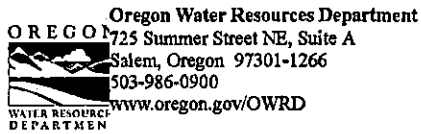




Diversion will be via pump from reservoir through 8 inch gated outlet pipeline at the base of the dam. Additionally, a gravity pipeline will be used to divert water from the 8 inch pipeline at times.

 Primary method of application will be dripline irrigation supplemented by some high pressure sprinklers at times.

C. Conservation

Please describe why the amount of water requested is needed and measures you propose to: prevent waste; measure the amount of water diverted; prevent damage to public uses of affected surface waters.

Every year Full Circles' water right on 48 acres gets shut regulated off in mid-summer before we harvest our crops. Our current focus is growing high value seed crops with drip irrigation. We need 9 acre-feet of water from the reservoir in order to finish our crops and remain in business. System will be a closed system with use of water depending on crop need. There will be no waste as stored water is a limited supply which will demand

high efficiency through drip irrigation, liberal use of mulch, irrigating at dawn and other water saving measures. The amount of water diverted will be dutifully measured as requested by the Watermaster

SECTION 7: RESOURCE PROTECTION

Describe planned actions: Source is stored with no fish. Source for reservoir is runoff and seepage
- Excavation or clearing of banks will be kept to a minimum to protect riparian or streamside areas.
Note: If disturbed area is more than one acre, applicant should contact the Department of Environmental Quality to determine if a 1200C permit is required.
Describe planned actions and additional permits required for project implementation: No work will be done in a riparian area. Reservoir location has been specifically chosen to avoid all impacts to any streamside or riparian areas.
- Operating equipment in a water body will be managed and timed to prevent damage to aquatic life.
Describe planned actions and additional permits required for project implementation: No work in a water body. Reservoir and it's source is off channel
- Water quality will be protected by preventing erosion and run-off of waste or chemical products.
Describe planned actions: Reservoir and it's source are off channel. There will be no runoff or erosion since delivery system will be closed and delivery managed to prevent runoff. Delivery of water will be dependent on crop need.
- List other federal and state permits or contracts to be obtained, if a water right permit is granted.

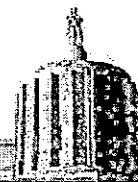

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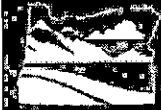

 - Even map scale not less than 4" = 1 mile (example: 1" = 400 ft, 1" = 1320 ft, etc.)
 - North Directional Symbol
 - Township, Range, Section, Quarter/Quarter, Tax Lots
 - Reference corner on map
 - Location of each diversion, by reference to a recognized public land survey corner (distances north/south and east/west)
 - Indicate the area of use by Quarter/Quarter and tax lot identified clearly
 - Number of acres per Quarter/Quarter and hatching to indicate area of use if for primary irrigation, supplemental irrigation, or nursery
 - Location of main canals, ditches, pipelines or flumes (if well is outside of the area of use)

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Water-Use Permit Application Processing

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1. Completeness Determination

The Department evaluates whether the application and accompanying map contain all of the information required under OAR 690-310-0040 and OAR 690-310-0050. The Department also determines whether the proposed use is prohibited by statute. If the Department determines that the application is incomplete, all fees have not been paid, or the use is prohibited by statute, the application and all fees submitted are returned to the applicant.

2. Initial Review

The Department reviews the application to determine whether water is available during the period requested, whether the proposed use is restricted or limited by rule or statute, and whether other issues may preclude approval of or restrict the proposed use. An Initial Review (IR) containing preliminary determinations is mailed to the applicant. The applicant has 14 days from the mailing date to withdraw the application from further processing and receive a refund of all fees paid minus \$310. The applicant may put the application on hold for up to 180 days and may request additional time if necessary.

3. Public Notice

Within 7 days of the mailing of the initial review, the Department gives public notice of the application in the weekly notice published by the Department at www.oregon.gov/owrd. The public comment period is 30 days from publication in the weekly notice.

4. Proposed Final Order Issued

The Department reviews any comments received, including comments from other state agencies related to the protection of sensitive, threatened or endangered fish species. Within 60 days of completion of the IR, the Department issues a Proposed Final Order (PFO) explaining the proposed decision to deny or approve the application. A PFO proposing approval of an application will include a draft permit, and may request additional information or outstanding fees required prior to permit issuance.

5. Public Notice

Within 7 days of issuing the PFO, the Department gives public notice in the weekly notice. Notice includes information about the application and the PFO. Protest must be received by the Department within 45 days after publication of the PFO in the weekly notice. Anyone may file a protest. The protest filing fee is \$480.00 for the applicant and \$950.00 for non-applicants. Protests are filed on approximately 10 percent of Proposed Final Orders. If a protest is filed the Department will attempt to settle the protest but will schedule a contested case hearing if necessary.

6. Final Order Issued

If no protests are filed, the Department can issue a Final Order within 60 days of the close of the period for receiving protest. If the application is approved, a permit is issued. The permit specifies the details of the authorized use and any terms, limitations or conditions that the Department deems appropriate

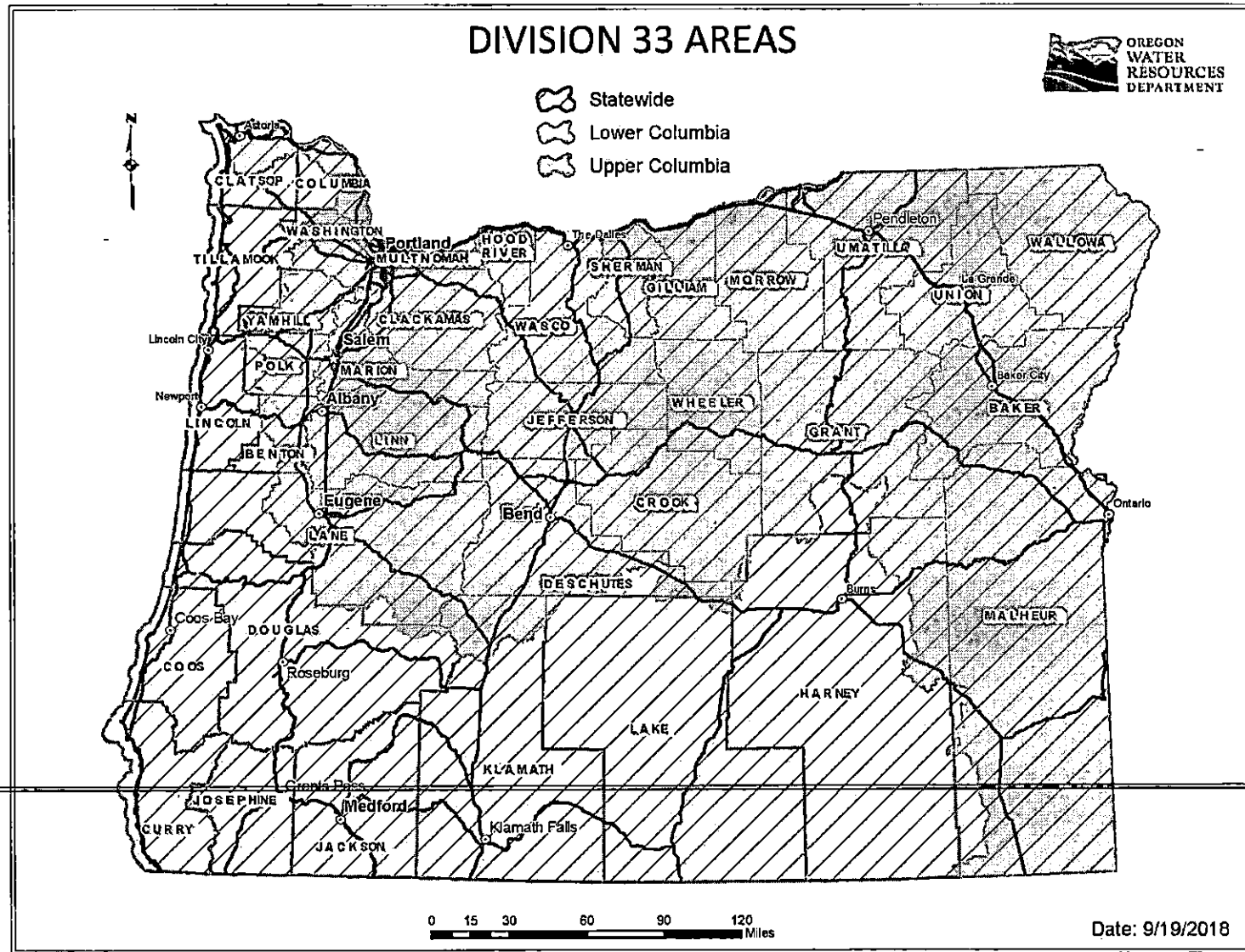
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Figure 1: Map of Division 33 Areas
