Dear Mr. Stimson:

This will acknowledge return of your application No. 49431 and the three subdivision plats. Your application has been reinstated and given a new date of priority as of March 21, 1973, when it was received.

You have amended item No. 12 on your application to indicate that you may not begin construction work until August 15, 1975. A permit, when issued approving your application, will contain a time limit for beginning construction work, which will be the date one year after the date of issuance of the permit and this date cannot be extended. If you do not intend to begin construction work until August 15, 1975, your application may have been submitted prematurely.

We can withhold action for a time towards issuance of the permit. However, if the application was actually submitted prematurely as indicated in item No. 12 of your application, you may request that your application No. 49431 be withdrawn. A new application could be submitted in the future describing your proposed project.

The permit, when issued, will also contain time limits for completion of construction and for completely applying the water to the intended use. The time limits for completion of construction work will be about two years after the date of issuance of a permit and the date for completely applying the water will be about three years after the date of issuance of the permit. The time limits for completion of construction for complete application of water may be extended by the State Engineer providing reasonable diligence is shown in the prosecution of work and providing a substantial beginning of construction work is made in the first year after the permit is issued.

We will hold action on your application for a reasonable length of time pending your reply.

Dear Mr. Stimson:

This will acknowledge your application for a permit to appropriate 0.04 cubic foot of water per second from the North Umpqua River for the irrigation of an unspecified number of acres and domestic use for two families, being 0.02 cubic foot of water per second for irrigation and 0.02 cubic foot of water per second for domestic use. Also acknowledged are the three prints of Eagle Point Estates subdivision, a drawing showing lots 29 and 28 and fees in the amount of 30.00 for which our receipt number 29560 is enclosed. Your application has been filed and numbered 49431.

The point of diversion must be located in item No. 4 by distances North or South and East or West from a government survey corner or a lot corner of the subdivision. It is necessary to further locate the point of diversion in the latter part of item No. 4 with respect to the proper quarter-quarter section. According to the prints of the subdivision submitted, your point of diversion may be located within the SW_{4}^{1} NW_{4}^{1} of Section 19. If so, this information should be given in the latter part of item No. 4 instead of, "Eagle Point Estates."

The number of acres you intend to irrigate and domestic use must be listed in item No. 8 with respect to the proper quarter-quarter, section, township and range. According to your map, the place of use of water may be within the $SW_{\overline{k}}^{1} NW_{\overline{k}}^{1}$ of Section 19, Township 26 South, Range 4 West, W.M. If you agree, this information should be given in item No. 8 along with listing the number of acres to be irrigated and domestic use.

The distances from the reference corner to the point of diversion must also be shown on the map to be in agreement with the information to be supplied in item No. 4 on the application.
