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



Being a portion of the Isaac Whealdon D.L.C. located in Section 27, Township 4 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Meridian, in the County of Clacjkamas and State of Oregon, more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the center of the county road, which point is 20.44 chains South and 837.4 links West of the Northeast corner of the Isaac Whealdon D.L.C. in Townshi 4 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Meridian; running thence West along the center of said county road 522.786 feet to a stone marked "X" on the top; thence South 2200 feet, more or less, to the South line of said Section 27; thence East along the South line of said section 522.786 feet to a point; thence North 2200 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning.

TOGETHER WITH a portion of the Isaac Whealdon D.L.C. in Section 34, Township 4 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Meridian, in the County of Clackamas and State of Oregon, more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the East line of that tract as described in Fee No. 86-042127, Deed Records; said point being North 89°56'51" West along the South line of said Whealdon D.L.C., 556.98 feet; and North 1379.46 feet from the Southeast corner thereof; thence continuing North along said East line 447.25 feet to a point on the North line of Section 34; thence South 89°27'05" West along said Section line 522.80 feet to the Northwest corner of that tract as described in Fee No. 86-042127, Deed Records; thence South along the West line of said tract 369.90 feet; thence South 80°49'10" East 117.56 feet; thence South 83°46'24" East 97.50 feet; thence North 65°06'38" East 88.07 feet; thence South 70°47'43" East 243,46 feet to the point of beginning.

EXCEPTING THEREFROM the rights of the public to those portions lying within public roads.
