I am enclosing herewith your applications No's 129 and 130, approved, being, respectively, permits No's 137 and 138, together with blue print maps, under separate cover. These applications have been retained in this office, awaiting the determination of a prior filing made by the U. S. Reclamation Service for all unappropriated waters of the Umatilla River. This application has lately been completed and calls for the irrigation of about sixty-five thousand acres of land.

You will understand that you are not limited to the amount of water designated in these applications but may divert and use as much water as you see fit until such time as a complaint is filed and a Water Master appointed for the distribution of the waters of this stream. Some system of ~~distribution~~ *rotation* will undoubtedly be installed, so that a good irrigation head can be secured at all times.



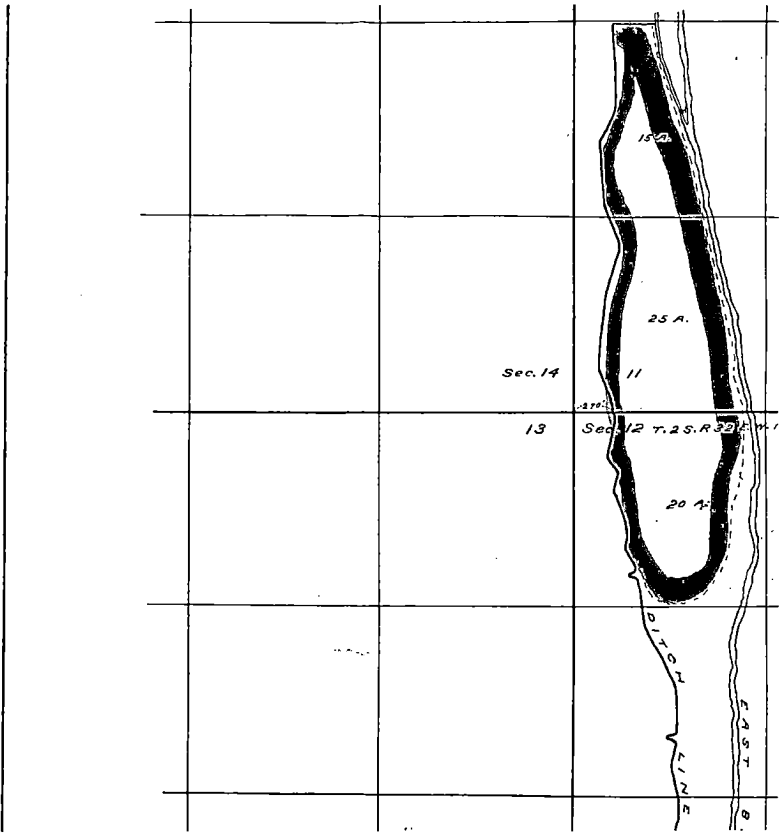

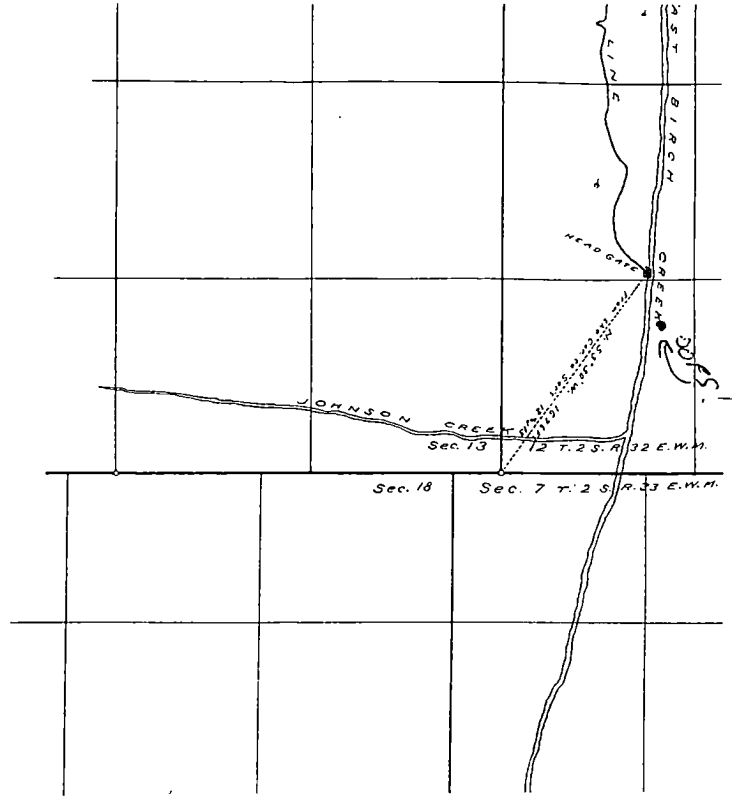
