Dear Mr. and Mrs. Russell:

We have received your application for a permit to appropriate 0.025 cubic foot of water per second from a slough for irrigation of 2 acres, 4 copies of a map, legal description, and the fee of \$30.00 for which our receipt No. 64082 is enclosed. For your reference the application has been assigned No. 56653.

In comparing your application map to the maps of the area, it would appear that the slough you have applied upon is a natural lake by the name of Lost Lake. Applications for the use of the waters of the natural lakes of the south coast basin are acceptable only for, among other uses, irrigation of lawn and garden not to exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ acre in area. Your application for a permit to irrigate 2 acres is in excess of this amount, and therefore, must be rejected in its present form.

I am returning your application and maps to you. If you wish to modify it to an acceptable use and resubmit it to this office, the application could then be approved.

We were unaware that the water behind our house was considered part of "Lost Lake" -- always called it a "slough" --- altho we knew it joined "Lost Lake" on the western part of our property here. Thank you for setting us straight.
