permit covering water as described in the permit, and as it is being actually used, to the extent of the actual use.

Mr. John Leahy, who was the administrator of the estate of his father, T. A. Leahy, deceased, has handed me your two letters of February 19th and March 23rd, 1951.

Mr. Leahy and myself have both made a complete search of all papers left by his father to which either of us had any access, and have been unable to find the application or permit by which his father appropriated 0.05 second-feet of water from an unnamed stream for domestic use. Complete application of water was to have been made on or before October 1st, 1945.

I have been the attorney for the late Mr. Leahy for a great many years, and seem to remember the application he made for the water, and he advised me, and his son, who was the administrator of his estate which has been probated and settled, also advises me that his father made complete application of the water facilities from this small stream and used the same by a pipe from the point of diversion to his home which, no doubt, was shown on the map attached to his application, and also to the home of a neighbor to whom he sold a piece of his property. As I understand it, there was a very small dam at the point of diversion, and I have a feeling that this dam was, to say the least, made inoperative by logging operations; and the water has to be pumped to the house from the end of the diversion pipe by an electric pump. The stream is very small and in the summer time runs practically dry.

The wife of Mr. T. A. Leahy is incompetent, and John Leahy, her son, is her guardian and has charge of the home and premises.



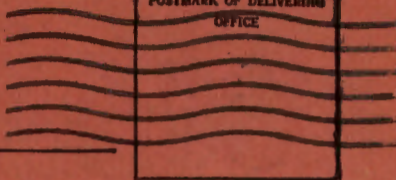

Dear Mr. Leahy:

According to the terms of your Application No. 18815, Permit No. 14455, which is for the appropriation of 0.05 second-foot of water from an unnamed stream for domestic use, complete application of water was to have been made on or before October 1, 1945. It appears from our records that you have failed to submit the notice of complete application, although a post-card, calling this matter to your attention, was mailed to you on February 19, 1951.

Section 116-435, O. C. L. A., provides: "whenever the time within which any appropriation under a permit should have been perfected shall have expired and the owner of such permit shall fail or refuse within the period of three months thereafter to submit to the State Engineer proof of the completion of such appropriation as required by Section 116-426, O. C. L. A., the State Engineer may, after 60 days' notice by registered mail, order the cancellation of such permit, ***."

If you have complied with the terms of this permit, you should promptly submit the notice of complete application of water after which we will take up with you the matter of final proof. If, however, you have abandoned your plan of development, we would appreciate your authority to cancel the permit, so that the permit may be cancelled without the necessity for following the legal procedure. In case you have not completed your appropriation, although you still wish to do so, you may submit an application for an extension of time. Such an extension may be granted if it appears that proper diligence has been shown.

Complete application of water under an irrigation permit means the irrigation of ALL of the land described in the permit, which it is intended to irrigate.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 116-435, Oregon Compiled Laws Annotated, a part of which is quoted above, you are hereby notified that unless we hear from you within 60 days from the date of this letter, your permit will be cancelled without further notice.

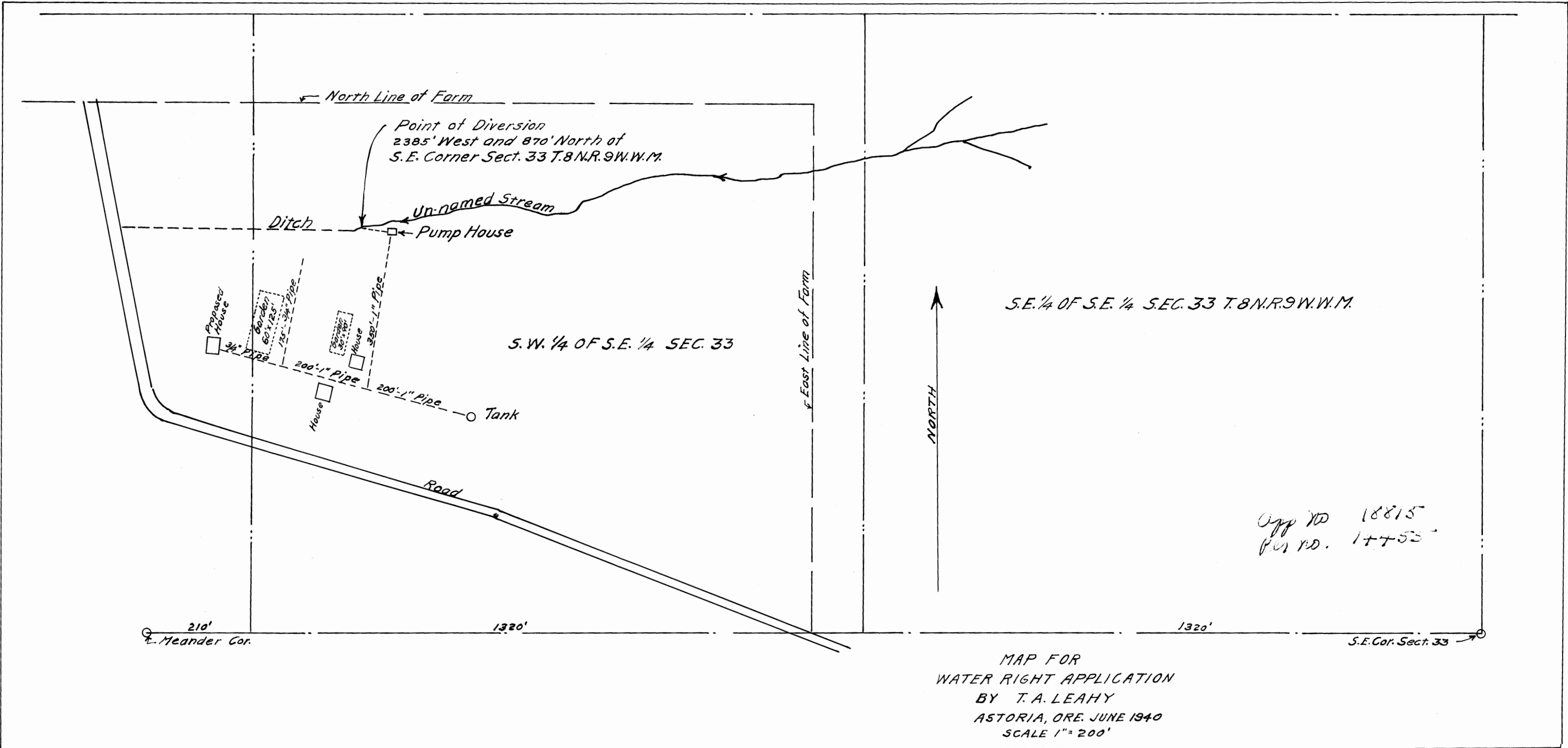
