






Dear Mr. Thompson:

Pursuant to your request, I have taken up with Mr. Stricklin the matter of revising your Permit No. 19199, as discussed when you were in this office recently, and it is his opinion that there is no way provided by law by which the permit can be revised to make the water in question appurtenant to any part of your 50 acres. When he talked to you, I believe it was his impression that your permit had not been issued, which impression was in error, because the permit was issued in the summer of 1950.

Permits can still be issued to store the winter and spring runoff of Bear Creek and to use this stored water, and the only solution we can suggest is the filing of a reservoir application and a secondary application providing you have available a reservoir site sufficient to store enough winter and spring runoff to provide the required irrigation.

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of January 3 relative to your Application No. 24105.

In answer to your first question, as far as this office is concerned, the easement to which you refer may be drawn in any form, and signatures before a notary are not required, but you should be advised that this office has no jurisdiction whatever in the matter of right of way which is a matter to be determined between the interested parties. A State Engineer's permit grants only a right to a certain amount of the public water, subject to existing rights.

All that this office would need in the case in question would be a letter or letters from the owner or owners of any property other than your own that you may have to cross with your pipe line, which letters should state that the writers are the owners of the property involved and that they have no objections to your crossing this property for the purpose of securing water as proposed in your Application No. 24105.

In answer to your second question, it is not required that a licensed engineer make either the survey or the map to be used in connection with your application.

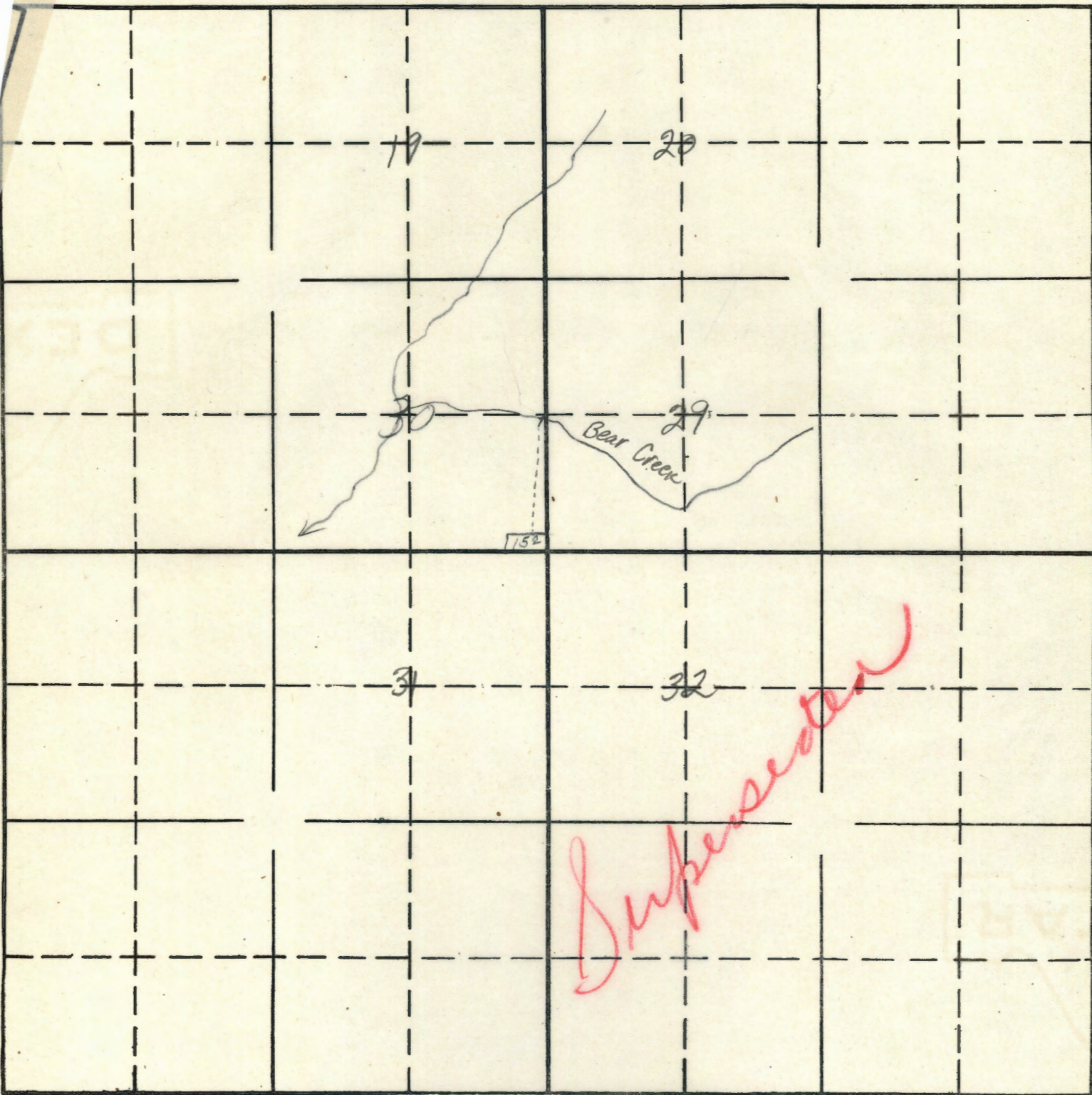
