8. DESCRIPTION

Proposal is to build alternate reservoir on Shirttail Creek to extend irrigation period on flood irrigated hay meadows with an existing water right.

Dam will be constructed by a bulldozer using existing adjacent material. An 18-inch diameter culvert will be installed in the bottom of dam with a controllable headgate. There will be a rocked overflow on one end of dam to provide non-erosive overflow of excess water when reservoir above the dam is full. Rock will be hauled in by truck from landowner's property and spread as necessary at the site of the overflow.

Meadows below the dam will be irrigated with overflow early in the season. Once Shirttail Creek stops flowing headgate will be opened as necessary to provide additional water. Headgate will be left open through the summer and fall and closed in early winter to again capture runoff.

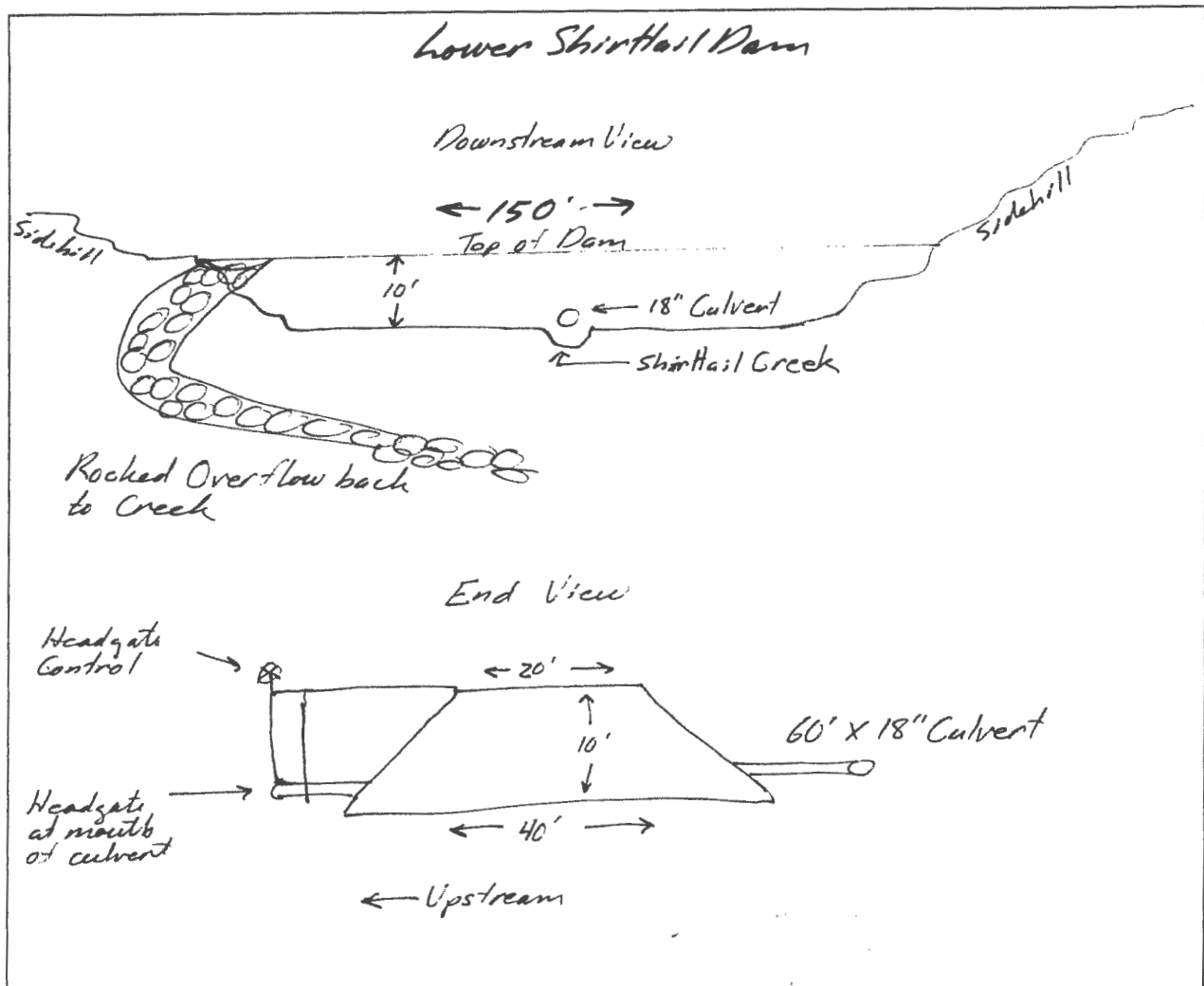

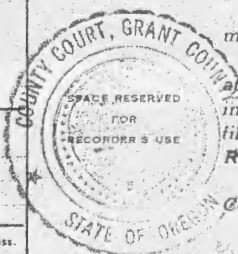
