Water will be metered. Water conservation includes using water from an intermittent stream and pumping it uphill to agricultural lands and partial amount of water then return to the drainage.

## Water-Use Permit Application Processing

### 1. Completeness Determination

The Department evaluates whether the application and accompanying map contain all of the information required under OAR 690-310-0040 and OAR 690-310-0050 ([www.oregon.gov/owrd/law.oar](http://www.oregon.gov/owrd/law.oar)). The Department also determines whether the proposed use is prohibited by statute. If the Department determines that the application is incomplete, all fees have not been paid, or the use is prohibited by statute, the application and all fees submitted are returned to the applicant.

### 2. Initial Review

The Department reviews the application to determine whether water is available during the period requested, whether the proposed use is restricted or limited by rule or statute, and whether other issues may preclude approval of or restrict the proposed use. An Initial Review (IR) containing preliminary determinations is mailed to the applicant. The applicant has 14 days from the mailing date to withdraw the application from further processing and receive a refund of all fees paid minus \$200. The applicant may put the application on hold for up to 180 days and may request additional time if necessary.

### 3. Public Notice

Within 7 days of the mailing of the initial review, the Department gives public notice of the application in the weekly notice published by the Department at [www.oregon.gov/owrd](http://www.oregon.gov/owrd). The public comment period is 30 days from publication in the weekly notice.

### 4. Proposed Final Order Issued

The Department reviews any comments received, including comments from other state agencies related to the protection of sensitive, threatened or endangered fish species. Within 60 days of completion of the IR, the Department issues a Proposed Final Order (PFO) explaining the proposed decision to deny or approve the application. A PFO proposing approval of an application will include a draft permit, and may request additional information or outstanding fees required prior to permit issuance.

### 5. Public Notice

Within 7 days of issuing the PFO, the Department gives public notice in the weekly notice. Notice includes information about the application and the PFO. Protest must be received by the Department within 45 days after publication of the PFO in the weekly notice. Anyone may file a protest. The protest filing fee is \$350.00 for the applicant and \$700.00 for non-applicants. Protests are filed on approximately 10% of Proposed Final Orders. If a protest is filed the Department will attempt to settle the protest but will schedule a contested case hearing if necessary.

### 6. Final Order Issued

If no protests are filed, the Department can issue a Final Order within 60 days of the close of the period for receiving protest. If the application is approved, a permit is issued. The permit specifies the details of the authorized use and any terms, limitations or conditions that the Department deems appropriate.

Dear Mr. Plahn:

I represent Mr. Doug McKee to acquire a water right and coordinate the process for him. I have been hired by Mr. Jason Robison of Northwest Resource Solutions.

Please find enclosed *two applications*, one to *use* water and the other to *store* water, a *Land Use Information Form*, and a *preliminary drawing for dam and pool design*. I am sending these applications via email *which also include electronic maps found on Google Earth* with designated markings. It should prove to be helpful for you prior to a field visit. The Google Earth photo map gives a good depiction of the project and landscape in Section 4. The permits are for use of an intermittent drainage to a Cooper Creek. The project dam site location is 44° 49.01' 19" North; 123° 18' 11.16 West. A map prepared by a CWRE is enclosed for the storage application.

We are in discussions with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife for an exemption for fish passage at the dam. The drainage has very poor quality fish habitat, with a mud bottom. There is no plan to provide mitigation because watershed plans show no fish presence in Cooper Creek, and there is no appreciable net benefit to migratory species. The pump horsepower is to be determined.

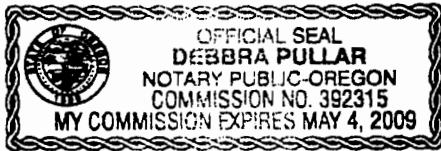

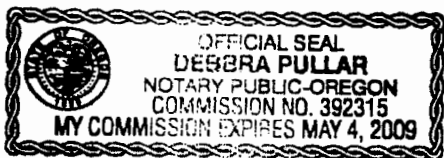
