#### Final Order Extension of Time for Permit Number S-53501

#### Appeal Rights

This is a final order other than contested case. Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-080 and OAR 690-01-005 you may either petition the Director for reconsideration of this order or petition for judicial review of this order. As provided in ORS 536.075, this order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review of the order must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2).

#### **Application History**

On October 16, 2002, Cary Bogs submitted an application to the Department for an extension of time for permit number S-53501. The Department issued permit number S-53501 on November 13, 1998. The permit called for complete application of water to beneficial use by October 1, 2002. In accordance with OAR 690-315-0050(2), on June 8, 2004, the Department issued a Proposed Final Order proposing to extend the time for complete application of water to beneficial use to October 1, 2012. The protest period closed July 23, 2004, in accordance with OAR 690-315-0060(1). No protest was filed.

The applicant has demonstrated good cause for the permit extension pursuant to ORS 537.230, 537.248, 537.630, 539.010(5) and/or OAR 690-315-0040(2).

At time of issuance of the Proposed Final Order the Department concluded that, based on the factors demonstrated by the applicant, the permit may be extended subject to the following conditions:

#### **CONDITIONS**

- 1. In accordance with OAR 690-315-0050(6), the permittee must submit a written progress report to the Department by October 1, 2009. The report must be received by the Department not sooner than 90 days prior to the due date. The permittee's report must describe in detail the work done each year since the last extension was granted or the last progress report submitted. The report shall include:
  - a) The amount of construction completed;
  - b) The amount of beneficial use of water being made, including the total volume of water used, water used relative to the specific authorizations (types of use, acres irrigated, etc.) contained in the permit, and the percent of the total allowable water use that this represents;
  - c) A review of the permittee's compliance with terms and conditions of the permit and/or previous extension; and

d) Financial investments made toward developing the beneficial water use.

The Department will review the progress report to determine whether the permittee is exercising diligence towards completion of the project and complying with the terms and conditions of the permit and extension.

# Failure to submit a progress report by the due date above may jeopardize continued development under the permit.

The Department will take into consideration annual reports submitted under OAR Chapter 690, Division 86 or ORS 537.099, and any other report that demonstrates diligence.

Other reports, however, are not a substitute for the progress reports and anything submitted must clearly show that diligence towards perfecting the water right permit is being attempted.

If the Department finds that diligence is questionable, the Department may:

- a) request the permittee to submit additional information with which to evaluate diligence; or
- b) apply additional conditions and performance criteria for perfection of the right; or
- c) cancel the undeveloped portion of the permit pursuant to ORS 537.260 or 537.410 to 537.450. The Department will grant the permittee a hearing on the cancellation, if one is requested.

In determining whether the permittee has been diligent, the Department will consider any information submitted to the Department by the permittee and any information submitted during the 30-day public comment period following public notice of submittal of the progress report.

If information is received through the public notice process indicating that the applicant has not been diligent toward completing the project, and if the director determines there are significant disputes related to the use of water, the Department will conduct a hearing.

#### <u>Order</u>

The extension of time for Application Number S-83542, Permit Number S-53501, therefore, is approved. The deadline for application of water to full beneficial use is extended to October 1, 2012.

This Proposed Final Order applies only to Permit #S-53501, water right Application #S-83542. A copy of Permit #S-53501 is enclosed as Attachment 1.

### Summary of Proposed Final Order for Extension of Time

#### The Department proposes to:

- grant the extension for complete application of water from October 1, 2001, to October 1, 2011; and
- make the extension subject to certain conditions set forth below.

### <u>AUTHORITY</u>

**ORS 537.230(2)** provides in pertinent part that the Water Resources Department shall, for good cause shown, order an extension of time within which irrigation or other works shall be completed or the right perfected. In determining the extension, the Department shall give due weight to the considerations described under ORS 539.010(5) and to whether other governmental requirements relating to the project have significantly delayed completion of construction or perfection of the right.

**ORS 539.010(5)** provides in pertinent part that the Water Resources Director, for good cause shown, may extend the time within which the full amount of the water appropriated shall be applied to a beneficial use. This statute instructs the Director to consider: the cost of the appropriation and application of the water to a beneficial purpose; the good faith of the appropriator; the market for water or power to be supplied; the present demands therefore; and the income or use that may be required to provide fair and reasonable returns upon the investment.

**OAR 690-315-0040** provides in pertinent part that the Water Resources Department shall make findings to determine if an extension of time may be approved to complete construction and/or apply water to full beneficial use.

**OAR 690-315-0050(6)** allows the Department, for extensions exceeding five years, to establish checkpoints to determine if diligence is being exercised in the development and perfection of the water use permit. Intervals between checkpoints will not exceed five year periods.

### FINDINGS OF FACT

#### **Background**

- Permit #S-53501 was granted by the Water Resources Department on November 13, 1998. The permit authorizes the appropriation of up to 56.6 af of stored water only from three reservoirs, to be constructed under Permit #R-12570, for Cranberry Operations on 10.6 acres. The permit specified that complete application of water was to be made on or before October 1, 2002.
- 2. The permit holder submitted an "Application for Extension of Time" to the Department on October 16, 2002, requesting the time in which to accomplish beneficial use of water to the full extent under the terms of Permit #S-53501 be extended from October 1, 2002, to October 1, 2012. This is the first extension request for permit # S-53501.

#### Review Criteria (OAR 690-315-0040(1)(2))

As set forth under OAR 690-315-0040(1)(2), the time limits to complete construction or to apply the water to a beneficial use may be extended upon showing of good cause for the untimely completion. This determination shall consider the applicable requirements of ORS 537.230, 537.248<sup>1</sup>, 537.630 and 539.010(5).

#### Other Governmental Requirements IORS 537.230(2)]

3. Delay in the development of this project was caused, in part, by the U.S. Department of Agriculture imposing a 35 percent reduction of cranberry yields beginning September 1, 2001, in an effort to reduce surplus and to help mend the ailing cranberry market.

#### Start of Construction (ORS 537.230)

4. Construction of the water system began within the time specified in the permit, being June 8, 1999.

1

ORS 537.248 applies to reservoir permits only.

#### Financial Investment (ORS 539.010(5))

5. As of October 16, 2002, the permit holder had invested a total of \$65,000 into the project, consisting of 25 percent excavation of reservoirs under Permit #R-12570, installation of water meters and staff gauges, and completion of spillways. An additional \$100,000 investment is anticipated for the completion of this project.

#### Reasonable Diligence and Good Faith of the Appropriator (ORS 537.230(1) and 539.010(5))

Reasonable diligence during the permit period constitutes a continuing test of whether and under what conditions to grant an extension [ORS 537.260, OAR 690-315-0040(3)].

In accordance with OAR 690-315-0040(3), the Department shall consider, but is not limited to, the following factors when determining whether the applicant has demonstrated reasonable diligence in previous performance under the permit:

#### Amount of Construction

- 6. The following construction was completed within the time allowed in the permit or previous extension:
  - a. Construction of the water system began within the time specified in the permit, being June 8, 1999. The work thus far consists of 25 percent excavation of reservoirs under Permit #R-12570, installation of water meters and staff gauges, and completion of spillways.

Beneficial Use of Water

- 7. The following beneficial use was made of the water during the permit or previous extension time limits:
  - a. Since the issuance of Permit #S-53501 on November 13, 1998, approximately 16.0 acre-feet of stored water has been appropriated from the reservoirs that were constructed under permit #R-12570, and applied to 5.0 acres for cranberry operations.
  - b. Delay of full beneficial use of water under Permit #S-53501 was due to a downturn in the cranberry market, the unavailability of cash flow needed to develop the project and a 35 percent reduction in cranberry production imposed by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Compliance with Conditions

- 8. The water right permit holder's conformance with the permit or previous extension conditions.
  - a. The record does not raise concerns about the permit holder's compliance with conditions.
  - b At final proof, the permit holder must demonstrate that the diversion and use of water under Permit #S-53501 complies with the Clean Water Act and utilizes best management practices as identified in the plan developed as specified in the New River Alternative Dispute Resolution Team Agreement on file with the Department. A condition of three storage reservoirs in associated Permit #R-12570 requires installation of weirs upstream and downstream before water use begins (or, a written waiver from the local Watermaster.)

Financial Investments

- 9. Financial investments made toward developing the beneficial water use.
  - As of October 16, 2002, the permit holder had invested approximately 39 percent of the total projected cost for complete development of this project. A total of \$65,000 has been invested into the project, consisting 25 percent excavation of reservoirs under Permit #R-12570, installation of water meters and staff gauges, and completion of spillways. An additional \$100,000 investment is anticipated for the completion of this project.

#### The Market and Present Demands for Water (ORS 539.010(5) and OAR 690-315-0040(4)]

In accordance with OAR 690-315-0040(4), the Department shall consider, but is not limited to, the following factors when determining the market and the present demand for water or power to be supplied:

- 10. The amount of water available to satisfy other affected water rights and scenic waterway flows.
  - a. The permitted points of diversion (the reservoirs constructed under Permit #R-12570), authorized under Permit #S-53501, are not located within or above the designated boundaries of a scenic waterway.

- 11. Special water use designations established since permit issuance, including but not limited to state scenic waterways, federal wild and scenic rivers, serious water management problem areas or water quality limited sources established under 33 U.S.C. 1313(d).
  - a. The permitted points of diversion, authorized under Permit #S-53501, are located within a stream segment that has been identified by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife as a "highest" needs ranking area for streamflow restoration for fish.
  - b. The permitted points of diversion, authorized under Permit #S-53501, are located within the Conner Creek Basin, which has not been designated by Department of Environmental Qulaity as being water quality limited.
  - c. The permitted points of diversion, authorized under Permit #S-53501, are not located within the designated reach of a federal wild and scenic river.
- 12. The habitat needs of sensitive, threatened or endangered species, in consultation with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.
  - a. The permitted points of diversion are located within a designated sensitive, threatened or endangered species area for aquatic species utilizing surface water resources, as identified on the Division 33 map furnished by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.
- 13. Economic investment in the project to date.
  - As of October 16, 2002, the permit holder had invested approximately 39 percent of the total projected cost for complete development of this project. A total of \$65,000 has been invested into the project, consisting of 25 percent excavation of reservoirs under Permit #R-12570, installation of water meters and staff gauges, and completion of spillways. An additional \$100,000 investment is anticipated for the completion of this project.
- 14. Other economic interests dependent on completion of the project.
  - a. None have been identified.

- 15. Other factors relevant to the determination of the market and present demand for water and power.
  - a. None have been identified.

#### Fair Return Upon Investment (ORS 539.010(5))

16. The use of water from the permitted water development will result in reasonable returns against the investment made in the project to date.

#### Duration of Extension (OAR 690-315-0040(1)(c), ORS 539.010(5))

As set forth under OAR 690-315-0040(1)(c), time extensions granted shall be for the reasonable time period necessary to complete construction and application of water to beneficial use.

- 17. As of October 16, 2002, the remaining work to be completed consists of completion of the water system and complete application of water to beneficial use.
- Given the amount of development left to occur, the Department has determined that the permittee's request to have until October 1, 2012, to complete construction of the water system and to have until October 1, 2012, to complete the application of water to beneficial use under the terms of Permit #S-53501 is both reasonable and necessary.

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 1. The applicant is entitled to apply for an extension of time to complete construction and/or completely apply water to the full beneficial use pursuant to ORS 537.230.
- The applicant has submitted a complete extension application form and the fee required by ORS 536.050(1)(k).
- 3. The applicant has pursued perfection of the right in good faith and prosecuted construction with reasonable diligence.
- 4. The Department has considered the requirements of other governmental agencies, the financial investment made, the reasonable diligence and good faith of the appropriator, the market and present demands for water and the

fair return upon the investment, and has determined that the applicant has shown good cause exists for an extension to complete construction and apply water to full beneficial use pursuant to ORS 537.230(2).

- 5. Completion of construction and full application of water to beneficial use can be completed by October 1, 2012.<sup>2</sup>
- 6. In order to ensure future diligence is exercised in the development and perfection of Permit #S-53501, the Department shall establish progress checkpoints in accordance with OAR 690-315-0050(6). (See Item #1 of the "Conditions" section contained in this Proposed Final Order for an Extension of Time.)
