The plans for the Sough and Heady Log Londs have been examined and are being returned to you for additional information on two liters.

- There appears to be an error in the capacity curve. By computations would indicate a depacity of just over 100 acre feet for all jouls.

Aside from these two points, the plane appear to adequately regresent the existing structures and the changes you propose.

The reservoir application is being returned so that data agreeing with your plans can be shown on the application. It appears that the original application did not make proper allowance for borrow from the interior of the log pixes. Therefore, this application abould cover the increased storage. The increased storage is considered to be in all four posds. Changes should be made in the following items of the application:

- Item 3. The capacity shown should be the difference between the existing especity and 57.6 here feet for which a right exists. A notation should be entered in the remarks indicating that the 57.6 here feet is covered by cortificate number 22620.
- Item for Oboute to accommend to include Day hap to include two western yours.
- Itom 6: Location should be exemped an above. Maximum height appears to be about 16 feet at northeest corner of old

pond. Lengths of dike would be total lengths of old and new dikes. Top width should be minimum proposed top width. Upstream slope appears to be steeper than 3st. Height of dam above water line should be minimum that will exist at any point where good in Junicaled by dike.

with Mobert Steimer this log pond was inspected on December 9, 1963.

pushing material from below the downstream toe up onto the dam. The material consists of sand, silt and boulders. There was very little seepage noted at the toe although the pond has evidently been full for some time. The maximum height of the dam is 16% feet with a crest width of approximately six feet minimum. At the northeast corner of the pond is an 18-inch corrugated metal pipe outlet and near the northwest corner there is a wood flume overflow across the crest with a bottom width of 21 inches and a depth of 11% inches. Along the west side the pond has been formed entirely by excavation. At the present time little damage would be done by a breach of the dike since the water would have to spread over a large area before reaching any structures.
