Water will be pumped from the POD using an intake placed in the reservoir. The water will be forwarded by a pipeline to the place of use. A permit has been secured from Oregon Department of Transportation for the permanent installation of a pipeline under the Bellevue-Hopewell Highway. The pipeline will include a flowmeter.

## **B.** Application Method

What equipment and method of application will be used? (e.g., drip, wheel line, high-pressure sprinkler) Water will be applied using drip lines, wheel lines, low pressure sprinklers, high pressure sprinklers, linear irrigation equipment and/or hand lines, depending on the crop.

## C. Conservation

Please describe why the amount of water requested is needed and measures you propose to: prevent waste; measure the amount of water diverted; prevent damage to public uses of affected surface waters.

The stored water will be used to promote the growth of crops needing minimal irrigation such as grass seed, small grains and red clover. For example, applying several inches of irrigation water to grass seed for approximately 2 weeks in the Willamette Valley during the irrigation season significantly increases crop yields. Given the limited volume of water stored in the reservoir, crops will be rotated selectively so that

approximately 1/5<sup>th</sup> of the place of use will need to be irrigated each year so that the full place of use is irrigated once every 5 years. Areas that will not be irrigated in a specific year will be fallowed or be used to grow crops that do not need to be irrigated. See additional information in the Section 10 Remarks.

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## **SECTION 10: REMARKS**

Use this space to clarify any information you have provided in the application. (*Attach additional sheets if necessary*). Our experience in farming this area for decades indicates 2 or 3 inches of water would significantly improve the yields of the crops we now typically grow without irrigation. Without irrigation water, we must plant the crops at times when it is forecasted that there will be a sufficient quantity of spring or fall rain.

As indicated in Section 6c, we plan to rotate the irrigation around the proposed place of use and irrigate a specific area at least once every 4 to 5 years. This rotation will be compatible with our farming practices because we regularly rotate crops to maintain and enhance the health of our fields.

Using a 4 to 5-year cycle for irrigation, the area selected for irrigation each year could receive 4 to 5 inches/acre of water as indicated by the calculations below. We believe this plan is conservative and sustainable because it provides more than the 2 to 3 inches of irrigation described above that our crops typically need to experience beneficial growth. In addition, we recognize that in some years the reservoir may not completely fill and we may end up with less than the indicated inches being available for irrigation that year. Furthermore, we could irrigate more than the projected acres in a year if the crop demand is less than 4 to 5 inches, recognizing that the maximum amount of water that could be used in any year is 25.0 acre-feet.

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## Water-Use Permit Application Processing

## 1. Completeness Determination

The Department evaluates whether the application and accompanying map contain all of the information required under OAR 690-310-0040 and OAR 690-310-0050. The Department also determines whether the proposed use is prohibited by statute. If the Department determines that the application is incomplete, all fees have not been paid, or the use is prohibited by statute, the application and all fees submitted are returned to the applicant.

### 2. Initial Review

The Department reviews the application to determine whether water is available during the period requested, whether the proposed use is restricted or limited by rule or statute, and whether other issues may preclude approval of or restrict the proposed use. An Initial Review (IR) containing preliminary determinations is mailed to the applicant. The applicant has 14 days from the mailing date to withdraw the application from further processing and receive a refund of all fees paid minus \$260. The applicant may put the application on hold for up to 180 days and may request additional time if necessary.

### 3. Public Notice

Within 7 days of the mailing of the initial review, the Department gives <u>public notice</u> of the application in the weekly notice published by the Department at <u>www.oregon.gov/owrd</u>. The public comment period is 30 days from publication in the weekly notice.

### 4. Proposed Final Order Issued

The Department reviews any comments received, including comments from other state agencies related to the protection of sensitive, threatened or endangered fish species. Within 60 days of completion of the IR, the Department issues a Proposed Final Order (PFO) explaining the proposed decision to deny or approve the application. A PFO proposing approval of an application will include a draft permit, and may request additional information or outstanding fees required prior to permit issuance.

## 5. Public Notice

Within 7 days of issuing the PFO, the Department gives public notice in the weekly notice. Notice includes information about the application and the PFO. Protest must be received by the Department within 45 days after publication of the PFO in the weekly notice. Anyone may file a protest. The protest filing fee is \$410.00 for the applicant and \$810.00 for non-applicants. Protests are filed on approximately 10 percent of Proposed Final Orders. If a protest is filed the Department will attempt to settle the protest but will schedule a contested case hearing if necessary.

## 6. Final Order Issued

If no protests are filed, the Department can issue a Final Order within 60 days of the close of the period for receiving protest. If the application is approved, a permit is issued. The permit specifies the details of the authorized use and any terms, limitations or conditions that the Department deems appropriate

## ALL CHECKED (X) PROVISIONS APPLY

1. All equipment shall be parked off the right-of-way or in areas acceptable to the District Manager or representative.

- 2. If a highway sign is impacted during construction contact Steve Barner, ODOT Sign Coordinator at 503-986-2890, cell 503-931-0986 before end of workday.
- 3. The Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) has the responsibility to manage physical custody of "personal property" that appears to have been abandoned within the ODOT right of way. "Personal property" for this purpose includes items that are reasonably recognized as belonging to individual persons and that have apparent utility. This may include books, photographs, personal documents such as identification and social security cards, camping equipment, bicycles, clothing, or miscellaneous junk (as defined in ORS 377.605). If during construction personal property is found and needs to be removed from the work area, ODOT must be contacted (refer to the contact listed on page one of this permit). ODOT will follow state guidelines to notify, schedule and remove the personal property that may appear to be forfeited, voluntarily abandoned and/or unclaimed. This process may take 14-30 days.
- Any damage to ADA facilities within the ODOT right of way MUST be replaced to the current ODOT and ADA standards including a 7.5% design running slope and 1.5% design cross slope. If upon post construction inspection it is found that the running slope exceeds 8.3% or cross slope exceeds 2.0% the applicant will be required to remove and reconstruct the driveway, sidewalk or curb to standards.
- 5. A minimum cover of 48" is required for all high impact utilities (i.e. electrical, gas, buried cable and vaults).
- 6. Encasement of pressurized PVC water/sewer carrier pipe(s) under pavement is required. Casing shall be Ductile-iron or steel pipe with welded joints OR Applicant shall provide proof that encasement of the facility is unnecessary to maintaining the structural integrity of the roadway (documentation submitted shall be stamped by a registered Structural Engineer). The annular space between the carrier pipe and casing is to be filled with cement slurry (see attached drawing RD308).
- ☑ 7. All Local Agency or Consultant inspectors must be licensed and certified for electrical installations. Certification is a requirement for inspection of electrical installations on the State Highway System or installations ODOT will maintain by agreement. Electrical installations include, but are not limited to, traffic signals, illumination, variable message signs, road and weather information systems, video camera systems, and other intelligent transportation systems. ODOT certified electricians must be notified of any work being accomplished on ODOT controlled electrical installations.
- **Working within city limits:** If working within city limits the "Local Government Official Signature" (At the bottom of application form 734-3457) is required.
- 9. All Borings under state highway must have a minimum of 48" of overlay. All PVC will be encased in a metal pipe.
- 10. The District Manager reserves the right to administer and/or amend requirements that in his/her opinion are necessary for public safety and/or betterment of the highway system.
- 11. Curb and Sidewalk removal and replacement:

Gutter Bar Cuts shall be full depth cuts.

Joints shall be pinned to new sidewalk and curb per ODOT Standards.

Ramps and sidewalks to be constructed/repaired in full panel sections (seem to seam) and meet ODOT and City Standards. If the panel is partially removed, cracked or damaged in any way, panel is to be completely removed prior to replacement.

Sidewalk to be constructed/repaired as per Oregon Standard Drawing RD720. 4" minimum aggregate base

required.

Ramp to be constructed/repaired as per ODOT Standard Drawing RD725. 4" minimum aggregate base required.

If construction does not adhere to Oregon Standard Drawings, Drawings must be submitted for ODOT approval.

When construction activities block or interfere with normal pedestrian routing, provide safe passage for pedestrians either through the construction, or rerouted around the construction, utilizing ODOT Standard Drawing TM844 and the requirements of the 2015 Oregon Standard Specifications for Construction (Brown Book), page 141, subsection 00220.02, 8th bulleted item with reference to the subsequent bulleted items. When construction activities block or interfere with shoulders or bike Lanes, install a 48 inch "BICYCLES ON ROADWAY" sign in advance of each shoulder or bike lane closure

Applicant shall install the new driveways, sidewalk, curb, pedestrian ramps, truncated domes and turning spaces, according to current ODOT and ADA standards including a 7.5% design running slope, 1.5% design cross slope, and ramp wings at <10% slope. If upon post construction inspection it is found that the running slope exceeds 8.3% or cross slope exceeds 2.0%, or ramp wings exceed 10% the applicant will be required to remove and reconstruct the facility to meet standards
