Findings of Fact

- 1. On January 25, 2016, the Department received an affidavit from Bruce Walport and Judith A. Walport, 330 Slagle Creek Rd., Grants Pass, OR 97527, the owner of lands and the water right appurtenant as evidenced by water right Certificate 10740.
- 2. Water Right Certificate 10740 allows the use of 0.22 cubic foot per second (CFS), from Slagle Creek, for irrigation of 17.3 acres. The priority date is March 12, 1930.
- 3. The affiant requests a portion of the water right Certificate 10740 be diminished from a right for primary irrigation to supplemental irrigation.
- 3. The affidavit requests the following lands be diminished from primary irrigation to supplemental irrigation:

Conclusions of Law

The Director of the Water Resources Department concludes the portion of the right evidenced by Certificate 10740 has been diminished in accordance with the provisions of ORS 540.621 and shall be cancelled.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED

- 1. Certificate 10740 is cancelled.
- 2. A portion of the water right for the use of 0.22 CFS for primary irrigation on 17.3 acres, as described by Certificate 10740, is diminished from a right for primary irrigation to a right for supplemental irrigation.
- 3. The Department shall issue water right Certificate 93102, a new and superseding certificate, to describe the remainder of the irrigation water right and the diminution of the portions to supplemental irrigation.

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. A petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

MRS. NORA NEATHAMER ROGUE RIVER, OR 97537

confirms the right to the use of waters of SLAGLE CREEK, a tributary of BIG APPLEGATE RIVER, for PRIMARY IRRIGATION of 8.3 ACRES and SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION of 9.0 ACRES.

The date of priority is MARCH 12, 1930. The amount of water to which this right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.22 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS).

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one CFS per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

This certificate describes that portion of the water right modified by provisions of an order recorded at Special Order Volume 104, Page 866, diminishing a portion of the right evidenced by Certificate 10740. This certificate supersedes water right Certificate 10740.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484 and ORS 536.075. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 183.484, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate within three months after issuance of the certificate.



Rogue River Mrs. Nora Neathamer State of Oregon , has made proof to the satisfaction of the State Engineer of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of Slagle Creek, tributary of Big Applegate River, a tributary of Rogue River for the purpose of

Irrigation

under Permit No. 9576 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from March 12, 1930;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.22 cubic foot per second or its equivalent in case of rotation. The point of diversion is located in the NEANE and NWANEA, Section 6, Township 38 South, Range 4 West, W. M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper State officer.







Dear Sir:-

I am in receipt of your letter of March 27 referring to L. A. Wilcox matter and copy of letter you wrote him.

This matter is of long standing and we have tried to aid Mr. Wilcox to find out if he had a water right on this land. Mr. Neidermeyer, who formerly owned this land was in last year with Mr. Wilcox and we made a plat of all the water rights, but could find no water right on the land Mr. Neidermeyer claimed. However, last fall Assistant Cummings and Darby went out and made a survey of the Wilcox place. We have junted the records all through and can find that there is any water right issued on the land, and Mr. Wilcox was to make application for same. Meanwhile Mrs. Nora Neathammer (not Laura as you have in your letter), who owns the adjoining place, came in and made preliminary application for water on her place. I told her that we would send the preliminary application in but could not complete the same without a survey as there was a conflict with decreed rights. She instructed me to make the survey as soon as possible, send the application in and to advise her what extra fees would be necessary and she would send the amount which up to the present time she has not done.

Mr. Wilcox did not come in to complete his application. His application is lying on the table waiting for the fee. We have done everything that we could do for him and we could not avoid the other application going in first.

If the statements made in your letter of March 24th are true it would seem that your situation is unfortunate because the application of Mrs. Laura Neatheimer has been filed and its priority established. I am unable to express an opinion as to who is responsible for the delay in submitting your application, but in any case the delay has probably resulted in the necessity of fixing a later priority for your right and there would seem to be no way in which the earlier priority of the Neatheimer application could be set aside.

The preparation of applications is not an official duty of the watermaster and in such work he is not acting as a representative of the State Engineer any more than any other engineer would be. The priority of a water right is the date when the application is filed in this office. If you complied with the requirements necessary to complete your application and your request for this work was made to Mr. Cumnings before the request of the other applicant it would seen of course that Mr. Cumnings should have submitted your application first.

I am sending him a copy of your letter and also a carbon copy of this letter and will ask him for an explanation of his action.
