Dear Mr. Pollard:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of August 6, relative to the contemplated assignment of Permit No. 10141 in the name of Edward W. Pollard.

The right represented by this permit has been completed and confirmed by issuance of Certificate No. 10120, and Oregon statutes do not provide for the assignment of a certificate on the theory that under Oregon law, water is appurtenant to the land and a completed water right passes with the land when the property is transferred, no assignment being necessary.

However, if regardless of the above theory, it is desired to assign the certificate in question, an assignment may be made, using a modification of the enclosed form, which is prepared for use in assigning permits, bearing in mind that another certificate cannot be issued.

If an assignment is executed, it may be submitted to this office for recording accompanied by the statutory fee in the amount of \$1.00 for the first 100 words plus 10¢ for each additional 100 words or fraction thereof.

Dear Sir:

In compliance with the request contained in your letter of October 8, I am enclosing an application blank, a four-section plat and a copy of the rules and regulations of the State Engineer.

In making out the application blank you should fill in in ink all the items applicable to your proposed appropriation, paying particular attention to Item 4 under which you should locate the point at which you contemplate taking water from the stream with reference to a section corner, and to Item 8 under which the number of acres to be irrigated in each forty-acre tract should be shown in case the use is for irrigation. If for any other use, the location should be shown.

A map should be prepared on the four-section plat, showing the location of your proposed diversion point, the course of your pipe or ditch, and the location of your place of use and the number of acres irrigated in each forty-acre tract if the use is for irrigation.

For your information, Permit No. 11292 has been issued to W. R. Illick for 7.5 second-feet of water from Perkins Creek for mining.

Dear Sir:

Your application for permit to appropriate one second-foot of water from the right hand fork of Perkins Creek, tributary of Cow Creek, for irrigation of 25 acres for mining has been received and filed as No. 14058. Please find enclosed my receipt No. 13645 covering your remittance of \$14.50 as fees for this application.

Your application does not make it quite clear whether or not you are going to use water for power development. Under paragraph 3 you state that the use is to be irrigation and mining, but under paragraph 10 you have stated that you will develop 7.5 theoretical horsepower. If water is to be used for hydraulic mining only, it is not considered as power and it is not necessary to give this data under paragraph 10. If you are not going to use a water wheel you should strike out the data relative to power under this paragraph.

Your map is not satisfactory because it does not show the section numbers and does not seem to correspond with the descriptions of the diversion point and places of use. I am enclosing a sketch on which I have shown the location of the diversion point as described. You are requested to complete this map by showing in proper relation to this diversion point the creeks, ditch and places of use.

The application and map are being returned to you and will retain priority if resubmitted to this office on or before May 25th.

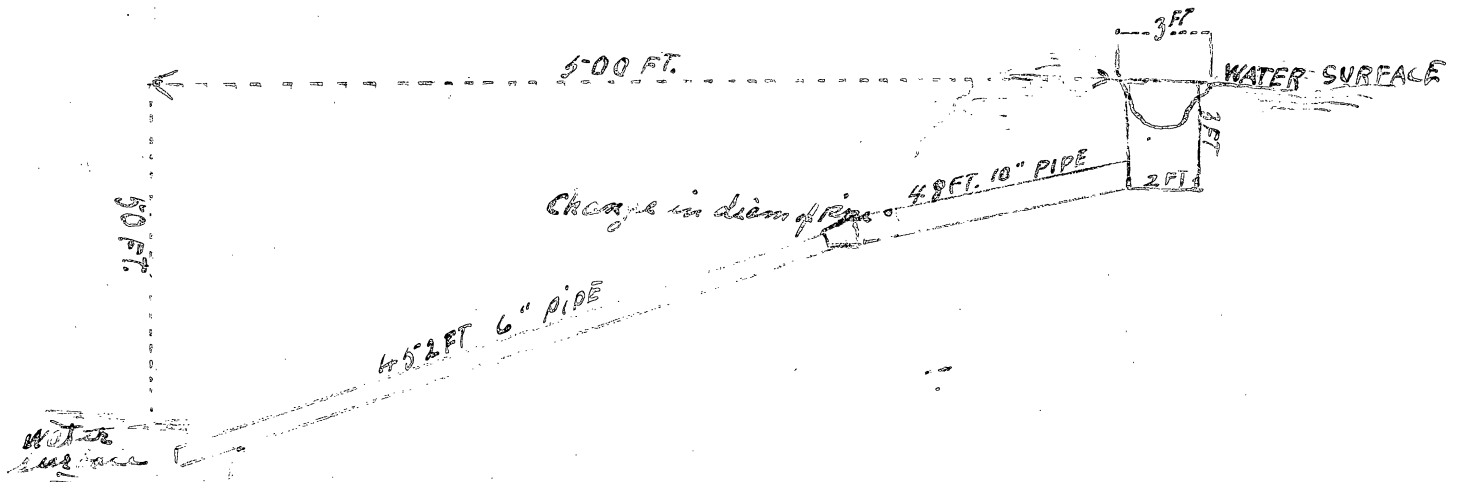
