Surface Water - Page 5 Rev. 06-18 Water will be applied using a drip irrigation system. The Applicant will only irrigate when necessary to promote ideal fruit production. The use of stored water will be measured if required by OWRD. Construction is not anticipated to occur in riparian or aquatic environments, and no discharge to surface water is contemplated. No adverse effects to public uses of surface waters are anticipated.

### **SECTION 10: REMARKS**

Certificates 36430 and 47644, also held by the Applicant, authorize the use of stored water from Crowe Reservoirs No. 1 and 2 for irrigation of a portion of the proposed place of use. The Applicant is proposing to voluntarily cancel these two certificates concurrent with issuance of a final order approving this application. If a final order approving this application is not issued, this voluntary cancellation is of no further force or effect.

A transfer application is being filed concurrently proposing to change the place of use for a portion of the Applicant's Certificate 36432 to the 15.4 acres shown as supplemental irrigation on the map in Attachment C. The total volume of stored water to be used would not exceed 25.5 acre-feet under a permit issued for this application in combination with the pending transfer. The Applicant is requesting that issuance of this permit occur concurrently with the issuance of a final order approving the transfer of Certificate 36432.

The Applicant is requesting the use of up to 25.5 acre-feet of stored water for primary irrigation of 192.4 acres and supplemental irrigation of 15.4 acres. Although the requested volume is less than the standard duty of 2.5 acre-feet per acre, the Applicant will be able to put water to beneficial use on the entire place of use because the crop to be irrigated is grapes, which require less water than many other crops, and because the Applicant will use an efficient drip irrigation system.

GSI Water Solutions, Inc. (GSI), is submitting the enclosed application for a permit to use stored water on behalf of Crowe Farms, LLC. The applicant is requesting a permit to use up to 25.5 acre-feet of stored water from Crowe Reservoirs No. 1 and 2 for primary irrigation of 192.4 acres and supplemental irrigation of 15.4 acres. Crowe Farms, LLC is the owner of the two reservoirs and the holder of Certificates 36429, 36431, and 47643, which authorize the storage of a combined total of up to 25.5 acre-feet of water in the two reservoirs.

Certificates 36430 and 47644, also held by Crowe Farms, authorize the use of stored water from the two reservoirs for irrigation of a portion of the proposed place of use. The applicant is proposing to voluntarily cancel these two certificates concurrently with issuance of a final order approving this application.

Crowe Farms also holds Certificate 36432, which authorizes the use of live flow and stored water from Crowe Reservoir No 2. The Applicant has filed a transfer application to change the place of use for a portion of this certificate. The supplemental irrigation in this permit application overlaps with the transfer. The total volume of stored water to be used under this application in combination with the pending transfer would not exceed a total of 25.5 acre-feet. The applicant requests that issuance of a permit to use stored water occur concurrently with the issuance of a final order for the transfer of Certificate 36432.

The permit application fee will be mailed to OWRD after we receive the temporary number for this application. The fee was calculated as follows:
