#### Superseding Final Order

#### Appeal Rights

This is a Final Order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080 you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. This statement of judicial review rights does not create a right to judicial review of this order, if judicial review is otherwise precluded by law.

# Findings of Fact

On February 23, 2012, City of Gladstone submitted an application to the Department for a water use permit. The Department issued a Proposed Final Order on February 17, 2015. The protest period closed April 3, 2015, and no protest was filed.

On July 23, 2015, the Department issued a Final Order approving Application G-17538 and on May 3, 2016, issued Permit G-17598. Subsequently the Department discovered Permit G-17598 erroneously omitted that the municipal use should include, "limited to non-potable purposes at Meldrum Bar Park". The permit shall be conditioned to include this limitation, as well as the new well identifier, CLAC 72024, as indicated in the attached permit.

Accordingly, pursuant to OAR 137-004-0080 (5), a superseding Final Order and Permit will be issued.

### Conclusions of Law

The proposed use would not impair or be detrimental to the public interest pursuant to ORS 537.621(2).

# Order

The July 23, 2015 Final Order and Permit G-17598 are superseded by this Final Order and Permit, and are of no further force or effect.

Application G-17538 therefore is approved with the above modifications, and Permit G-17642 is issued as limited by the conditions set forth therein.
