8. DESCRIPTION

Provide a description of the design and operation of the proposed diversion, including a description of how live flow will be passed outside the authorized storage season. Use this space for narrative. You may also provide narrative and sketches on separate pages.

Currently, the ditch bisects the Frisch property a the low point of the parcel and floods during spring runoff. The pond will be created from that existing ditch which receives water from wastewater and/or runoff that flows into Catherine Creek (Grand Ronde Old Channel). During the spring, Catherine Creek is known to flood back upstream into the ditch. The landowner plans to install slide gates at the bottom and top of the pond which, in essence, will allow live flow to pass through the current ditch. This will effectively create a bubble in the current water system that will help mitigated spring flood events.

To build the pond, the landowner plans to widen the existing ditch by excavating some of the low-lying vegetation and soil in order to create a gradually sloped berm on the northern length of the pond. The southern end has an already established berm and is at final proposed elevation.

The inflow and outflow will be established as culverts with slide gates installed to control flow into or out of the pond area. The maximum height of these culverts will control the pond water level during allowed storage times as well as let the water flow naturally during the remainder of the year.

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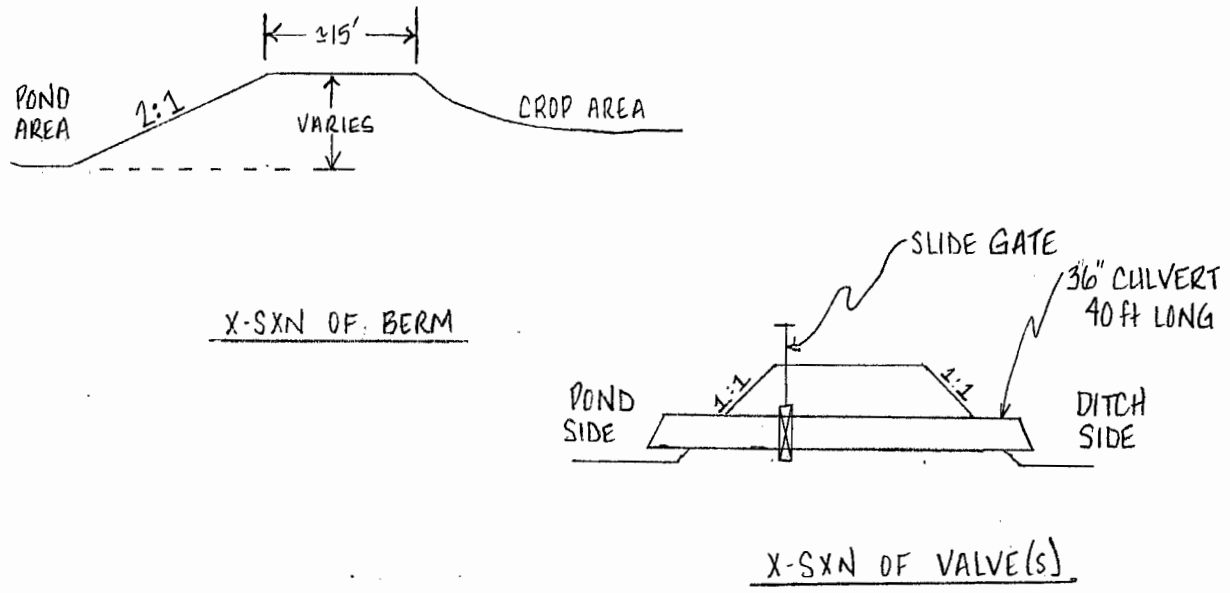

The diversion will not involve a dam but instead will utilize culverts with slide gates to control flow into and out of the pond. The north and south sides of the dam will consist of compacted berms made from soil excavated from the interior of the pond bottom.

It is unlikely that fish exist in this ditch since it currently is more similar to a marsh than an area where water flows.
