#### **PROPOSED FINAL ORDER**

In the Matter of the Application for an Extension of Time for Permit R-12303, Water Right Application R-80595, in the name of Clean Water Services; formally doing business as Unified Sewage Agency.

In summary, the Department proposes to:

 Grant an extension of time to apply water to full beneficial use from October 1, 2001 to October 30, 2016.<sup>1</sup>

This Extension of Time request is being processed in accordance with Oregon Revised Statute 537.230 and 539.010(5), and Oregon Administrative Rule Chapter 690, Division 315

### **AUTHORITY**

Generally, see ORS 537.230 and OAR Chapter 690 Division 315.

ORS 537.230(3) provides in pertinent part that the Oregon Water Resources Department (Department) may, for good cause shown, order an extension of time within which irrigation or other works shall be completed or the right perfected. In determining the extension, the Department shall give due weight to the considerations described under ORS 539.010(5) and to whether other governmental requirements relating to the project have significantly delayed completion of construction or perfection of the right.

ORS 539.010(5) provides in pertinent part that the Water Resources Director, for good cause shown, may extend the time within which the full amount of the water appropriated shall be applied to a beneficial use. This statute instructs the Director to consider: the cost of the appropriation and application of the water to a beneficial purpose; the good faith of the appropriator; the market for water or power to be supplied; the present demands therefore; and the income or use that may be required to provide fair and reasonable returns upon the investment.

**OAR 690-315-0040** provides in pertinent part that the Water Resources Department shall make findings to determine if an extension of time may be approved to complete construction and/or apply water to full beneficial use.

#### **FINDINGS OF FACT**

#### **Background**

- 1. Permit R-12303 was granted by the Department on October 21, 1997. The permit authorizes the storage of up to 96.0 AF of water in three unnamed reservoirs filled from an unnamed stream, a tributary of Tualatin River, for wetland enhancement. The permit specified actual construction was to begin by October 21, 1998 and complete application of water was to be made on or before October 1, 2001.
- 2. The permit holder submitted an "Application for Extension of Time" to the Department on September 23, 2014, requesting the time to apply water to full beneficial use under the terms of Permit R-12303 to be extended from October 1, 2001 to October 30, 2016. This is the first permit extension requested for Permit R-12303.
- 3. Notification of the Application for Extension of Time for Permit R-12303 was published in the Department's Public Notice dated October 7, 2014. No public comments were

received regarding the extension application.

#### Review Criteria [OAR 690-315-0040]

The time limits to complete construction and/or apply water to full beneficial use may be extended if the Department finds that the permit holder has met the requirements set forth under OAR 690-315-0040. This determination shall consider the applicable requirements of  $ORS 537.230^2$ ,  $537.248^3$  and/or  $539.010(5)^4$ .

#### Complete Extension of Time Application [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(a)]

4. On September 23, 2014, the Department received a completed Application for Extension of Time and the fee specified in ORS 536.050 from the permit holder.

#### Start of Construction [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(b) and 690-315-0040(5)]

 Actual construction of the water system began prior to the October 21, 1998 deadline specified in the permit. Construction of the three wetland reservoirs as part of mitigation for Barney Reservoir expansion began July 1, 1996.

#### Duration of Extension [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(c)]

Under OAR 690-315-0040(1)(c), in order to approve an extension of time for water use permits the Department must find that the time requested is reasonable and the applicant can complete the project within the time requested.

- 6. As of September 23, 2014, the remaining work to be completed consists of obtaining approval from Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife for altering outlet structures and reservoir berms to allow fish passage during the spring and applying water to full beneficial use.
- 7. Given the amount of development left to occur, the Department has determined that the permit holder's request to have until October 30, 2016, to accomplish the application of water to beneficial use under the terms and conditions of Permit R-12303 is both reasonable and necessary.

#### Good Cause [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(d)]

The Department's determination of good cause shall consider the requirements set forth under OAR 690-315-0040(2).

#### Reasonable Diligence of the Appropriator [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(a)]

The Department's determination of reasonable diligence shall consider the requirements set forth under OAR 690-315-0040(3)(a-d). In accordance with OAR 690-315-0040(3), the Department shall consider, but is not limited to, the following factors when determining whether the applicant has demonstrated reasonable diligence in previous performance under the permit:

#### Amount of Construction [OAR 690-315-0040(3)(a)]

- 8. Work was accomplished within the time allowed in the permit or previous extension as follows:
  - a. Construction of the water system began prior to the October 21, 1998 deadline specified in the permit. Construction of the three reservoirs with outlet work structures and low level channels was completed before October 21, 1997.
  - No work was completed during the original development time frame under Permit R-12303, as the project was completed before October 21, 1997
  - c. Since October 1, 2001, the permit holder has accomplished the following construction required under R-12303:
    - 1. Began water use reporting in 2005;
    - 2. Staff gages installed at each outlet pipe; and
    - 3. Modified outlets for diversion screening and fish passage.

#### Beneficial Use of Water [OAR 690-315-0040(3)(b)]

- 9. The following beneficial use was made of the water during the permit or previous extension time limits:
  - a. Since the issuance of Permit R-12303 on October 21, 1997, the permit holder has used 77.9 AF of water diverted from an unnamed stream, a tributary of Tualatin River for wetland enhancement.
  - b. Delay of full beneficial use of water under Permit R-12303 was due, in part; to the permit holder failing to obtain written documentation from the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife approving the installation of fish screens and fish passages, as required by the permit.

#### Compliance with Conditions [OAR 690-315-0040(3)(c)]

- 10. The water right permit holder's conformance with the permit or previous extension conditions.
  - a. The Department has considered the permit holder's compliance with conditions, and has identified the following concerns: (1) the permit holder has not yet obtained written documentation from the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife approving the installation of fish screens.
  - b. In order to legally perfect the storage of water under this permit, the permit holder must demonstrate that all conditions of the permit have been satisfied.

# Financial Investments to appropriate and Apply Water to a Beneficial Purpose [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(b),(3)(d),(4)(d)]

11. As of September 23, 2014, the permit holder has invested approximately \$42,000, which is about 95 percent of the total projected cost for complete development of this project.

The permit holder anticipates an additional \$2,000 investment is needed for the completion of this project.

#### Good Faith of the Appropriator [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(c)]

12. The Department has found good faith of the appropriator under Permit R-12303.

#### The Market and Present Demands for Water [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(d-e)]

The Department's determinations of market and present demand for water or power to be supplied shall consider the requirements set forth under OAR 690-315-0040(4)(a-f). In accordance with OAR 690-315-0040(4), the Department shall consider, but is not limited to, the following factors when determining the market and the present demand for water or power to be supplied:

- 13. The amount of water available to satisfy other affected water rights and scenic waterway flows; special water use designations established since permit issuance, including but not limited to state scenic waterways, federal wild and scenic rivers, serious water management problem areas or water quality limited sources established under 33 U.S.C. 1313(d); or the habitat needs of sensitive, threatened or endangered species, in consultation with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife [OAR 690-315-0040(4)(a-c)].
  - The amount of water available to satisfy other affected water rights and scenic a. waterway flows was determined at the time of issuance of Permit R-12303; furthermore, water availability for other affected water rights and scenic waterway flows after the permit was issued is determined when an application for a new water right is submitted. The points of diversion are located on an unnamed stream, a tributary of Tualatin River, and are not located within a Withdrawn Area. The unnamed stream, a tributary of Tualatin River is not located within or above a state or federal scenic waterway, however, it is located within an area ranked "moderate" for stream flow restoration needs as determined by the Department in consultation with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, and is located within a Sensitive, Threatened or Endangered Fish Species Area as identified by the Department in consultation with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife. The points of diversion are not in a location listed by the Department of Environmental Quality as a water quality limited stream.
- 14. Other economic interests dependent on completion of the project [OAR 690-315-0040(4)(e)].
  - None have been identified.
- 15. Other factors relevant to the determination of the market and present demand for water and power [OAR 690-315-0040(4)(f)].
  - a. None have been identified.

#### Fair Return Upon Investment [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(f)]

16. Use and income from the permitted water development will likely result in reasonable returns upon the investment made to date.

#### Other Governmental Requirements [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(q)]

17. Delay in the development of this project was not caused by any other governmental requirements.

#### Unforeseen Events [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(h)]

18. None have been identified.

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- The applicant is entitled to apply for an extension of time to complete construction and/or completely apply water to the full beneficial use pursuant to ORS 537.230(3).
- 2. The applicant has submitted a complete extension application form and the fee specified in ORS 536.050, as required by OAR 690-315-0040(1)(a).
- 3. The applicant complied with begin actual construction timeline requirements pursuant to ORS 537.230 as required by OAR 690-315-0040(1)(b) and OAR 690-315-0040(5).
- 4. Full application of water to beneficial use can be accomplished by October 30, 2016<sup>5</sup>, as required by OAR 690-315-0040(1)(c).
- 5. The Department has considered the reasonable diligence and good faith of the appropriator, the cost to appropriate and apply water to a beneficial purpose, the market and present demands for water to be supplied, the financial investment made and fair and reasonable return upon the investment, the requirements of other governmental agencies, and unforeseen events over which the permit holder had no control, whether denial of the extension will result in undue hardship to the applicant and whether there are no other reasonable alternatives for meeting water use needs, any other factors relevant to a determination of good cause, and has determined that the applicant has shown that good cause exists for an extension of time to apply water to full beneficial use pursuant to OAR 690-315-0040(1)(d).

#### **PROPOSED ORDER**

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Department proposes to issue an order to:

Extend the time to apply water to beneficial use under Permit R-12303 from October 1, 2001 to October 30, 2016.

#### **Proposed Final Order Hearing Rights**

- Under the provisions of OAR 690-315-0100(1) and 690-315-0060, the applicant or any
  other person adversely affected or aggrieved by the proposed final order may submit a
  written protest to the proposed final order. The written protest must be received by
  the Water Resources Department no later than <u>January 2, 2015</u>, being 45 days from the
  date of publication of the proposed final order in the Department's weekly notice.
- 2. A written protest shall include:
  - a. The name, address and telephone number of the petitioner;
  - A description of the petitioner's interest in the proposed final order and if the protestant claims to represent the public interest, a precise statement of the public interest represented;
  - c. A detailed description of how the action proposed in the proposed final order would adversely affect or aggrieve the petitioner's interest;
  - d. A detailed description of how the proposed final order is in error or deficient and how to correct the alleged error or deficiency;
  - e. Any citation of legal authority supporting the petitioner, if known;
  - f. Proof of service of the protest upon the water right permit holder, if petitioner is other than the water right permit holder; and
  - g. The applicant or non-applicant protest fee required under ORS 536.050.
- 3. Within 60 days after the close of the period for requesting a contested case hearing, the Director shall:

- a. Issue a final order on the extension request; or
- b. Schedule a contested case hearing if a protest has been submitted, and:
  - 1) Upon review of the issues, the Director finds there are significant disputes related to the proposed agency action; or
  - 2) The applicant submits a written request for a contested case hearing within 30 days after the close of the period for submitting protests.
