Application History

On August 29, 1997, CARY BOGS submitted an application to the Department for a water use permit. The Department issued a Proposed Final Order on February 10, 1998. The protest period closed March 27, 1998, and no protest was filed.

The proposed use would not impair or be detrimental to the public interest, but the Department's continuing evaluation reveals that the Proposed Final Order requires modification to correctly describe dam/dike locations on the three reservoirs, to correctly describe the date by which construction must begin, and to include an additional storage condition. Construction must begin within one year of the issuance of this Final Order.

Order

Upon payment of outstanding permit recording fees, Application R-83543 shall be approved as modified above and as conditioned in the attached draft permit.

Permit recording fees are required in the amount of \$175.00. Said fees are due and payable no later than 60 days from the date of this Final Order. Failure to pay the required permit recording fees within 60 days from the date of this Final Order will result in the proposed rejection of Application R-83543.

PURPOSE OR USE OF THE STORED WATER: TO BE APPROPRIATED UNDER APPLICATION S-83542 FOR CRANBERRY OPERATIONS

MAXIMUM VOLUME: 56.6 ACRE-FEET (AF) PER YEAR EACH YEAR, BEING 9.0 AF IN RESERVOIR 1, 20.0 AF IN RESERVOIR 2, AND 27.6 AF IN RESERVOIR 3

PERIOD OF ALLOWED USE: WATER MAY BE APPROPRIATED FOR STORAGE DURING THE PERIOD DECEMBER 1 THROUGH MARCH 31

DATE OF PRIORITY: AUGUST 29, 1997

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 1.0 acre for Reservoir 1, 1.2 acres for Reservoir 2, and 2.0 acres for Reservoir 3 and the maximum depth of water will be 100 feet for Reservoir 1, 25.0 feet for Reservoir 2, and 23 feet for Reservoir 3. The maximum height of the dams shall not exceed 10.0 feet.

DAM LOCATION: SW 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 7, T30S, R14W, W.M.; RESERVOIR 1 - 455 FEET NORTH & 60 FEET EAST, RESERVOIR 2 - 115 FEET NORTH & 400 FEET EAST, AND RESERVOIR 3 - 60 FEET NORTH & 750 FEET EAST ALL FROM W1/4 CORNER, SECTION 7

THE AREA TO BE SUBMERGED BY THE RESERVOIR IS LOCATED AS FOLLOWS:

SW 1/4 NW 1/4 SECTION 7

TOWNSHIP 30 SOUTH, RANGE 14 WEST, W.M.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

A. Before water use may begin under this permit, a staff gage that measures the entire range and stage between full reservoir level dead pool storage must be installed in the reservoir. The staff gage shall be United States Geological Survey style porcelain enamel iron staff gage style A, C, E or

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The permittee shall take a reading from the gage once a month and keep a record of these measurements and shall be responsible for maintaining the gage. The permittee shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department at its request. The permittee may be required to measure water use more frequently or report annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the permit.

Use under this permit is limited to the reservoir areas. This permit does not provide for the appropriation of water for maintaining the water level or maintaining a suitable fresh water condition.

Before water use may begin under this permit, a weir must be installed upstream and downstream of the reservoir(s). A written waiver may be obtained from the local Watermaster if in his judgement the installation of the weir(s) will provide no public benefit.

The storage of water allowed herein in Reservoir 2 is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or the provision of other means to evacuate water when determined necessary by the Water Resources Director to satisfy prior downstream rights.

The storage of water in Reservoir 1 and 3 allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of a fully functional conduit/gate assembly having a minimum diameter of 8 inches.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The Director finds that the proposed use(s) of water described by this permit, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.
