Dear Property Owner,

The Department of Water Resources was recently informed that you have purchased a piece of property with an associated water right. The right involved is Ground Water Certificate 80671. You should be aware of the terms and conditions of this water right, and I have enclosed a copy for your review.

1) Water Use Reporting

You are required to meter and keep a monthly record of water use for each of your points of diversions. You can keep track on the form provided, and then submit your data online by December 31st each year. See the enclosed water use reporting instructions for further details.

In order to update our records, an Ownership Update (enclosed) must be filled out and returned to the Department. Please be sure to attach a copy of your property deed or legal description of the property.

Certificate of Water Right Ownership Update

NOTICE TO SELLERS & BUYERS:

By law, all water belongs to the public (ORS 537.110). In almost every instance, a permit or water right certificate from the Water Resources Department is needed before using, diverting or storing water (ORS 537.130). However, most domestic wells do not require water rights. A certificate of water right stays with the land. In order to keep track of water right ownership, the Department requests that this form be submitted to the Department. If for multiple rights, a separate form for each right will be required.

Water that has been used for a long time in one place or that involves a water structure (like a dam) that already exists is no guarantee that there is a water right which would allow the water use to continue.

confirms the right to use the waters of A WELL in the PUDDING RIVER BASIN for IRRIGATION OF 124.37 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-11751. The date of priority is APRIL 2, 1993. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.44 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The well is located as follows:

SW 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 30, TOWNSHIP 3 SOUTH, RANGE 1 EAST, W.M.; 3638 FEET NORTH AND 3810 FEET EAST FROM THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 30.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The period of allowed use is March 1 through October 31.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

This permit is issued approving Application G-13356. The date of priority is APRIL 2, 1993. The use is limited to-not more than 1.55 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The well is located as follows:

SE 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 30, T 3 S, R 1 E, W.M.; 215 FEET SOUTH AND 1325 FEET WEST FROM THE CENTER NORTH 1/16 CORNER OF SECTION 30.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The period of allowed use is March 1 through October 31.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The well shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order, shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the permit.

B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The permittee shall obtain a static water-level measurement for each well during March of each year and report the measurement to the Department within thirty days. The measurement shall be made by a certified water-rights examiner, registered professional geologist, or professional engineer. Water levels shall be reported as depth-to-water below ground level and shall be accompanied by supporting calculations. If a well listed on this permit displays a total static water-level decline of 25 or more feet over any period of years, as compared to the reference level, then the permittee shall discontinue use of, or reduce the rate or volume of withdrawal from, the well(s). Such action shall be taken until the water level recovers to above the 25-foot decline level or until the Department determines, based on the permittee's or the Department's data and analysis, that no action is necessary because the aquifer in question can sustain the observed declines without adversely impacting the resource or senior water rights. The reference level for water-level declines shall be the second annual measurement taken after water use begins under the terms of this permit. permittee shall in no instance allow excessive decline to occur within the aquifer as a result of use under this permit.

This permit does not allow groundwater production from shallower than 150 feet below the land surface.

Prior to receiving a certificate of water right, the permit holder shall submit the results of a pump test meeting the department's standards, to the Water Resources Department. The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years thereafter.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 10, 1995 and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1996. Complete application of the water shall be made on or before October 1, 1997.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

The Director of the Water Resources Department has found that the proposed use of water described by this permit, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

EXHIBIT A LEGAL DESCRIPTION

PARCEL I (Tax Lot 300; Approximately 20.25 acres):

Part of the South one-half of the North one-half of the Northeast one-quarter of Section 30, Township 3 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Meridian, in the County of Clackamas and State of Oregon, described as:

Beginning at the Northeast corner of said South one-half of the North one-half of the Northeast one-quarter of Section 30; thence, South 10.00 chains; thence, West 33.80 chains; thence, North 7° 55′ East 6.46 chains; thence South 80° 35′ East 1.51 chains; thence South 78° 20′ East 2.32 chains; thence, North 82° 05′ East 1.37 chains; thence South 41° 35′ East 4.97 chains; thence, North 87° 05′ East 6.10 chains; thence, North 13° 05′ East 4.73 chains to a stake in the South line of a tract owned formerly by J. Thomsen, Jr., recorded September 16, 1992, Recorder's Fee No. 92 57845; thence South tracing the West boundary of said tract, 1,507.90 feet to a point; thence West 1,244.35 feet to an iron pipe; thence North parallel to the West boundary of said Section 30, 803.20 feet to an iron pipe; thence West 165 feet to the place of beginning.
