


AFFIDAVIT OF WITNESSES



Dear Sir:

I am in receipt of your letter of the 29th ultimo and note that you have used the water from but one source for the irrigation of your land. According to the records of this office you were allowed a second feet of water from Foxson and Johnson Creeks and it would seem that the water may be secured from either source. However, I note that according to the terms of the permit construction work was to have begun on or before October 25, 1910, been completed on or before October 25, 1911, and the water applied to the proposed use on or before Oct. 25, 1912. If the construction work was begun, completed and the water applied to the proposed use in accordance with the terms of the permit, I would suggest that you fill out and forward the ~~statements~~ ~~statements~~.

You will be permitted to submit final proof covering the irrigation of all the land that was actually irrigated prior to October 25, 1912.

We are endeavoring to bring our records up to date and would be glad to have you give this matter attention.

Dear Sirs. Your notice in regard to permit 138 which covers the use of 2 second feet of water from Pearson<sup>and</sup> Johnson creek for the irrigation of 160 acres of land ~~from~~ I came to hand a few days ago <sup>and</sup> in reply will say it was my own neglect that I did not answer sooner. I just waited to consult some one familiar with the subject and failed to do so. So now I will tell you my tale of woe. The right was asked by Mr Mann who owned the place prior to myself. Now to get water on my place from Pearson creek <sup>to my mind</sup> is not feasible it would necessitate a ditch along the steep mountain side of some three miles and would be very expensive.

but the water from Johnson Creek (which is a small stream that runs through my place) is very essential to me and I have been using water from it all the time. Though it ~~at~~ nearly always goes dry in summer, the bench land is heavy soil, and the water is sufficient.

Now shall I fill out blank that you sent showing how I have used the water or will I need a new application? I have complied so far as Johnson Creek is concerned but have done nothing with Pearson Creek and never intend to.

Dear Sir:

I note from the records of this office that you have not submitted final proof under permit No. 138 originally in the name of L. E. Mann and which covers the use of 2 second feet of water from Pearson Creek and Johnson Creek for the irrigation of 160 acres of land, although final proof sheets were forwarded you for execution in March, 1914. In view of the fact that you have not submitted final proof under this permit as you did under permit No. 137, we presume you have abandoned this water right, and if so, we would be glad to have you authorize the cancellation of the permit on the records of this office as this will eliminate the necessity of following the regular procedure for the cancellation of the permit.

However, if the terms of the permit have been complied with, final proof should be submitted in order that a final water right certificate may be issued by the Board.

In view of the fact that we have received no reply to our letters of Dec. 14, 1915, and Mar. 23, 1916, in regard to this matter, you are advised that unless hearing from you within 60 days from the date of this letter the permit will be presented to the Board for appropriate action.

Dear Sir:

I note from the records of this office that you have not filed final proof under application No. 130, permit No. 138, issued by the State Engineer for 2 second feet of water from Fearron Creek and Johnson Creek for the irrigation of 160 acres of land, although blanks for this purpose were mailed you in March 1914. If you have abandoned this water right and do not intend to submit final proof, we would be glad to have you authorize the cancellation of the permit on the records of this office as this will eliminate the necessity of following the regular procedure for the cancellation of the same.

However, if the terms of the permit have been complied with and you desire to perfect this right and secure a water right certificate, final proof should be submitted to the Board.

Please let us hear from you with reference to this matter.

Dear Sir,

I am in receipt of your inquiry of the 15th inst. relative to your water right. I am enclosing proof blank and map for Permit No. 138, which permit was assigned to you (together with Permit No. 137, for which proof of appropriation is already on file), by Mr. L. L. Mann. You will understand that the map sent you with proof blank for Permit No. 137, and the map sent herewith, were filed by Mr. Mann at the time he made application for the permits, to the State Engineer, and represented land to be irrigated under ditches not yet constructed. The 1885 right of which you speak is an entirely different matter, and cannot be passed upon by this office at this time. Certificates of water right under Permits Nos. 137, and 138 will bear a date of priority of June 7, 1909.

I note that you have given 1897 as the date of completion of the ditch covered by Permit No. 137. Inasmuch as the permit covers a ditch constructed since June 7, 1909, you should advise this office as to the date of completion of the ditch, and use of water thereunder, so that your proof can be corrected.

The \$1.00 recording fee required by law should accompany proof of appropriation for Permit No. 138.
