SUBJECT: Tigert Complaint--Bear Creek

Reference is made to my receipt of your 11-27-89 memo today and our subsequent phone conversation regarding the Tigert complaint.

I have today contacted Mrs. Tigert by phone.

The Tigert household is authorized to divert 0.005 cfs for in house domestic use from a spring which I refer to as the Tigert Spring, located on property owned by Alan Lawrence. Lawrence is authorized use of water from the spring under the terms of permit # 45896. Copies of permit abstracts are attached.

On August 16, after receiving a complaint from Mrs. Tigert, I made arrangements to meet with both her and Mr. Lawrence at the spring. My intent in meeting with both parties was an attempt to allow them to establish a dialogue on the use of water from the spring and perhaps mutually cooperate in the development of a more efficient intake system that would be mutually beneficial. My observations during that inspection were as follows:

1. an estimated several thousand gallons per day of water was available from the spring,
2. the Tigert intake is a syphon intake, and
3. the Lawrence intake was located away from and down gradient from the Tigert intake.

At the time of my observation, water was seeping past both the Tigert and the Lawrence diversion and forming a small stream. My observations were made on a day that Mrs. Tigert claimed to be out of water. The conclusions that I reached based on my observations were that:

1. ample water was then available for Mrs. Tigert's in house domestic use and that the efficiency of her system could be enormously improved by:
 - a. installation of a rudimentary collection system (i.e., small diameter, flexible perf pipe),
 - b. replace the "hole in the hillside" spring basin with a properly constructed spring box or holding tank, and
 - c. make the simple intake change from a syphon system to a more appropriate gravity feed system.
2. there was no interference to the Tigert diversion from the Lawrence diversion.

During my inspection, I went into sufficient detail regarding the above suggestions so that Mrs. Tigert understood the difference between an efficient collection and distribution system and the disadvantages of her existing system.

On that occasion and several other occasions I also explained the limits of protection afforded by her water right. Mrs. Tigert was made to understand that she had senior rights to the spring and that I would prevent Mr. Lawrence from interfering with that right. She was also made to understand that it is her responsibility to get the water from the spring to her house.

Regarding Mrs. Tigert's inability to contact this office, the office is regularly staffed 40 hours per week and when no one is in the office an answering device will accept messages.

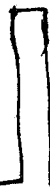
Coincidentally, the morning of November 20, Alan Lawrence called to inform me that "someone" had shut the gate valve off to his intake. I hope that that action was not taken as a result of conversations with this department.

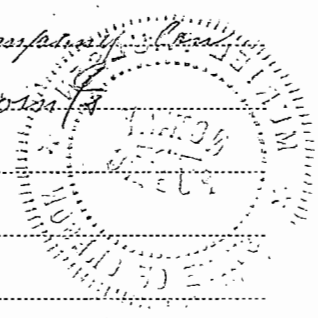

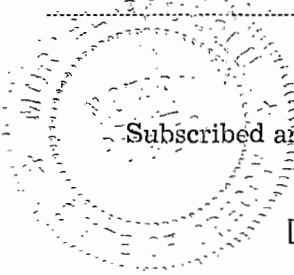

This will acknowledge the return of your application number 48403 and map. Also acknowledged is the superseding application and map.

Will you please review the information given in Item Number 4. If the spring you are referring to is the same spring as shown on the final proof survey map I sent to you with my letter of December 7, 1971, the reference corner to be given in Item Number 4 should be designated as the north quarter corner of Section 27 instead of the northeast corner of Section 27 as noted. Also, if you agree with the location of the spring as shown on the final proof survey map, the phrase "this footage is more or less" should be deleted from Item Number 4.

Your map is still not clear in describing your proposed project. The location of the house to be served water under this filing must be shown and designated, the spring should be designated as such, the location of the lands to be irrigated should be shown by hatchuring or shading in some manner, along with noting the number of acres to be irrigated, and the north quarter corner of Section 27 must be designated on the map.

I am returning your application and map for correction and completion. The application is endorsed so that in order to retain its priority date, it must be returned to this office on or before March 7, 1972.



Dear Mr. Longanecker:

This will acknowledge receipt of an application for extension of the time limit to complete construction under your permit No. 29536 and the fee of \$2 for which our receipt No. 1449 is enclosed.

I do not understand your application for extension of the time limit to complete construction when along with it you submitted a notice of complete application of water indicating that full use of the water under the permit was made by June 1, 1964. 

This will acknowledge your application for a permit to appropriate 0.2325 cubic foot of water per second from Bear Creek and a spring for the irrigation of 18.6 acres and domestic use, the accompanying two tracings, and fees in the sum of \$10 for which our receipt numbered 465 is enclosed.

Your application has been examined and filed under file number 39687. Before it may be considered for approval by issuance of a permit, additional recording fees will be required in the sum of \$15, being \$10 for domestic use and \$5 for irrigation.
