Dear Mr. Bennett:

I am currently plotting the water rights in my district on assessor maps. I believe I have found two rights covering the same lands.

Application #18025, Permit #13694, Certificate #13760 is for the irrigation of 0.1 acres in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$, 0.4 acres in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$, and 9.5 acres in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$. There was a final proof map made for this right July 10, 1940.

Application #28074, Permit #23104, Certificate #27514 is for the irrigation of 4.7 acres in the $SE_{\frac{1}{4}}^{1}$ NW $_{\frac{1}{4}}^{1}$ and 7.2 acres in the $SE_{\frac{1}{4}}^{1}$ NW $_{\frac{1}{4}}^{1}$. The map was prepared from data furnished by the applicant. No survey was made by our office.

It is possible that these rights lie on the same land. Even if they do not, there is a definite overlap indicated by the maps sent me.

What would be the best way to correct this situation. I believe there should not be any overlaping of water rights.

Enclosed is a map (copied from an assessor map) of the two rights.
