# Please read this Proposed Final Order in its entirety as it contains additional conditions not included in the original permit.

In summary, the Department proposes to:

- Grant an extension of time to apply water to full beneficial use from October 1, 2012 to October 1, 2021.<sup>1</sup>
- Make the extension subject to certain conditions set forth below.

This Extension of Time request is being processed in accordance with Oregon Revised Statute 537.230 and 539.010(5), and Oregon Administrative Rule Chapter 690, Division 315

### <u>AUTHORITY</u>

Generally, see ORS 537.230 and OAR Chapter 690 Division 315.

ORS 537.230(3) provides in pertinent part that the Oregon Water Resources Department (Department) may, for good cause shown, order an extension of time within which irrigation or other works shall be completed or the right perfected. In determining the extension, the Department shall give due weight to the considerations described under ORS 539.010(5) and to whether other governmental requirements relating to the project have significantly delayed completion of construction or perfection of the right.

ORS 539.010(5) provides in pertinent part that the Water Resources Director, for good cause shown, may extend the time within which the full amount of the water appropriated shall be applied to a beneficial use. This statute instructs the Director to consider: the cost of the appropriation and application of the water to a beneficial purpose; the good faith of the appropriator; the market for water or power to be supplied; the present demands therefore; and the income or use that may be required to provide fair and reasonable returns upon the investment.

**OAR 690-315-0040** provides in pertinent part that the Water Resources Department shall make findings to determine if an extension of time may be approved to complete construction and/or apply water to full beneficial use.

OAR 690-315-0050(5) states that extension orders may include, but are not limited to, any condition or provision needed to: ensure future diligence; mitigate the effects of the subsequent development on competing demands on the resource; and periodically document the continued need for the permit.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

#### **Background**

On August 25, 2008, the Department issued Permit R-14633, consistant with the terms
of a settlement agreement. The permit authorizes the storage of up to 20.0 AF of water
in a reservoir from Johnson Creek, tributary to Pacific Ocean, for multiple purpose. The
permit specified the reservoir shall be filled and complete application of the stored
water to the use was to be made on or before October 1, 2012.

- 2. On November 1, 2016, the permit holder, Gary Gant, submitted an "Application for Extension of Time" to the Department, requesting the time to apply water to full beneficial use under the terms of Permit R-14633 be extended from October 1, 2012 to October 1, 2021. This is the first permit extension requested for Permit R-14633.
- 3. On November 15, 2016, notification of the Application for Extension of Time for Permit R-14633 was published in the Department's Public Notice. No public comments were received regarding the extension application.

#### Review Criteria [OAR 690-315-0040]

The time limits to complete construction and/or apply water to full beneficial use may be extended if the Department finds that the permit holder has met the requirements set forth under OAR 690-315-0040. This determination shall consider the applicable requirements of  $ORS 537.230^2$ ,  $537.248^3$  and/or  $539.010(5)^4$ .

#### Complete Extension of Time Application [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(a)]

4. On November 1, 2016, the Department received a completed Application for Extension of Time and the fee specified in ORS 536.050 from the permit holder.

#### Start of Construction [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(b) and 690-315-0040(5)]

Construction of the water system began prior to October 1, 2012, as specified in the
permit as being the date to apply water to full beneficial use. The permit holder states,
construction of the reservoir began August 15, 2011, with logging, stump removal, and
excavation of the reservoir started.

The Department has determined the permit holder has satisfied the condition requiring beginning of construction of the water works.

#### Duration of Extension [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(c)]

Under OAR 690-315-0040(1)(c), in order to approve an extension of time for water use permits the Department must find that the time requested is reasonable and the applicant can complete the project within the time requested.

6. As of November 1, 2016, the permit holder states the remaining work to be completed consists of completing excavation of the reservoir; installing conduit, stream monitoring devices, meters, pumps, outlet pipes, and power system; meeting all permit conditions, including submitting annual water use reports, and monitoring and reporting stream flows at the Johnson Creek point of diversion; and applying water to full beneficial use.

Given the amount of development left to occur, the Department has determined that the permit holder's request to have until October 1, 2021, to accomplish the application of water to beneficial use under the terms and conditions of Permit R-14633 is both reasonable and

necessary.

#### Good Cause [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(d)]

The Department's determination of good cause shall consider the requirements set forth under OAR 690-315-0040(2).

#### Reasonable Diligence of the Appropriator [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(a)]

The Department's determination of reasonable diligence shall consider the requirements set forth under OAR 690-315-0040(3)(a-d). In accordance with OAR 690-315-0040(3), the Department shall consider, but is not limited to, the following factors when determining whether the applicant has demonstrated reasonable diligence in previous performance under the permit:

#### Amount of Construction [OAR 690-315-0040(3)(a)]

- 7. The Application states work was accomplished within the time allowed in the permit as follows:
  - a. Construction of the water system began prior to October 1, 2012.
  - b. Work was accomplished during the original development time frame under Permit R-14633. Work accomplished consisted of logging, tree and stump removal at the place of use.
  - c. Since October 1, 2012, the permit holder has completed stump removal, and began excavation of the reservoir.

The Application provides evidence of progress of physical work made towards completion of the water system, enough to qualify as the minimum necessary for the Department to find good cause and reasonable diligence towards complete application of water to a beneficial use.

### Compliance with Conditions [OAR 690-315-0040(3)(c)]

8. The Department has considered the permit holder's compliance with conditions, and has identified the following concerns: the record does not show that (1) a totalizing flow meter has been installed at each point of diversion, (2) annual reports of the amount of water used each month have not been received by the Department, (3) annual reports of the natural stream flow measurements at the Johnson Creek point of diversion have not been received by the Department, and (4) an outlet pipe, or the provision of other means to evacuate water has been installed. The Department recognizes that it is the intent of the permit holder to comply with all permit conditions at the time the conditions become applicable.

Beneficial use of water under this permit, therefore, has not yet been demonstrated. In order to legally perfect the use of water under this permit, the permit holder must demonstrate that all conditions of the permit have been satisfied.

As described in Findings of Fact 8, the Department has determined that the applicant has not demonstrated compliance with permit conditions under Permit R-14633.

#### Beneficial Use of Water [OAR 690-315-0040(3)(b)]

- 9. The Application states no water has been stored in the reservoir under Permit R-14633.
- 10. According to the permit holder delay of full beneficial use of water under Permit R-14633 was due, in part, to the sudden drop in price of cranberries. The farm became less profitable, and costs to operate the farm had to be spread out over a longer time frame. Health issues also made it impossible for a family member to work for extended periods of time, leaving one person to continue development of Permit R-14633. The permit holder needs more time in which to obtain the full quantity of water allowed for storage under the permit.

Based on Findings of Fact (FOF) 9, the Department has determined beneficial use of water has not yet been demonstrated under this permit as no water has been stored, and permit conditions were not satisfied by the October 1, 2012.

## <u>Financial Investments to appropriate and Apply Water to a Beneficial Purpose [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(b),(3)(d),(4)(d)]</u>

11. The Applications states the permit holder has invested about \$77,000, which is about 41 percent of the total projected cost for complete development of this project. The permit holder anticipates an additional \$110,000 investment is needed for the completion of this project.

#### Good Faith of the Appropriator [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(c)]

The Department has found good faith of the appropriator under Permit R-14633.

#### The Market and Present Demands for Water [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(d-e)]

The Department's determinations of market and present demand for water or power to be supplied shall consider the requirements set forth under OAR 690-315-0040(4)(a-f). In accordance with OAR 690-315-0040(4), the Department shall consider, but is not limited to, the following factors when determining the market and the present demand for water or power to be supplied:

The amount of water available to satisfy other affected water rights and scenic waterway flows; special water use designations established since permit issuance, including but not limited to state scenic waterways, federal wild and scenic rivers, serious water management problem areas or water quality limited sources established under 33 U.S.C. 1313(d); or the habitat needs of sensitive, threatened or endangered species, in consultation with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife [OAR 690-315-0040(4)(a-c)].

13. A review of the amount of water available to satisfy other affected water rights and scenic waterway flows was determined at the time of issuance of Permit R-14633; furthermore, water availability for other affected water rights and scenic waterway

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- flows after the permit was issued is determined when an application for a new water right is submitted.
- 14. Current Water Availability Analysis for the Johnson Creek, (Tributary to Pacific Ocean) at the mouth (watershed ID 70228), shows that no water is available during the months of August, September, November, and December at the 50% exceedance level.
- 15. The point of diversion is located on Johnson Creek, tributary to Pacific Ocean, and is not located within a Withdrawn Area.
- 16. Johnson Creek is not located within or above a state or federal scenic waterway.
- 17. Johnson Creek is located within an area ranked "moderate" for stream flow restoration needs as determined by the Department in consultation with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, and is located within a Sensitive, Threatened or Endangered Fish Species Area as identified by the Department in consultation with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.
- 18. The point of diversion is not in a location listed by the Department of Environmental Quality as a water quality limited stream.

#### Other economic interests dependent on completion of the project [OAR 690-315-0040(4)(e)].

19. The Application does not identify other economic interests dependent on completion of the project have been.

## Other factors relevant to the determination of the market and present demand for water and power [OAR 690-315-0040(4)(f)].

- 20. No other factors relevant to the determination of the market and present demand for water and power have been identified.
- 21. OAR 690-315-0050(5) provides for extension orders to include, but are not limited to, any condition or provision needed to ensure future diligence, and/or mitigate the effects of the subsequent development on competing demands on the resource. Based on FOF 9, the Department determined the need to place a "Water Use Condition" on this extension of time in order to ensure diligence is exercised in the development and perfection of water use permit. This condition, specified under Item 1 of the "Conditions" section of this PFO, was determined to be necessary because no beneficial use of water use under the terms and conditions of the permit has been made since the permit issuance (see FOF 9).

#### Fair Return Upon Investment [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(f)]

22. The Application did not identify that use and income from the permitted water development will likely result in reasonable returns upon the investment made to date.

#### Other Governmental Requirements [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(q)]

23. The Application did not identify that delay in the development of this project was not caused by any other governmental requirements.

#### Unforeseen Events [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(h)]

24. According to the permit holder, unforeseen events extended the length of time needed to fully develop and perfect Permit R-14633, in that the permit holders were faced with an unstable cranberry market and serious health issues which restricted their ability to complete development of the project in a timely manner.

#### Denial of an Extension Would Result in Undue Hardship [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(i)]

25. The Application did not state if a denial of the extension would result in undue hardship.

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 1. The Applicant is entitled to apply for an extension of time to complete construction and/or completely apply water to the full beneficial use pursuant to ORS 537.230(3).
- 2. The Applicant has submitted a complete extension application form and the fee specified in ORS 536.050, as required by OAR 690-315-0040(1)(a).
- 3. The Applicant complied with timeline requirements to begin construction as required by ORS 537.230, OAR 690-315-0040(1)(b) and OAR 690-315-0040(5).
- 4. Based on Finding of Facts 5 through 12, full application of water to beneficial use can be accomplished by October 1, 2021<sup>5</sup>, as required by OAR 690-315-0040(1)(c).
- 5. The Department has considered the reasonable diligence and good faith of the appropriator, the cost to appropriate and apply water to a beneficial purpose, the market and present demands for water to be supplied, the financial investment made and fair and reasonable return upon the investment, the requirements of other governmental agencies, and unforeseen events over which the permit holder had no control, whether denial of the extension will result in undue hardship to the applicant and whether there are no other reasonable alternatives for meeting water use needs, any other factors relevant to a determination of good cause, and has determined that the applicant has shown that good cause exists for an extension of time to apply water to full beneficial use pursuant to OAR 690-315-0040(1)(d).

6. As authorized in OAR 690-315-0050(5) and as described in Finding 21, above, the Department has established, as specified in the "Conditions" section of this PFO (Item 1), a "Water Usage Condition" in order to ensure future diligence is exercised in the development and perfection of Permit R-14633.

#### PROPOSED ORDER

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Department proposes to issue an order to:

Extend the time to apply water to beneficial use under Permit R-14633 from October 1, 2012 to October 1, 2021.

Subject to the following conditions:

#### **CONDITIONS**

#### 1. Water Use Condition

If no water is applied to beneficial use under the terms and conditions of Permit R-14633 on or before October 1, 2021, this will be the last extension of time granted for Permit R-14633.

#### **Proposed Final Order Hearing Rights**

- Under the provisions of OAR 690-315-0100(1) and 690-315-0060, the applicant or any
  other person adversely affected or aggrieved by the proposed final order may submit a
  written protest to the proposed final order. The written protest must be received by
  the Water Resources Department no later than <u>February 10, 2016</u>, being 45 days from
  the date of publication of the proposed final order in the Department's weekly notice.
- 2. A written protest shall include:
  - The name, address and telephone number of the petitioner;

- A description of the petitioner's interest in the proposed final order and if the protestant claims to represent the public interest, a precise statement of the public interest represented;
- c. A detailed description of how the action proposed in the proposed final order would adversely affect or aggrieve the petitioner's interest;
- d. A detailed description of how the proposed final order is in error or deficient and how to correct the alleged error or deficiency;
- e. Any citation of legal authority supporting the petitioner, if known;
- f. Proof of service of the protest upon the water right permit holder, if petitioner is other than the water right permit holder; and
- g. The applicant or non-applicant protest fee required under ORS 536.050.
- 3. Within 60 days after the close of the period for requesting a contested case hearing, the Director shall:
  - a. Issue a final order on the extension request; or
  - b. Schedule a contested case hearing if a protest has been submitted, and:
    - 1) Upon review of the issues, the Director finds there are significant disputes related to the proposed agency action; or
    - 2) The applicant submits a written request for a contested case hearing within 30 days after the close of the period for submitting protests.
