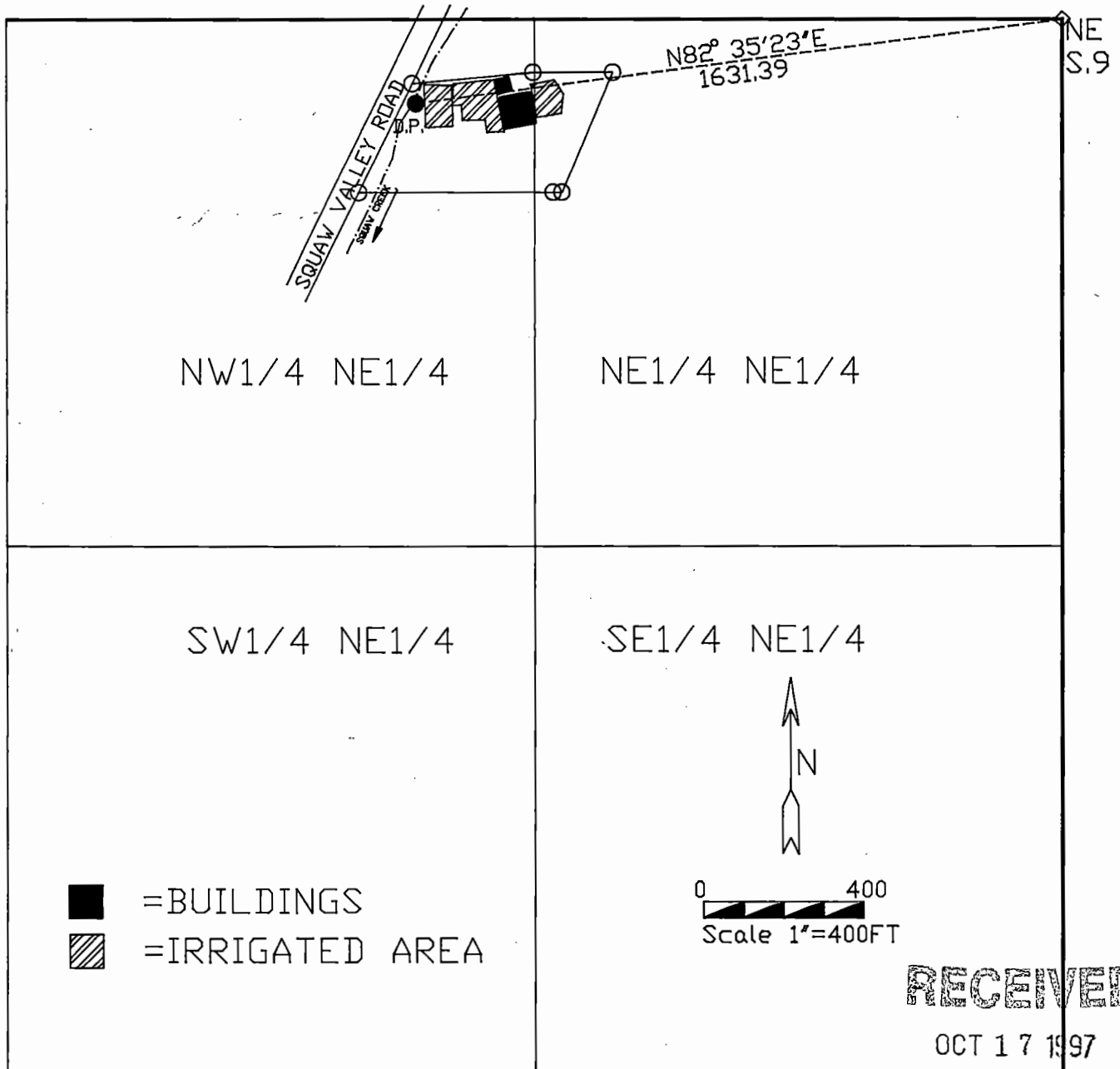

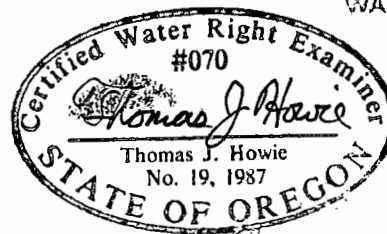

NARRATIVE: On August 2, 1997 I met with Donald and Olive Wooldridge on the subject property. Mr Wooldridge showed me the diversion development and the water system he installed. There was no significant variation from the permit although the acreage was less than allowed on the permit.

SOURCE: The source is Squaw Creek a tributary of the Rogue River. At the time of this investigation the creek averaged eight feet wide and 4 inches deep. The flow was generally southerly with an average drop of 3%. The flow in the center of the channel was approximately 1 foot per second. The use of the source is for lawn and garden area as well as fruit trees and ornamentals spread throughout the subject property.

DIVERSION: The diversion point consists of a 1 1/2" PVC pipe with a screen placed in a natural pool of the stream. The pipe lifts 8 feet vertically to the pump which is located on the stream bank.

PUMP: The pump is a 1 HP Teel single stage centrifugal type pump. Model # 2P006 and 3600 RPM. The pump has a 1 1/2" intake and discharge.

PIPE: The waterlines are buried 1 1/2" PVC lines. These lines run to six 3/4" standpipes with standard 3/4" garden faucets. These standpipes are spread throughout the subject property. The irrigated areas are reached from these standpipes with commercial garden hoses of various lengths and materials.

HEADS: The sprinklers present were of various lawn and garden variety. Garden hose nozzles are also used for hand watering various ornamentals. I measured the flow of two of the standpipes and the average was 5 GPM for each.

USE: The permitted use is for irrigation of 1 acre and livestock. At the time of this investigation there is no garden in or livestock present. The owner is now renting the property and has the parcel for sale. There is evidence that a garden was in last year. There are numerous fruit trees on the property and ornamentals which look as though they have been irrigated this year. The owner says that the renter has not been consistent about watering. The area under irrigation at the time of this investigation was .5 acres.

LIFT: The elevation change from the diversion point to the average elevation of the place of use is approximately 15 feet. This is measured by trigonometric methods.

SURVEY TIE: The survey tie was made by tying to two found property corners of the subject property and using previous survey records and the deeded tie to the NE section corner of section 9. The survey was performed using a Topcon GTS 2 B Semi total station. Basis of bearing is the south line of the parcel.

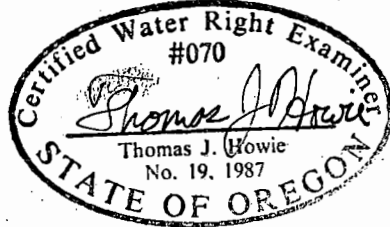
SPECIAL CONDITIONS: The fish screen on the pump was checked and approved by the ODFW and a copy of the approving letter is attached.



Requirements
for Small Pump Screens

WATER RESOURCES DEPT.
SALEM, OREGON

In accordance with ORS 469.371, 498.248, and other rules, pump screens must be installed on all pumps where the possibility of game fish ingestion exists. Technical requirements for pump screens of less than 0.5 cfs (225 gpm) are summarized in simplified form below:

1 Screen Construction & Materials:

- 1.1 The minimum amount of wetted (submerged) screen surface area required is 1 square inch of screen for each gallon per minute (gpm) of flow. In terms of cubic feet per second (cfs), 3 square feet of screen area are required for cfs). The screen shall be designed so as to uniformly admit water through it, without a disproportionate amount of the water coming through any localized portion of the screen.
- 1.2 The screen mesh shall have 1/8" maximum size holes or slots, measured in their smallest dimension. There is no restriction on the length of slits or slots.
- 1.3 The screen surface shall have a minimum of 40% open area.
- 1.4 The screen material may be wire mesh, perforated plate, or other suitable material.
- 1.5 Any gaps in the screen assembly through which fish might pass shall not exceed 1/8".
- 1.6 There shall be no sharp edges or surfaces exposed which could injure fish. Sharp edges are herein defined as edges of less than .010 inches radius.
- 1.7 Durable material (plastic, stainless steel, brass, etc) is recommended to ensure continued usefulness and ease of maintenance.

2 Larger Screens: For all other screens (i.e. dams, gravity diversions), and for all pump screens larger than 0.5 cfs, contact the ODFW Fish Passage Program at 229-5410 x466 for further information.

3 Self-Certification: ODFW does not usually inspect small pump screens of less than 225 gpm (0.5 cfs), but simply furnishes the above screening information to the water right applicant.

After required fish screening has been installed, sign the certification below and present this letter to the OREGON WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT, 158 12th St, NE, Salem, OR, 97310 as evidence of meeting ODFW screening requirements.

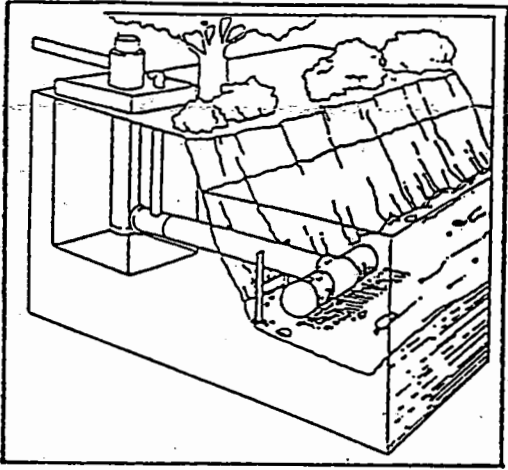

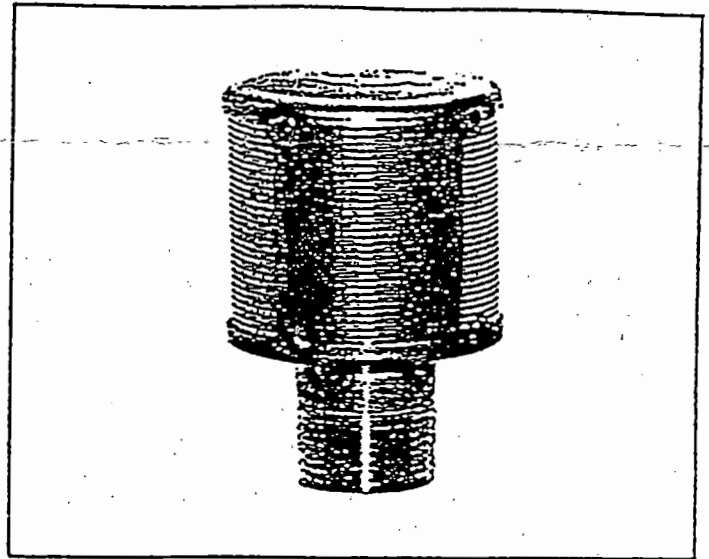

Measurement recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The Director may require the permittee to install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. If the Director notifies the permittee to install a meter or other measuring device, the permittee shall install such device within the period stated in the notice. Such installation period shall not be less than 90 days unless special circumstances warrant a shorter installation period.

Once installed, the permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order and shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative measuring procedures for review and approval.

- B. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The permittee shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion. The permittee shall also install a fishway at the obstruction that will provide adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish. The required screens and fishways are to be in place, functional, and approved by Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife before diversion of any water.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.



Application History

On May 18, 1995, DONALD AND OLIVE WOOLDRIDGE submitted an application to the Department for a water use permit. The Department issued a Proposed Final Order on November 7, 1995. The protest period closed December 22, 1995, and no protest was filed.

An interagency team reviewed this proposed use for potential adverse impacts on declining fish populations. This team consisted of representatives from the Oregon Departments of Water Resources (WRD), Environmental Quality, Fish and Wildlife (DFW), and Agriculture. WRD and DFW representatives included both technical and field staff. The interagency team recommended that additional limitations or conditions of use be imposed on this application as follows:

The permittee shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion. The permittee shall also install a fishway at the obstruction that will provide adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish. The required screens and fishways are to be in place, functional, and approved by Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife before diversion of any water.


The proposed use would not impair or be detrimental to the public interest, but the Department's continuing evaluation reveals that the Proposed Final Order requires modification to add the condition listed above.

Order

Upon payment of outstanding permit recording fees, Application S-80343 shall be approved as modified above and as conditioned in the attached draft permit.

Permit recording fees are required in the amount of \$ 100.00. Said fees are due and payable no later than 60 days from the date of this Final Order. Failure to pay the required permit recording fees within 60 days from the date of this Final Order will result in the proposed rejection of Application S-80343. limited by the conditions set forth in the permit.

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



FINDINGS OF FACT

Water Use Request

1. Donald and Olive Wooldridge requested use of 0.030 Cubic foot per second of water for Irrigation of 1.0 acre and Livestock use from Squaw Creek, a tributary of Rogue River within the Rogue Basin.
2. The area of proposed use is in Curry County within Section 9, Township 36 South, Range 14 West, W.M.
3. The water delivery system is described by the applicant as follows: A 1 horsepower electric pump will divert water from Squaw Creek into a pipeline for delivery to the proposed uses.
4. The request was made in Application S-80343 which was received by the Water Resources Department on May 18, 1995.

Affected Waters

1. Squaw Creek, a tributary of Rogue River is not within or above a State Scenic Waterway.
2. ODFW has not informed the Department of the presence of game fish at the described point of diversion.
3. There are no senior water rights on Squaw Creek, a tributary of Rogue River but there are on downstream waters.

Department Actions

1. The application was determined to be complete and not defective.
2. A Initial Review of the application was completed and a report of the results of that review was mailed to the applicant on August 21, 1995.

3. The Initial Review determined:
 - a. Irrigation of 1.0 acres and Livestock is allowed under the Rogue Basin Program.
 - b. The use is not prohibited by Statute.
 - c. Water is available for further appropriation (at an 80 percent exceedance probability) for the period March 1 through October 31 for Irrigation and Year round for Livestock.
 - d. The use would not injure existing water rights.
4. The report of Initial Review listed these determinations and disclosed a number of conditions and restrictions that would likely be included in the permit if issued. These conditions and restrictions are listed in the attached draft permit.
5. The applicant did not notify the Department to stop processing this application within 14 days after the report was mailed as provided in ORS 537.150(5).
6. The Department proceeded with processing the application and on September 5, 1995 published notice of the application in its weekly Public Notice of Water Rights.
7. At the close of the 30 day comment period provided in ORS 537.150(7), the Department had not received comments on the application.

Assessment

1. In proceeding with evaluation of Application S-80343, the following criteria were found to be relevant by the Department.
 - a. The Rogue Basin Program (OAR Chapter 690, Division 515
 - b. The Curry County Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Ordinance
 - c. The amount of water available in Squaw Creek, a tributary of Rogue River
 - d. The established rate and duty for the proposed use
 - e. Pending, senior applications and existing water rights of record
 - f. Comments received

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


1. Based upon continued evaluation, the Department finds the determinations of the Initial Review remain valid.
2. Based on comments and data received, the Department has determined that the proposed use can be allowed as conditioned.
3. The period of allowed use is Irrigation March 1 through October 31, and Livestock use Year Round.

4. The Department finds that 0.03 cfs being 0.025 cfs for irrigation and 0.005 cfs for Livestock would be necessary for the proposed use. The amount of water requested, 0.030 cfs is allowable.
5. Curry County Planning Department staff completed the Department's Land Use Information Form and indicated thereon that the land use associated with the proposed use is compatible with the Curry County Comprehensive Land Use Plan.
6. The proposed use would not conflict with existing water rights, and, if exercised in accordance with law, rule, and the proposed conditions would not result in injury to existing water users.
7. The proposed use complies with all other rules of the Commission.
8. Pursuant to Chapter 416, Oregon laws, 1995, enacted by the 68th Oregon Legislative Assembly, and given the findings listed above, a rebuttable presumption has been established that the use will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest if exercised in the manner described in the attached draft permit.
9. Therefore, the proposed use, as conditioned, and described in the attached draft permit, would not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.



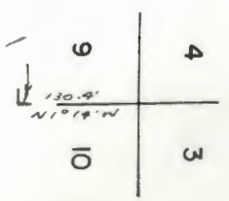

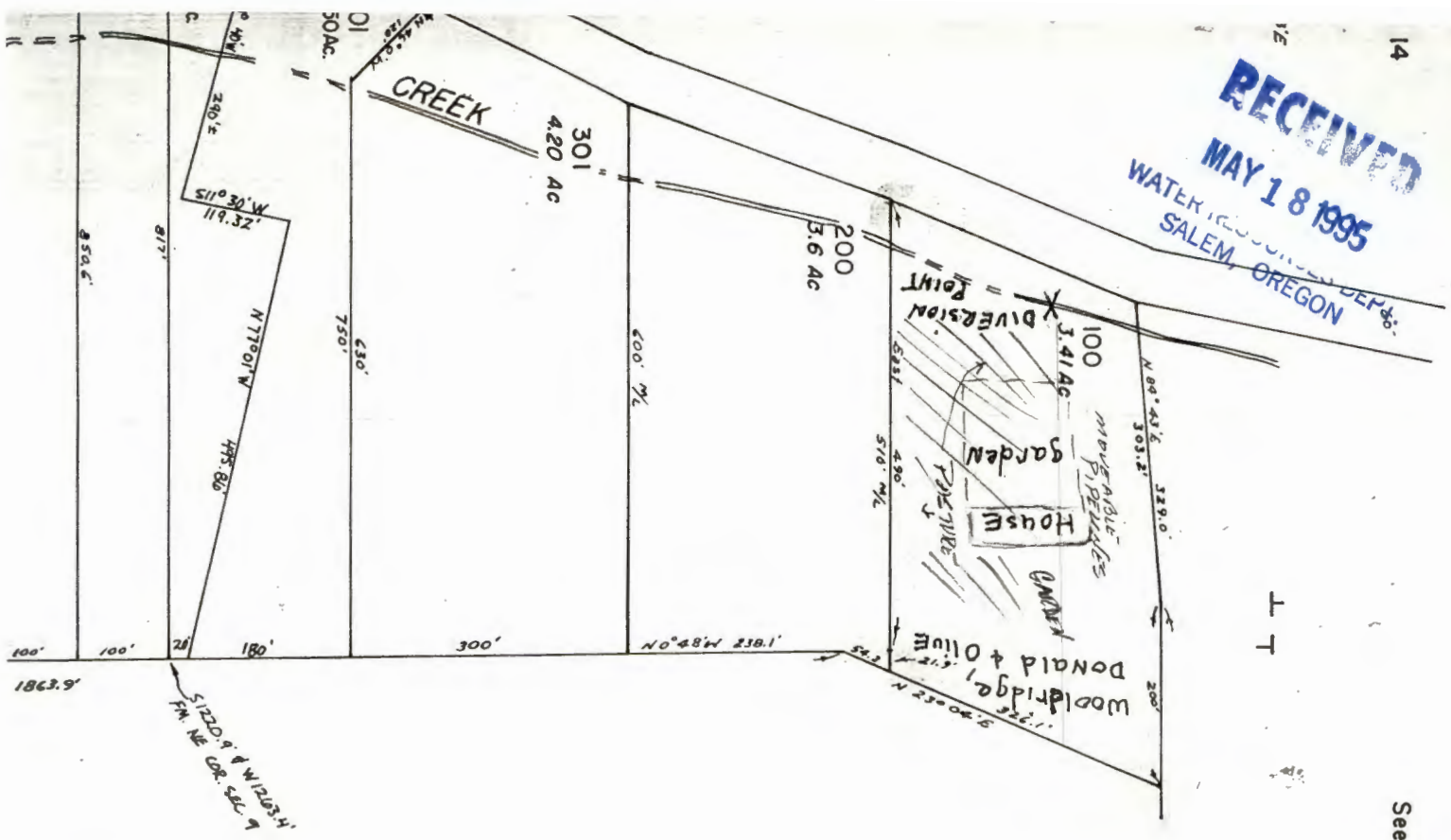

We have received your application(s) for a water use permit along with your supporting data, documentation, and fees. A receipt is enclosed here unless you were previously issued one. Your application has been assigned the above referenced file number. Please refer to this number whenever you contact us about your application.

Even though your application has been received, filed and assigned an application reference number, no authorization has been granted to develop your water use. The filing of an application does not create a water right. Water may not be used until a water right permit has been issued by the Department.

After an application has been accepted for filing, public notification of the application is made, followed by the mandatory 30-day comment period. Thereafter, applications can be considered for processing as time allows.

At present the Water Resources Department has a backlog of several thousand applications for water use permits which has delayed our application processing time. In general, applications are processed in the order in which they are received. However, Department staff work through Oregon's 18 river basins on a rotation basis often completing work on all applications within a single basin, then proceeding to the next basin.

The processing of an application does not guarantee that a water right permit will be issued. Each application must undergo specialized analysis called a technical review and a public interest review. Until your application is reviewed, it is not possible to determine whether your particular proposed water use will be recommended for a permit.

The Water Resources Commission is considering the adoption of rules to protect stream flows for fish species. This action is being contemplated in response to current and future Endangered Species Act fish listings, including many runs of salmon, steelhead and resident fish throughout the state.



REFERENCE: File(s) - S-80343

The proposed rules, if adopted, could limit the issuance of new water right permits in certain areas of the state. If and when the Commission adopts these rules, new criteria or restrictions may be imposed on water use applications received after:

July 17, 1992, for use of water in the Upper Columbia/Snake Basin (above Bonneville Dam), including the mainstem Columbia and Snake Rivers and the Hood, Deschutes, John Day, Umatilla, Grande Ronde, Powder, Malheur and Owyhee Basins;

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June 3, 1994, for use of water in all Oregon basins.

When the report on the technical review is completed and sent to you, a 60-day objection period begins during which you, the applicant, or anyone who has expressed an interest in your proposed water use may communicate to us their disagreement with what we have said in our report on your application. After the 60-day objection period, the Department conducts the public interest review and considers any objections which have been made.

After any objections have been considered, there may follow time to allow parties to resolve conflicts over the proposed water use. In addition, a 30-day protest period may be required. Lastly, it may be necessary to schedule a hearing or send the application to the Water Resources Commission for their review.

If your application is recommended for approval and a permit is issued, the use allowed by the permit will be subject to the Basin Program Rules of the Water Resources Commission, instream flow requirements, the demands of prior right holders and other conditions to conform the water use to particular standards.

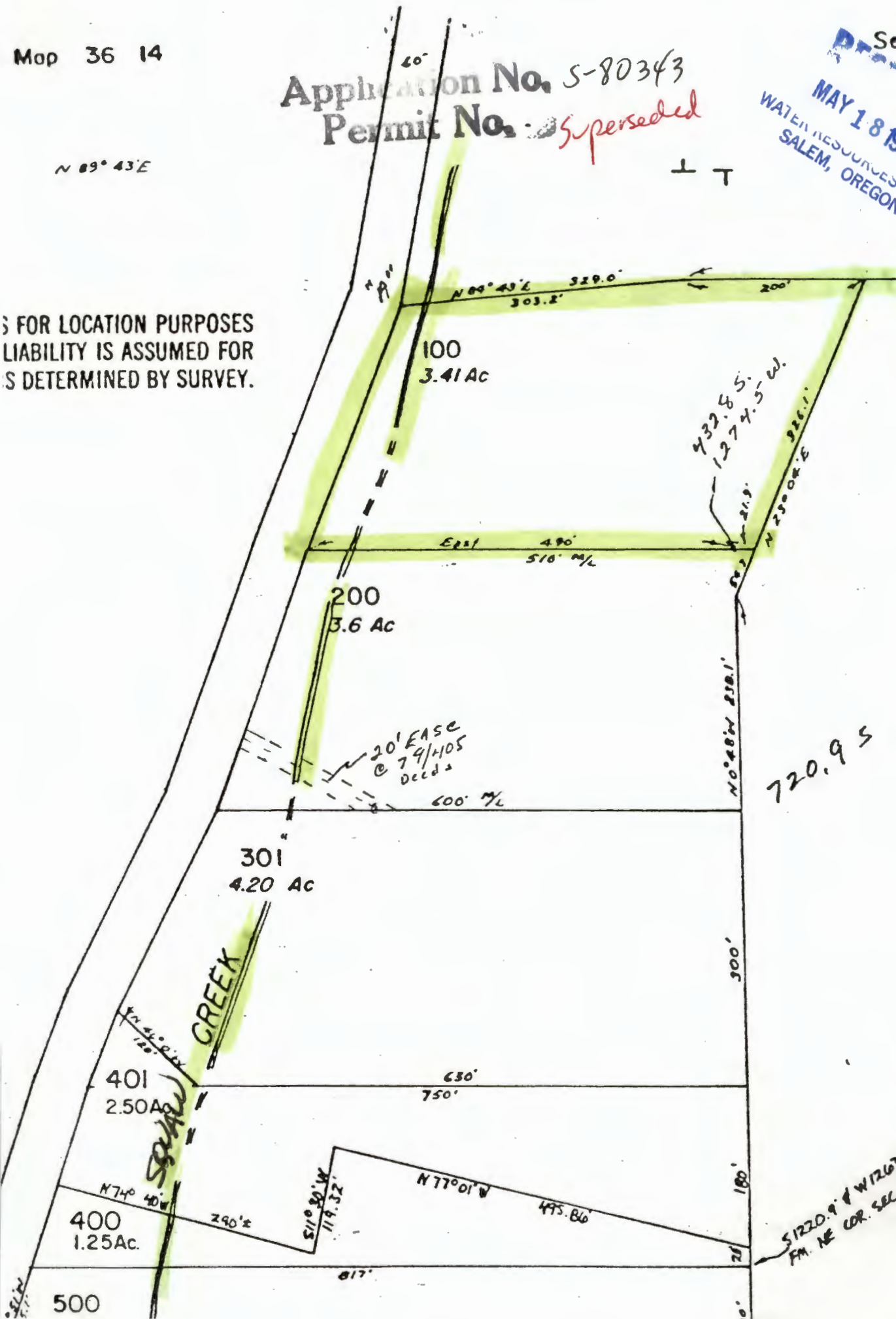

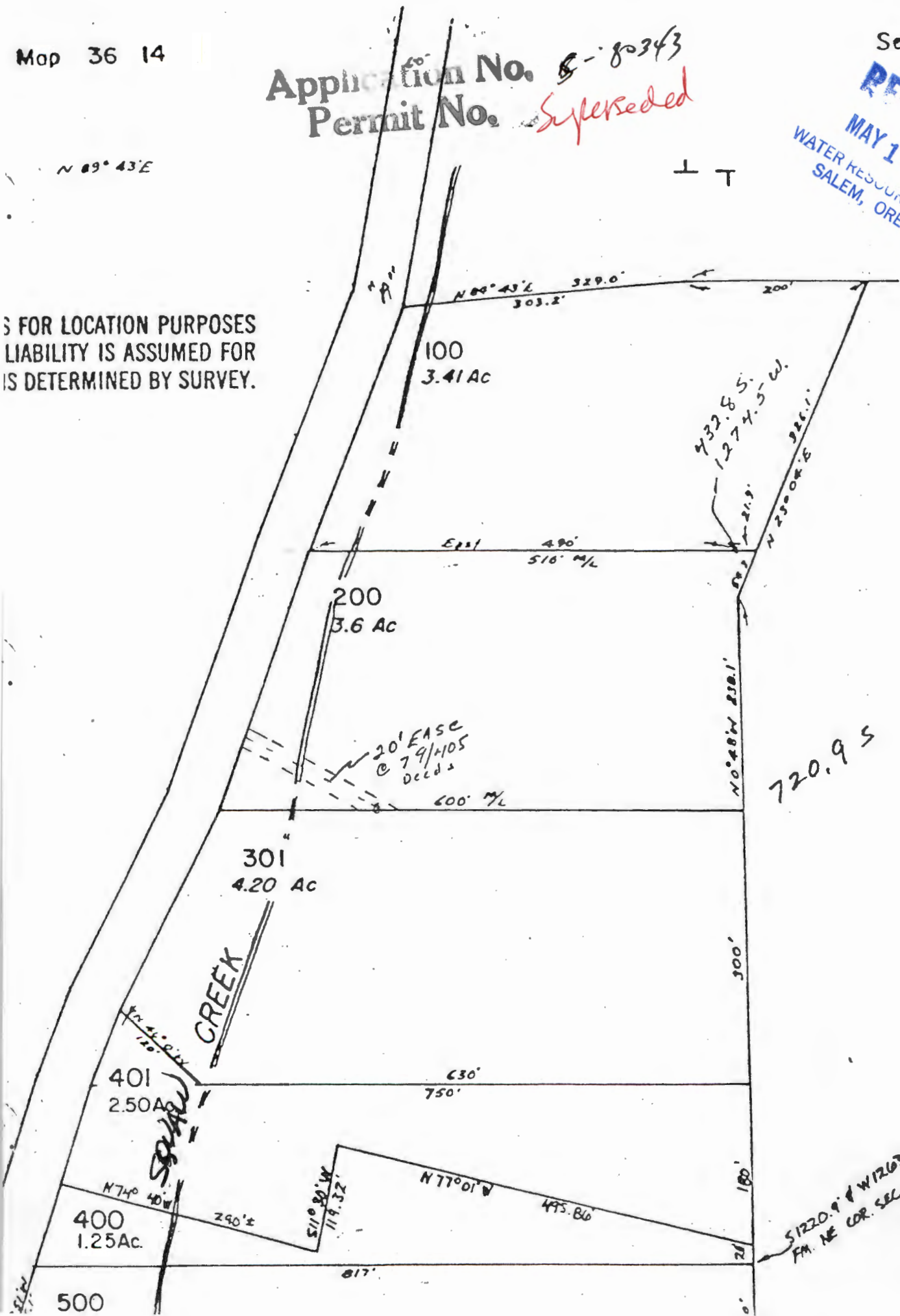

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
