This is to acknowledge return of your Application 68239 and supporting map.

You have amended your application to designate the source of water as a spring. However, according to the information illustrated on your supporting map, you will be diverting water from the unnamed creek channel. If so, it appears that you should identify the source as the creek rather than the spring. The definition of a spring and the definition of a stream or creek were briefly explained in my earlier correspondence. If there is some confusion as to how you should identify the source of water, it may be best for you to write or call and advise me of a number and time that you can be reached.

You have modified your supporting map to show the northerly house site further west. However, it still appears to be north of the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of the section within the NE 1/4 SW 1/4. In checking our government land survey plats, it appears that your project is entirely within Government Lot 2 (SE 1/4 SW 1/4 and NE 1/4 SW 1/4). If so, this designation for the fractional part of the section may be given as such in Item 3 of the application.

If the point of diversion on the stream is located 180 feet south and 178 feet east from the Southeast Corner of the Southwest Quarter of Section 31 as presently noted in Item 2 of the application, the distances and directions from the reference corner will need to be stated as such on your supporting map. The information presently noted on the map is not clear and does not appear to be in agreement.

I am returning your application and map for completion. The application is endorsed so that in order to retain its priority date it must be received in this office on or before April 5, 1985.

Your Application 68239 describing the proposed use of one-eightieth of a cubic foot of water per second from an unnamed source for domestic supplies for three families, together with the legal descriptions of properties, a description of spring sheet, and a map, has been reviewed.

We will need a little clarification on your project in regards to the proper identity of the source of water, the location of the point of diversion, and place of use of water.

According to the information illustrated on your supporting map, it appears that you intend to divert water from an unnamed stream. If so, the source should be identified as the unnamed stream in Item 1 of your application. However, you did submit a Spring Description Sheet. If you will be diverting water directly from a spring, Item 1 should list the unnamed spring as the source of water and you will need to clearly show and identify this spring on your supporting map. A spring is considered the point or area at which water naturally arises from the ground and any point downstream from a spring would be considered an unnamed stream or creek.

Also, according to your map, the point you intend to divert water from the stream is located some distance South of the reference corner in addition to the distance East. If so, Item 2 on the application should be amended to be in agreement.

You will need to further complete your supporting map by showing the location of the lines between the quarter-quarter sections in the vicinity of the place of use of water. It appears that the Northerly house site you have illustrated on your supporting map is located in the NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 31. If so, Item 3 on your application will need to include this quarter-quarter section as a place of use of water for the domestic use.




If your application is approved, the project described in the application will be subject to the Water Policy Review Board's Basin Program statements, existing minimum flows and demands of prior rights during periods of low water.
