

This is additional information for a groundwater right application submitted by Del Rio Vineyards, LLC. This application is supplemental to certificate 92936. The information listed below is in reference to the section of the permit application as listed.

Section 3: Well Development Distance from Surface Water

The nearest naturally flowing surface water is the Rogue River which the nearest point on the river is approximately 1.2 miles. The USGW streams GIS layer shows a "water line" that is the Table Rock District Improvement Company (TRDIC) canal also called the Table Rock Canal. During the late winter and spring, the TRDIC diverts temperature control water from the Rogue River for certificates 42816, 42818 and 65102. The water so diverted flows along the Table Rock Canal and when not needed for temperature control the water is dumped in a drainage that crosses the Table Rock canal on the west side of the property subject to this groundwater application. The drainage (above the Table Rock Canal) does not flow water except during times of heavy winter precipitation. During the period when TRDIC is dumping the temperature control water, the drainage runs water, which is most of the time. The point being made is that the flow in the drainage is not natural flow and should not be considered for the Possible Surface Water Interference review. If there is any questions or concern, we would like the opportunity to have ODFW review and comment on the source of flow in this drainage.

Section 3: Well Development

The application asks for the anticipated construction of the well. This is very difficult to do because there are no wells in the area that are deep enough to identify what is underground at the site of the proposed well. Generally, wells drilled in the Rogue Valley take water from "claystone" or "sandstone" in very limited quantities. This proposed well is located at the foot of Upper Table Rock, which is a volcanic formation. Some of the nearby well logs show encountering basalt in the vicinity of 200 feet deep. None of the nearby wells are deeper than 300 feet and all encounter very limited flow. Apparently, the basalt formation at that depth is not fractured very much. This application anticipates that the basalt formation will be more fractured and yield the flow of water requested at a deeper depth. The information entered in the well construction table is only a guess.

## Water-Use Permit Application Processing

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### 1. Completeness Determination

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The Department evaluates whether the application and accompanying map contain all of the information required under OAR 690-310-0040 and OAR 690-310-0050. The Department also determines whether the proposed use is prohibited by statute. If the Department determines that the application is incomplete, all fees have not been paid, or the use is prohibited by statute, the application and all fees submitted are returned to the applicant.

#### 2. Initial Review

The Department reviews the application to determine whether water is available during the period requested, whether the proposed use is restricted or limited by rule or statute, and whether other issues may preclude approval of or restrict the proposed use. An Initial Review (IR) containing preliminary determinations is mailed to the applicant. The applicant has 14 days from the mailing date to withdraw the application from further processing and receive a refund of all fees paid minus \$310. The applicant may put the application on hold for up to 180 days and may request additional time if necessary.

#### 3. Public Notice

Within 7 days of the mailing of the initial review, the Department gives <u>public notice</u> of the application in the weekly notice published by the Department at <u>www.oregon.gov/owrd</u>. The public comment period is 30 days from publication in the weekly notice.

### 4. Proposed Final Order Issued

The Department reviews any comments received, including comments from other state agencies related to the protection of sensitive, threatened or endangered fish species. Within 60 days of completion of the IR, the Department issues a Proposed Final Order (PFO) explaining the proposed decision to deny or approve the application. A PFO proposing approval of an application will include a draft permit, and may request additional information or outstanding fees required prior to permit issuance.

### 5. Public Notice

Within 7 days of issuing the PFO, the Department gives public notice in the weekly notice. Notice includes information about the application and the PFO. Protest must be received by the Department within 45 days after publication of the PFO in the weekly notice. Anyone may file a protest. The protest filing fee is \$480.00 for the applicant and \$950.00 for non-applicants. Protests are filed on approximately 10 percent of Proposed Final Orders. If a protest is filed the Department will attempt to settle the protest but will schedule a contested case hearing if necessary.

#### 6. Final Order Issued

If no protests are filed, the Department can issue a Final Order within 60 days of the close of the period for receiving protest. If the application is approved, a permit is issued. The permit specifies the details of the authorized use and any terms, limitations or conditions that the Department deems appropriate
