# Please read this Proposed Final Order in its entirety as it contains additional conditions not included in the original permit.

In Summary, the Department proposes to:

• Grant an extension of time to apply water to full beneficial use from October 1, 2010, to October 1, 2017<sup>1</sup>.

This Extension of Time request is being processed in accordance with Oregon Revised Statute 537.630 and 539.010(5), and Oregon Administrative Rule Chapter 690, Division 315.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup>Pursuant to ORS 537.630(4), upon the completion of beneficial use of water allowed under the permit, the permittee shall hire a certified water rights examiner to survey the appropriation. Within one year after the complete application of water to a beneficial use (or by the date allowed for the complete application of water to a beneficial use), the permittee shall submit a map of the survey and a new or revised claim of beneficial use as deemed appropriate by the Department.

#### **AUTHORITY**

Generally, see ORS 537.630 and OAR Chapter 690 Division 315.

ORS 537.630(1) provides in pertinent part that the Oregon Water Resources Department (Department) for good cause shown shall order and allow an extension of time within which irrigation or other works shall be completed or the right perfected. In determining the extension, the Department shall give due weight to the considerations described under ORS 539.010(5) and to whether other governmental requirements relating to the project have significantly delayed completion of construction or perfection of the right.

**ORS 539.010(5)** instructs the Director to consider: the cost of the appropriation and application of the water to a beneficial purpose; the good faith of the appropriator; the market for water or power to be supplied; the present demands therefor; and the income or use that may be required to provide fair and reasonable returns upon the investment.

OAR 690-315-0040 provides that in order to approve an application for an extension of time to complete construction or apply water to full beneficial use, the Department shall make the findings in OAR 690-315-0040(1) including a finding that there is "good cause" to approve the extension. OAR 690-315-0040(2)-(4) contains the factors that the Department must consider to make findings that support a "good cause" determination.

OAR 690-315-0050(5) states that extension orders may include, but are not limited to, any condition or provision needed to: ensure future diligence; mitigate the effects of the subsequent development on competing demands on the resource; and periodically document the continued need for the permit.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On May 28, 1997, Permit G-13134 was issued by the Department. The permit authorizes the use of up to 2.23 cfs of water from a well in the Muddy Creek Basin for supplemental irrigation of 200.0 acres. The permit specified actual construction of the well was to begin within one year of permit issuance, being May 28, 1998, and complete application of the water to the use was to be made on or before October 1, 2001.

- 2. Two prior permit extensions have been granted for Permit G-13134. The most recent extension request resulted in the completion date for full application of water being extended from October 1, 2005, to October 1, 2010.
- 3. On May 27, 2008, the Department approved Permit Amendment T-10491 (Special Order Volume 74, Page 1038) authorizing an additional point of appropriation under Permit G-13134 (modified by Permit Amendment T-10491), which is hereafter referred to simply as Permit G-13134.
- 4. On May 1, 2017, Nancy Rorick (Agent) for the permit holder, Gary L. Kramer, submitted an "Application for Extension of Time" (Application) to the Department, requesting the time to apply water to full beneficial use under the terms and conditions of Permit G-13134 be extended from October 1, 2010, to October 1, 2013.
- 5. On April 11, 2017, notification of the Application for Permit G-13134 was published in the Department's Public Notice. No public comments were received regarding the Application.
- 6. On May 4, 2017, the permit holder submitted an amendment to their Application. The amendment requested the extended time to apply water to full beneficial use of the water system be changed from October 1, 2013, to October 1, 2017.

## Review Criteria [OAR 690-315-0040]

In order to approve an Application for an Extension of Time to complete construction and/or apply water to full beneficial use pursuant to ORS 537.230 or 537.630, or to begin construction, pursuant to ORS 537.248, the Department must make the findings in OAR 690-315-0040(1)(a) – (d).

#### Complete Extension of Time Application [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(a)]

7. On May 1, 2017, the Department received a completed Application and the fee specified in ORS 536.050 from the permit holder.

#### Start of Construction [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(b) and 690-315-0040(5)]

- 8. Actual construction of the well began prior to the May 28, 1998 deadline specified in the permit. According to the permit holder, construction of BAKE 50095/50918/51545 (Well 1) began February 7, 1996.
- 9. According to the well log received by the Department on November 18, 1996, construction of Well 1 began February 7, 1996.

The Department has determined based on Finding of Fact (FOF) 8 and 9 that the prosecution of the construction of the well began prior to May 28, 1998.

## Good Cause [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(d)]

The Department must find that there is "good cause" to approve the extension. In making a "good cause" finding, the Department shall consider the requirements set forth under OAR 690-315-0040(2).

## Reasonable Diligence of the Appropriator [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(a)]

In order to make a finding of "good cause" to approve the extension, the Department shall consider whether the applicant has demonstrated "reasonable diligence" in previous performance under the permit. OAR 690-315-0040(2)(a). In determining "reasonable diligence", the Department shall consider, but is not limited to, the following factors: a) The amount of construction completed within the time allowed in the permit or previous extension; b) The amount of beneficial use made of the water during the permit or previous extension time limits; c) Water right holder conformance with the permit or previous extension conditions; and d) Financial investments made toward developing the beneficial use of water.

#### OAR 690-315-0040(3)(a)

<u>Amount of Construction (The amount of construction completed within the time allowed in the previous extension.</u><sup>2</sup>)

- 10. During the most recent extension period, being from October 1, 2005, to October 1, 2010, the following was accomplished:
  - Deepening of Well 1;
  - Construction of BAKE 51889 (Well 2) began July 11, 2008, and was completed July 15, 2008; and
  - Installed a pump on Well 2.
- 11. Since October 1, 2010, the applicant has installed mainline pipes and a meter on Well 2.

The Department has determined based on FOF 10 and 11, that work has been accomplished during the last extension period, which provides evidence of good cause and reasonable diligence towards the complete application of water to a beneficial use.

#### OAR 690-315-0040(3)(c)

**Compliance with Conditions** 

The water right permit holder's conformance with the previous extension conditions.

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<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> "Actual Construction" is defined in OAR 690-315-0020(3)(d)(A) and(B) as physical work performed toward completion of the water system which demonstrates the water right permit holder's good faith and intention to complete the project with reasonable diligence. Actual construction does not include planning a diversion system, formulating a business plan, securing financing, letting contracts, purchasing but not installing equipment, surveying, clearing land or planting crops.

#### Well 1

- 12. For Well 1, the Department has considered the permit holder's compliance with permit conditions, and did not identify any concerns.
  - a. In June 1996, a meter was installed on Well 1.
  - b. Department records show annual water use reports have been submitted for Well 1, for water years 2000, 2001, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2008, and 2012 through 2016.

The Department has determined, based on FOF 12 that the permit holder has demonstrated compliance with permit conditions for Well 1 as required by Permit G-13134.

#### Well 2

- 13. The Department has considered the permit holder's compliance with conditions, and has identified the following concerns for Well 2: (1) the record does not show that a meter or other suitable measuring device has been installed on Well 2 by October 1, 2010, and (2) annual reports of the amount of water used each month from Well 2 have not been received by the Department by October 1, 2010.
  - a. On November 12, 2012, a meter was installed on Well 2.
  - b. Department records show annual water use reports have been submitted for Well 2, for water years 2015 and 2016.

The Department has determined based on FOF 13, that the permit holder has demonstrated compliance with following permit conditions as required by Permit G-13134, after October 1, 2010:

"Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order, shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director."

#### OAR 690-315-0040(3)(b)

<u>Beneficial Use of Water:</u> the amount of beneficial use made of the water during the previous extension conditions.

14. The Application states currently a maximum rate of 1.17 cfs of water has been appropriated from Well 2 for supplemental irrigation of 200.0 acres.

15. According to the permit holder, delay of full beneficial use of water under Permit G-13134 was due, in part, to the permit holder assumed a consultant had completed all the tasks required under the permit.

The Department has determined based on FOF 13 that beneficial use of water has not yet been demonstrated under this permit because not all permit conditions were satisfied by October 1, 2010.

#### OAR 690-315-0040(2)(b),(3)(d),(4)(d)

Financial Investments to Appropriate and Apply Water to a Beneficial Purpose

16. The Application states the permit holder has invested about \$85,835, which is the total projected cost for complete development of this project.

The Department has determined based on FOF 16, that the permit holder had made an investment, which provides evidence of good cause and reasonable diligence towards the complete application of water to a beneficial use.

### Reasonable Diligence of the Appropriator [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(a)]

The Application provides evidence that work has been accomplished towards completion of the water system; the permit holder has demonstrated compliance with permit conditions, a financial investment has been made, and; beneficial use of water has been demonstrated. The Department has determined the applicant has demonstrated reasonable diligence in previous performance under Permit G-13134.

## The Market and Present Demands for Water [OAR 690-315-0040(4)(a-f)

The Department's determinations of market and present demand for water or power to be supplied shall consider the requirements set forth under OAR 690-315-0040(4)(a-f). In accordance with OAR 690-315-0040(4), the Department shall consider, but is not limited to, the following factors when determining the market and the present demand for water or power to be supplied:

- (a)The amount of water available to satisfy other affected water rights and scenic waterway flows;
- (b) Special water use designations established since permit issuance, including but not limited to state scenic waterways, federal wild and scenic rivers, serious water management problem areas or water quality limited sources established under 33 U.S.C. 1313(d);
- (c) The habitat needs of sensitive, threatened or endangered species, in consultation with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife;
- (d) Economic investment in the project to date;
- (e) Other economic interests dependent on completion of the project; and
- (f) Other factors relevant to the determination of the market and present demands for

water and power.

#### OAR 690-315-0040(4)(a)

The amount of water available to satisfy other affected water rights and scenic waterway flows.

17. A review of the amount of water available to satisfy other affected water rights and scenic waterway flows was determined at the time of issuance of Permit G-13134; furthermore, water availability for other affected water rights and scenic waterway flows after the permit was issued is determined when an Application for a new water right is submitted.

#### OAR 690-315-0040(4)(b)

Special water use designations established since permit issuance, including but not limited to state scenic waterways, federal wild and scenic rivers, serious water management problem areas or water quality limited sources established under 33 U.S.C. 1313(d).

- 18. The points of appropriation for Permit G-13134, located within the Powder River Basin, are not located within a limited or critical groundwater area.
- 19. Powder River is not located within or above any state or federal scenic waterway.
- 20. The points of appropriation are not in an area listed by the Department of Environmental Quality as a water quality limited stream.

#### OAR 690-315-0040(4)(c)

The habitat needs of sensitive, threatened or endangered species, in consultation with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.

21. Powder River is located within an area ranked "high" for stream flow restoration needs as determined by the Department in consultation with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, and is located within a Sensitive, Threatened or Endangered Fish Species Area as identified by the Department in consultation with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.

#### OAR 690-315-0040(4)(d)

Economic interests dependent on completion of the project.

22. The Application states an approximate total of \$85,835 has been invested in the project.

#### OAR 690-315-0040(4)(e)

Other economic interests dependent on completion of the project.

23. The Application states the land is rented out to another farmer who depends on it for his income.

#### OAR 690-315-0040(4)(f)

Other factors relevant to the determination of the market and present demand for water and power.

24. The Application states there are no other supplemental water sources available.

## OAR 690-315-0040(2)(f) Fair Return Upon Investment

25. The Application states the permit enables the permit holder to use the pivot during the entire growing season.

## OAR 690-315-0040(2)(g) <u>Other Governmental Requirements</u>

26. The Application did not identify any delay in the development of this project that was caused by any other governmental requirements.

## OAR 690-315-0040(2)(h) <u>Unforeseen Events</u>

27. The Application did not identify unforeseen events.

## OAR 690-315-0040(2)(i) Denial of the Extension Will Result in Undue Hardship

28. The Application did state a denial of the extension would result in undue hardship, as the water is needed to irrigate after the primary water source is no longer available.

## OAR 690-315-0040(2)(c) Good Faith of the Appropriator

29. The Application provides evidence of good faith of the appropriator under Permit G-13134.

Based on FOF 8 through 14, 16, and 22, the Department has determined that the applicant has shown good faith and reasonable diligence.

#### Duration of Extension [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(c)]

Under OAR 690-315-0040(1)(c), in order to approve an extension of time for water use permits the Department must find that the time requested is reasonable and the applicant can complete the project within the time requested.

30. As of May 1, 2017, the Application states the remaining work to be completed consists of applying water to full beneficial use, as development is complete.

Given the amount of development left to occur, the Department has determined that the permit holder's request to have until October 1, 2017, to accomplish the application of water to beneficial use under the terms and conditions of Permit G-13134 is both reasonable and necessary.

## Good Cause [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(d)]

The Department must find that there is "good cause" to approve the extension. In making a "good cause" finding, the Department shall consider the requirements set forth under OAR 690-315-0040(2).

The Department has considered the reasonable diligence and good faith of the appropriator, the cost to appropriate and apply water to a beneficial purpose, the market and present demands for water to be supplied, the financial investment made and fair and reasonable return upon the investment, the requirements of other governmental agencies, and unforeseen events over which the permit holder had no control, whether denial of the extension will result in undue hardship to the applicant and whether there are no other reasonable alternatives for meeting water use needs, any other factors relevant to a determination of good cause, and has determined that the applicant has shown that good cause exists for an extension of time to apply water to full beneficial use pursuant to OAR 690-315-0040(1)(d).

#### **LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS**

1. OAR 690-315-0050(5) provides for extension orders to include, but are not limited to, any condition or provision needed to ensure future diligence, and/or mitigate the effects of the subsequent development on competing demands on the resource. The Department determined the need to place a "Last Extension Condition" on this extension of time in order to ensure diligence is exercised in the development and perfection of the water use permit. This condition, specified under Item 1 of the "Conditions" section of this PFO, was determined to be necessary due to the lapse in time since the issuance of Permit G-13134 on May 28, 1997.

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 1. The applicant has submitted a complete extension application form and the fee specified in ORS 536.050, as required by OAR 690-315-0040(1)(a).
- 2. The applicant has complied with the construction timeline requirements to begin actual construction as required by ORS 537.630, OAR 690-315-0040(1)(b) and OAR 690-315-0040(5).

- 3. Based on Finding of Facts 8 through 29, full application of water to beneficial use can be accomplished by October 1, 2017, as required by OAR 690-315-0040(1)(c).
- The applicant can complete the project within the time period requested for the 4. extension on the project, but the extension is conditioned to mitigate the effects of the subsequent development on competing demands on the resource and is granted only for the reasonable time necessary to complete water development an apply water to beneficial use. OAR 690-315-0050(5).
- 5. The applicant has demonstrated good cause for the extension, but the extension must be conditioned to ensure this is the last extension granted in order to ensure future diligence; OAR 690-315-0050(5).

#### PROPOSED ORDER

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Department proposes to issue an order to:

Extend the time to apply water to beneficial use under Permit G-13134 from October 1, 2010, to October 1, 2017.

Subject to the following conditions:

#### LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS

#### 1. **Last Extension Condition**

This is to be the last extension of time granted for Permit G-13134 . Any future extensions of time requests shall be denied.

#### **Proposed Final Order Hearing Rights**

- Under the provisions of OAR 690-315-0100(1) and 690-315-0060, the applicant or any
  other person adversely affected or aggrieved by the proposed final order may submit a
  written protest to the proposed final order. The written protest must be received by
  the Water Resources Department no later than <u>July 28, 2017</u>, being 45 days from the
  date of publication of the proposed final order in the Department's weekly notice.
- 2. A written protest shall include:
  - a. The name, address and telephone number of the petitioner;
  - A description of the petitioner's interest in the proposed final order and if the protestant claims to represent the public interest, a precise statement of the public interest represented;
  - c. A detailed description of how the action proposed in the proposed final order would adversely affect or aggrieve the petitioner's interest;
  - d. A detailed description of how the proposed final order is in error or deficient and how to correct the alleged error or deficiency;
  - e. Any citation of legal authority supporting the petitioner, if known;
  - f. Proof of service of the protest upon the water right permit holder, if petitioner is other than the water right permit holder; and
  - g. The applicant or non-applicant protest fee required under ORS 536.050.
- 3. Within 60 days after the close of the period for requesting a contested case hearing, the Director shall:
  - a. Issue a final order on the extension request; or
  - b. Schedule a contested case hearing if a protest has been submitted, and:
    - 1) Upon review of the issues, the Director finds there are significant disputes related to the proposed agency action; or
    - 2) The applicant submits a written request for a contested case hearing within 30 days after the close of the period for submitting protests.
