



#### Authority

ORS 540.505 to 540.580 establishes the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of diversion, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. OAR Chapter 690, Division 380 implements the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

ORS 540.621 establishes the process for the owner of land to which a water right is appurtenant to certify under oath that the water right, or a portion thereof, has been abandoned and to voluntarily request that it be cancelled.

### **Findings of Fact**

### Background

- 1. On February 26, 2009, KAREN PLEASANT, AGENT FOR DEER CREEK CENTER FOR FIELD RESEARCH AND EDUCATION, filed an application to change the place of use under Certificate 19720. The Department assigned the application number T-10794.
- 2. On June 25, 2009, the applicant added Certificates 6067 and 13831 to transfer T-10794 and requested a change in point of diversion for all rights included in the transfer.
- 3. On August 31, 2009 the applicant's CWRE submitted revised maps, for certificates 19720 and 6067 and page 4 Supplemental Form A for certificate 19720 clarifying there will be no remaining rights as a result of Transfer T-10794 for the listed certificates.

This final order is subject to judicial review by the Court of Appeals under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482(1). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

- 4. On October 5, 2009, the applicant's CWRE e-mailed modifications to Transfer Application T-10794, removing 0.5 acre under Certificate 19720 in the NE/SE, Section 10, T38S, R8W, W.M., as it is not owned by the applicant, and submitted a revised map showing that 0.5 acre as remaining unaffected by the transfer. An affidavit requesting cancellation of 3.0 acres located in the NE/SE, Section 9, T38S, R8W, WM. was also submitted.
- 5. On December 4, 2009, Certificate 6067 was superseded by Certificate 85951, to confirm a change in point of diversion authorized by order of the State Engineer approving Transfer Application B-113 and recorded in Special Order Volume 10, pages 238-240.
- 6. On January 8, 2010, the applicant submitted revisions to page 2 of the transfer application and a revised Supplemental Form A to reflect superseding Certificate 85951 rather than canceled Certificate 6067. The applicant also submitted a revised transfer map and revised partial cancellation affidavit for Certificate 85951.

- 16. Notice of the application for transfer was published on March 10, 2009, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
- 17. On June 2, 2009, the Department contacted the applicant by written correspondence to notify the applicant and applicant's agent that the transfer application and map did not state coordinates for authorized diversion consistently with the map of record for the right (in this case, the permit map). The Department requested that the deficiencies be resolved by July 3, 2009, and if the applicant proposed a change in point of diversion as well as a change in place of use, that the application be amended to add a change in point of diversion and additional fees be submitted.
- 18. On June 25, 2009, the applicant's agent responded and provided the requested information, fees and revised maps.
- 19. The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) has determined that a fish screening and/or by-pass device is necessary at the new point of diversion to prevent fish from entering the diversion and/or safely transport fish back to the body of water from which the fish were diverted and that the diversion is not currently equipped with an appropriate fish screening and/or by-pass device. This diversion may be eligible for screening cost share funds.
- 20. On February 1, 2010, the Department mailed a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-10794 to the applicant. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of March 3, 2010, for the applicant to respond. The applicant' agent emailed comments, identifying scrivener's errors and questions, and requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination. The applicant had previously provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicant is authorized to pursue the transfer.
- 21. On February 11, 2010, the Department issued a Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-10794 and mailed a copy to the applicant.
- 22. On February 22, 2010, a letter was received from Karen Pleasant, calling attention to proposed corrections to the draft Preliminary Determination (which had been included in the Preliminary Determination) and requesting additional time for completion of the changes. More than one year may be needed to allow ample time in this economic climate to acquire funding through grants, coordinate with agencies such as ODFW which is experiencing budget cuts, and complete the work using students, volunteers and donations to get much of

- the work done. The letter requested the date of completion be moved up to 2015. The Department considers this request reasonable, so the additional time is granted.
- 23. The rate allowed for the transferred portion of the right evidenced by Certificate 13831 has been adjusted in Finding of Fact #13, based on Department review of the T-10794 transfer documents prior to signature of this order.
- 24. Notice of the Preliminary Determination for the transfer application was published on the Department's weekly notice on February 16, 2010, and in the Grants Pass Daily Courier newspaper on February 22, March 1 and March 8, 2010, pursuant to ORS 540.520 and OAR 690-380-4020. No protests were filed in response to the notice.

## Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-4010(2)]

- 25. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the right. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the rights are subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610
- 26. A pump, pipeline, and sprinkler system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing rights were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-10794.
- 27. The proposed changes would not result in enlargement of the rights.
- 28. The proposed changes would not result in injury to other water rights.

## Partial Cancellation of Water Rights

- 29. On February 26, 2009, October 5, 2009 and January 8, 2010, affidavits certifying that portions of two water rights have been abandoned and requesting cancellation of the rights, were received from Karen Pleasant, agent and Associate Director for Deer Creek Center for Field Research and Education. #### Conclusions of Law

The change in points of diversion and change in place of use proposed in Transfer Application T-10794 are consistent with the requirements of ORS 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000 and the abandoned portions of rights should be cancelled.

## Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

- 1. The change in points of diversion and change in place of use proposed in application T-10794 are approved. The portions of the rights that have been abandoned are cancelled.
- 2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificates 19720, 85951, 13831 and any related decree.
- 3. Water right Certificates 19720, 85951 and 13831 are cancelled. New certificates will be issued describing the portions of the rights not affected by this transfer and cancellations.
- 4. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion.
- 5. Water use measurement conditions:
  - a. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at the new point of diversion.
  - b. The water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.
  - c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- 6. Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install a headgate to control and regulate the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department. The water user shall maintain the headgate as required by the Department.
- 7. Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install a fish screening and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the new point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) design and construction standards. Prior to installation, the water user shall obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screen and/or by-pass device meets ODFW's criteria. Prior to submitting a Claim of Beneficial Use, the water user must obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screening and/or by-pass device was installed to the state's criteria. The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen

and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards.

- 8. The former place of use of the transferred rights shall no longer receive water under the rights.
- 9. The approved changes shall be completed and full beneficial use of the water shall be made on or before **October 1, 2015**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Rights Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the changes and full beneficial use of the water.
- 10. When satisfactory proof of the completed changes is received, new certificates confirming the rights transferred will be issued.

ORDER

APPROVING APPLICATION

On August 14, 1959, Benson J. and Leone A. Benjamir of Selma, Oregon, filed an application in the office of the State Engineer for the approval of a change in point of diversion of water from Deer Creek, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

Certificate of water right issued to W. O. and H. T. Haberman and recorded at page 6067, Volume 6, State Record of Water Right Certificates, confirms a right under Permit No. 4255 for the use of the waters of Deer Creek for the irrigation of 40 acres in the NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> SW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, 40 acres in the NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> SW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, and 20 acres in the SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> SW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, Section 10, Township 38 South, Range 8 West, W. M., with a date of priority of April 8, 1919. These lands are irrigated through an unnamed ditch, the point of diversion of said ditch being located 990 feet east and 165 feet south from the northwest corner of Section 14, and being within the NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, said Section 14, Township 38 South, Range 8 West, W. M.

The applicants herein, cwners of the lands above described, propose to irrigate said lands by means of two pumping stations, one to be located 360 feet north and 650 feet west from the south quarter corner of Section 10, and being within the SE SWA, said Section 10, Township 38 South, Range 8 West, W. M., and one to be located 1320 feet north and 200 feet east from the southwest corner of Section 10, and being within the SWA SWA, said Section 10, Township 38 South, Range 8 West, W. M.

Notice of the filing of the application was given by publication setting forth a time and place certain for hearing objections to the proposed change in point of diversion of water, if any there were, namely: at

the county courthouse in Grants Pass, Oregon, on November 12, 1959, beginning at 9:00 o'clock a.m. The notice was published in the Illinois Valley News, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Josephine County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of September 17, 24 and October 1, 1959. The date set for hearing in said notice was not less than thirty days after the last publication of said notice.

Mr. George W. Thrasher, Watermaster of District No. 16, has filed a report to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion of water may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion of water may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the proposed change in point of diversion of water from Deer Creek, to-wit:

From a point located 990 feet east and 165 feet south from the nowthwest corner of Section 14, and being within the NW\$ NW\$, seid Section 14, Township 38 South, Range 8 West, W. M.,

To a point to be located 360 feet north and 650 feet west from the south quarter corner of Section 10, and being within the SE SW4, said Section 10, Township 38 South, Range 8 West, W. M., and

To a point to be located 1320 feet north and 200 feet east from the southwest corner of Section 10, and being within the SW# SW#, said Section 10, Township 38 South, Range 3 West, W. M.,

for the irrigation of 40 acres in the NEt SWt, 40 acres in the NWt SWt, and 20 acres in the SEt SWt, Section 10, Township 38 South, Range 8 West, W. M., with a date of priority of April 8, 1919, be and the same is approved.

It is FURTHER CRDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made on or before October 1, 1960 or within such extension of time as may be granted by the State Engineer for good cause shown. It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water that is available at the old point of diversion.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the watermaster, it becomes necessary to decide and measuring devices.

That the pumping plant and related works shall include a weir or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled.

That the plans of the weir or other suitable device be approved by the watermaster of Josephine County, Oregon, before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.
