This Extension of Time request is being processed in accordance with Oregon Revised Statute 537.230 and 539.010(5), and Oregon Administrative Rule Chapter 690, Division 315.

Appeal Rights

This final order is subject to judicial review by the Court of Appeals under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482(1). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Application History

Permit S-54015 was issued by the Department on February 26, 1997 and modified by Permit Amendment T-12600 on August 24, 2018, and issued superseding Permit S-55164. The permit specified completion of construction by October 1, 1999, and complete application of water to beneficial use by, October 1, 2000. The most recent extension authorized completion of construction and complete application of water to beneficial use by October 1, 2020. On March 10, 2021, Goschie Farms Inc. submitted an Application for Extension of Time for Permit S-55164. In accordance with OAR 690-315-0050(2), on July 27, 2021, the Department issued a Proposed Final Order proposing to extend the time to complete construction from October 1, October 1, 2020, to October 1, 2021, and the time to apply water to full beneficial use from

October 1, 2020, to October 1, 2021. The protest period closed September 10, 2021, in accordance with OAR 690-315-0060(1). No protest was filed.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Department adopts and incorporates by reference the findings in the Proposed Final Order dated July 27, 2021.

At time of issuance of the Proposed Final Order the Department concluded that, based on the factors demonstrated by the applicant, the permit may be extended subject to the following conditions:

LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS

1. Last Extension Condition

This may be the last extension of time granted for Permit S-55164. Any future extensions of time request shall be denied, unless the permit holder can provide the Department with evidence that diligence is shown during this extension period, and that installation of the required meter did not occur for reasons beyond the control of the permit holder. In addition, all normal extension standards and rules will be evaluated. ORS 539.010(5); OAR 690-315-0040.

CONCLUSION OF LAW

The applicant has demonstrated good cause for the permit extension pursuant to ORS 537.230, 539.010(5) and OAR 690-315-0040(2).

ORDER

The extension of time for Application S-71040, Permit S-55164, therefore, is approved subject to conditions contained herein. The deadline for completing construction is extended from October 1, 2020, to October 1, 2021. The deadline for applying water to full beneficial use within the terms and conditions of the permit is extended from October 1, 2020, to October 1, 2021.
