The P.O.D. will consist of a small pump house above the high water mark with 10-15' of pipe going down into the River. From here ~500' of 1" pvc pipe will deliver water to a treatment tank near the single family household.

Direct connection to a single family home.

A flow restrictor valve will limit the diversion rate to 0.01 cfs year-round. This will be further limited to 500 gallons of water per day during April 1 - November 30.

Application Supplement for Human Consumption & Livestock Uses
