

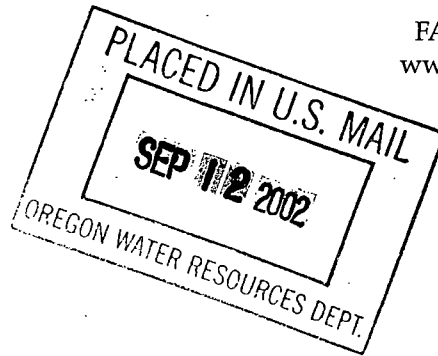

PROPOSED CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, a tributary of UMPQUA RIVER, for DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE HOUSEHOLD INCLUDING IRRIGATION OF LAWN AND NON-COMMERCIAL GARDEN NOT TO EXCEED ONE-HALF ACRE IN AREA.

This right was perfected under Permit 53264. The date of priority is OCTOBER 29, 1996. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.01 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS) FOR DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE HOUSEHOLD INCLUDING IRRIGATION OF LAWN AND NON-COMMERCIAL GARDEN NOT TO EXCEED ONE-HALF ACRE IN AREA DURING THE PERIOD FROM DECEMBER 1 THROUGH JUNE 30 OF EACH YEAR, AND FURTHER LIMITED TO 0.005 CFS FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION DURING THE PERIOD FROM JULY 1 THROUGH NOVEMBER 30 OF EACH YEAR, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

LOT 7 (NE 1/4 NW 1/4), SECTION 19, TOWNSHIP 26 SOUTH, RANGE 4 WEST, W.M.; 600 FEET SOUTH AND 250 FEET WEST FROM THE NORTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 19.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

LOT 7 (NE 1/4 NW 1/4)
SECTION 19
TOWNSHIP 26 SOUTH, RANGE 4 WEST, W.M.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The Director may require the water user to install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. If the Director notifies the water user to install a meter or other measuring device, the water user shall install such device within the period stated in the notice. Such installation period shall not be less than 90 days unless special circumstances warrant a shorter installation period. Once installed, the water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order and shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to

submit alternative measuring procedures for review and approval.

- B. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the water user to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the right. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The water user shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening and by-pass devices as required by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife to prevent fish from entering the diversion. The required screen is to be in place and functional.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use without waste on the lands or place of use described. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.

The Director finds the use of water described by this right, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

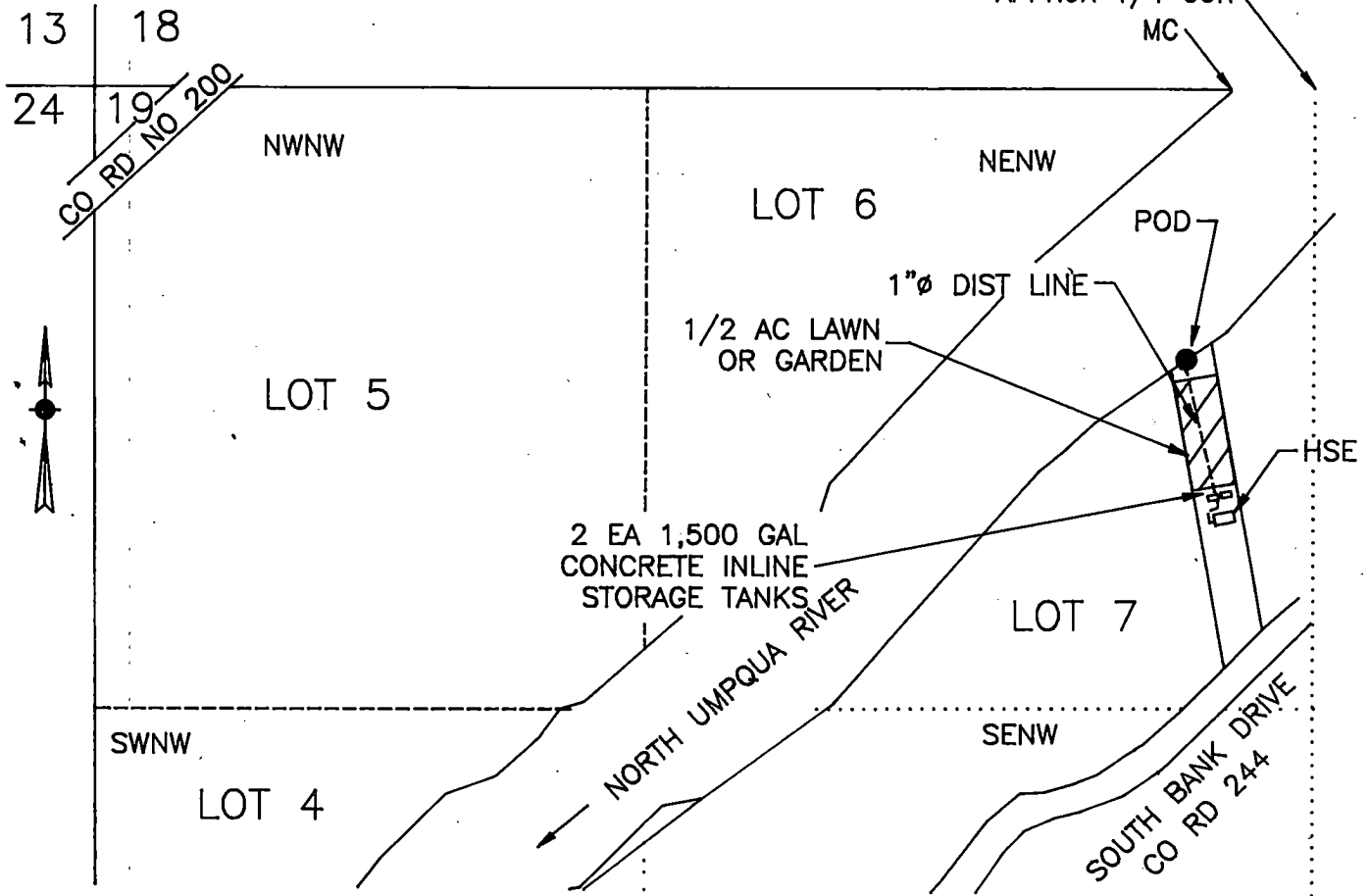

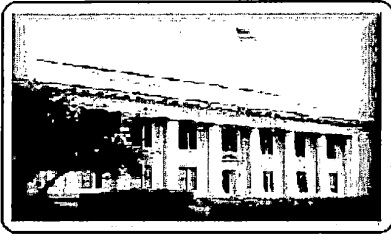

Purpose or use: Domestic use for one household including irrigation of lawn and non-commercial garden not to exceed 1/2 acre in area; further limited to human consumption use only.

Maximum rate/volume allowed: 0.01 cfs for domestic use including irrigation of lawn and non-commercial garden not to exceed 1/2 acre in area; further limited to 0.005 cfs for human consumption use.

Period of use: December 1 through June 30 for domestic use for one household including irrigation of lawn and non-commercial garden not to exceed 1/2 acre in area; further limited July 1 through November 30 to human consumption only.

The permittee shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening and by-pass devices as required by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion. The required screen is to be in place and functional prior to diversion of any water.

Place of use is located NE1/4NW1/4, Section 19, T26S, R4W, WM.

On May 15, 1998, I made a survey of the above listed property and viewed the water system installed and in use. I used an assessor map and an aerial photo during the course of preparing this final proof survey and site map.

SOURCES: Water is taken from North Umpqua River, tributary to Umpqua River.

DIVERSION POINT: The intake is a submersible pump in a natural basin in the southern edge of The North Umpqua River. The pump is fitted with a well screen approved by ODF&W to prevent fish from entering the intake structure. See enclosed certification sheet.

PUMP 1: Grundfos 1/2 hp submersible pump, 10 GPM, type 10S05-9 with control box.

PUMP 2: Meyers 1/2 hp submersible pump, 12 GPM

DIST LINE: 1" diameter galvanized and 1" diameter pvc pipe to the two 1500 gallon concrete in-line storage tanks. From the in-line storage tanks pump 2 pumps the water to the filter system for processing and supplying the domestic water. Water from pump 2 is also routed to exterior hose bibs for distribution to the lawn and noncommercial garden.

HEADS: Lonnie Davis has four (4) Rainbird domestic sprinklers capable of discharging 2.5 to 3.0 GPM each at 40 psi. All are used at a time to distribute water to the area being irrigated.

USES: Water has been perfected for domestic use including irrigation of lawn and non-commercial garden not to exceed 1/2 acre.

LIFT: Elevation difference between the intake in the river and the bottom of the in-line storage tanks was estimated to be 50 feet.

SURVEY TIE: POD is located 600 feet South and 250 feet West from the North 1/4 Cor, Section 19, T26S, R4W, WM.

REMARKS: Claim of Beneficial Use computations are as follows:

Domestic use including irrigation of lawn and non-commercial garden	=0.010 cfs, 4.5 GPM
Output of pump 1, in the river	=0.022 cfs, 10.0 GPM
Output of pump 2, in-line storage tank	=0.027 cfs, 12.0 GPM
Output of sprinklers (4)@ 2.5 GPM	=0.022 cfs, 10.0 GPM
Maximum Rate (December 1 through June 30)	=0.010 cfs, 4.5 GPM
Maximum Rate (July 1 through November 30)	=0.005 cfs, 2.2 GPM

Water from the river intake is transported to the place of use through approximately 100 feet of 1" diameter galvanized pipe and approximately 200 feet of 1" diameter PVC pipe installed in a trench in the ground.

Domestic water is processed for human consumption utilizing a Sanitron water purifier, a Wellmate 62 gallon pressure tank, two filters: one 1.0-15 micron openings black cartridge filter and one 5-15 micron openings white cartridge filter, maximum flow 10 GPM.

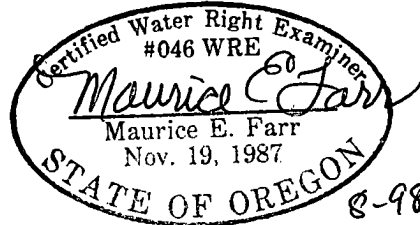

for Small Pump Screens

In accordance with ORS 469.371, 498.248, and other rules, pump screens must be installed on all pumps where the possibility of game fish ingestion exists. Technical requirements for pump screens of less than 0.5 cfs (225 gpm) are summarized in simplified form below:

1 Screen Construction & Materials:

- 1.1 The minimum amount of wetted (submerged) screen surface area required is 1 square inch of screen for each gallon per minute (gpm) of flow. In terms of cubic feet per second (cfs), 3 square feet of screen area are required for cfs). The screen shall be designed so as to uniformly admit water through it, without a disproportionate amount of the water coming through any localized portion of the screen.
- 1.2 The screen mesh shall have 1/8" maximum size holes or slots, measured in their smallest dimension. There is no restriction on the length of slits or slots.
- 1.3 The screen surface shall have a minimum of 40% open area.
- 1.4 The screen material may be wire mesh, perforated plate, or other suitable material.
- 1.5 Any gaps in the screen assembly through which fish might pass shall not exceed 1/8".
- 1.6 There shall be no sharp edges or surfaces exposed which could injure fish. Sharp edges are herein defined as edges of less than .010 inches radius.
- 1.7 Durable material (plastic, stainless steel, brass, etc) is recommended to ensure continued usefulness and ease of maintenance.

2 Larger Screens: For all other screens (i.e. dams, gravity diversions), and for all pump screens larger than 0.5 cfs, contact the ODFW Fish Passage Program at 229-5410 x466 for further information.

3 Self-Certification: ODFW does not usually inspect small pump screens of less than 225 gpm (0.5 cfs), but simply furnishes the above screening information to the water right applicant.

After required fish screening has been installed, sign the certification below and present this letter to the OREGON WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT, 158 12th St, NE, Salem, OR, 97310 as evidence of meeting ODFW screening requirements.

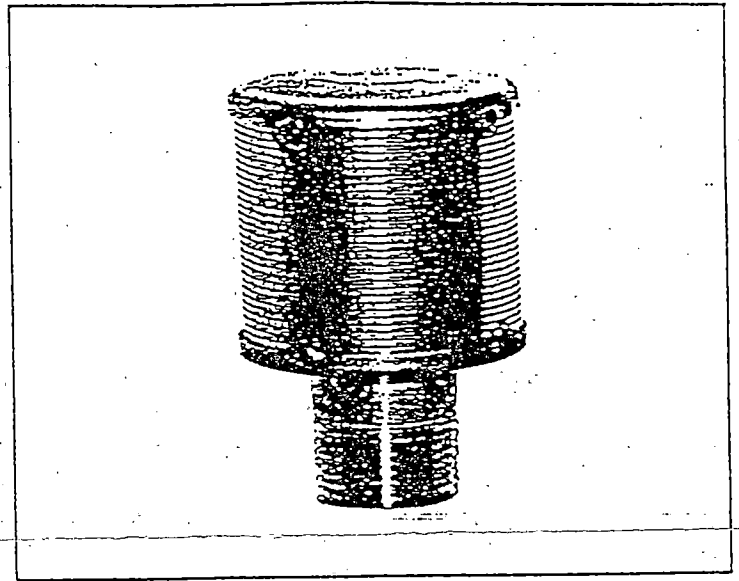
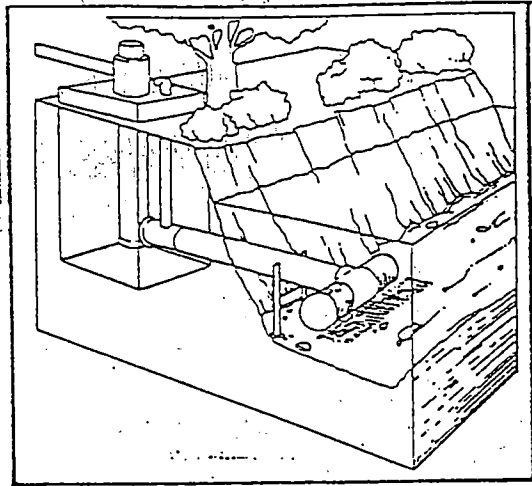

Summary of Recommendation: The Department recommends that the attached draft permit be issued with conditions.

Application History

On October 29, 1996, LONNIE DAVIS AND SHARON McBURNEY submitted an application to the Department for the following water use permit:

- Amount of Water: 0.01 CUBIC-FOOT PER SECOND (CFS)
- Use of Water: DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE HOUSEHOLD INCLUDING IRRIGATION OF LAWN AND NON-COMMERCIAL GARDEN NOT TO EXCEED ½ ACRE IN AREA
- Source of Water: NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF THE UMPQUA RIVER
- Area of Proposed Use: DOUGLAS County within SECTION 19, TOWNSHIP 26 SOUTH, RANGE 4 WEST, W.M.
- Water Delivery System: According to the application the delivery system includes a ½ horsepower submersible pump at the river with a sand screen over the intake pipe and 370 feet of 1 inch pipe to a 1500 gallon holding tank near the house with a ½ horsepower submersible pump in the holding tank to feed household lines. Both pumps have a capacity of 10 gallons per minute.

On 2/4/97, the Department mailed the applicant notice of its Initial Review, determining that the use of 0.01 CFS from North Umpqua River, a tributary of Umpqua River, for Domestic Use for one Household is not allowable. The Initial Review provided the applicant with an opportunity to submit information, to overcome the findings of the Initial Review, which may allow use of water. The applicant did not notify the Department to stop processing the application within 14 days of that date.

On 2/18/97, the Department gave public notice of the application in its weekly notice. The public notice included a request for comments, and information for interested persons about both obtaining future notices and a copy of the proposed final order.

Within 30 days of the Department's public notice, written comments were received from the applicant.

In reviewing applications, the Department may consider any relevant sources of information, including the following:

- comments by or consultation with another state agency
- any applicable basin program
- any applicable comprehensive plan or zoning ordinance
- the amount of water available
- the rate and duty for the proposed use
- pending senior applications and existing water rights of record
- the Scenic Waterway requirements of ORS 390.835
- applicable statutes, administrative rules, and case law
- any comments received

Findings of Fact

The Umpqua Basin Program allows the following uses: DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE HOUSEHOLD INCLUDING IRRIGATION OF LAWN AND NON-COMMERCIAL GARDEN NOT TO EXCEED ½ ACRE IN AREA.

Senior water rights exist on THE NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF THE UMPQUA RIVER, or on downstream waters.

This reach of the NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF THE UMPQUA RIVER, is not within or above a State Scenic Waterway.

An assessment of water availability has been completed. This assessment compared a calculation of natural streamflow minus the consumption portion of all relevant rights of record. A copy of this assessment is in the file. This assessment determined that water is available for further appropriation (at an 80 percent exceedance probability) for the period DECEMBER 1 THROUGH JUNE 30 FOR DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE HOUSEHOLD INCLUDING IRRIGATION OF LAWN AND NON-COMMERCIAL GARDEN NOT TO EXCEED ½ ACRE IN AREA. Water is not available July 1 through November 30 due to flows necessary to maintain Instream Water Rights.

The Initial Review determined that water is not available for a full period of use and identified that the proposed use would not be allowed. However, the Initial Review also provided the applicant with an opportunity to submit additional information. The information would need to show that beneficial use could be made when water was available or that Human Consumption use, July 1 through November 30, would be considered of high public interest and that instream values would be protected.

On February 19, 1997, the Department received the requested information from the Applicant. Based upon this information and information from the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, the Department has determined that use of water July 1 through November 30 for Human Consumption Use is allowable.

The Department finds that no more than 0.01 CFS would be necessary for the Domestic Use for one household including Irrigation of Lawn and Non-commercial garden not to exceed ½ acre in area and that no more than 0.005 CFS would be necessary for Human Consumption Use. The amount of

water requested, 0.01 CFS, shall be restricted to 0.01 CFS for Domestic Use for one household including Irrigation of Lawn and Non-commercial Garden not to exceed ½ acre in area; further limited to 0.005 CFS for Human Consumption Use.

The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife has advised that one or more species of game fish are present at the described point of diversion.

In accordance with OAR 690-33-330, an interagency team reviewed this proposed use for potential adverse impacts on sensitive, threatened and endangered fish populations. This team consisted of representatives from the Oregon Departments of Water Resources (WRD), Environmental Quality, Fish and Wildlife (DFW), and Agriculture. WRD and DFW representatives included both technical and field staff.

The interagency team recommended that additional limitations or conditions of use be imposed on this application as follows:

The permittee shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening and by-pass devices as required by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion. The required screen is to be in place and functional prior to diversion of any water.

Conclusions of Law

Under the provisions of ORS 537.153, the Department must presume that a proposed use will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest if the proposed use is allowed in the applicable basin program established pursuant to ORS 536.300 and 536.340 or given a preference under ORS 536.310(12), if water is available, if the proposed use will not injure other water rights and if the proposed use complies with rules of the Water Resources Commission.

The proposed use requested in this application is allowed in the Umpqua Basin Plan.

Preference for human consumption use is granted under the provisions of ORS 536.310(12).

Water is available for the proposed use.

The proposed use will not injure other water rights.

The proposed use complies with rules of the Water Resources Commission.

The proposed use complies with the State Agency Agreement for land use.

For these reasons, the required presumption has been established.

Once the required presumption has been established, under the provisions of ORS 537.153(2) it may be overcome by a preponderance of evidence that either:

- (a) One or more of the criteria for establishing the presumption are not satisfied; or
- (b) The proposed use will impair or be detrimental to the public interest as demonstrated in comments, in a protest . . . or in a finding of the department that shows:
 - (A) The specific public interest under ORS 537.170(8) that would be impaired or detrimentally affected; and
 - (B) Specifically how the identified public interest would be impaired or detrimentally affected.


In this application, all criteria for establishing the presumption have been satisfied, as noted above. The presumption has not been overcome by a preponderance of evidence that the proposed use will impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

The Department therefore concludes that water is available in the amount necessary for the proposed use; the proposed use will not result in injury to existing water rights; and the proposed use will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest as provided in ORS 537.170.

UMPQUA BASIN PROGRAM

Classifications

690-516-001

(1) The maximum economic development of this state, the attainment of the highest and best use of the waters of the Umpqua River Basin, and the attainment of an integrated and coordinated program for the benefit of the state as a whole will be furthered through utilization of the aforementioned waters only for domestic, livestock, municipal irrigation, temperature control, power development, industrial, mining, recreation, wildlife, fish life uses, and pollution abatement; and the waters of the Umpqua River Basin are hereby so classified with the following exceptions:

(a) Preference shall be given to human consumption, livestock consumption and irrigation of non-commercial gardens not to exceed one-half acre in area for all the waters of the Umpqua River Basin over any other beneficial uses.

(b) The waters of the natural lakes of the Umpqua River Basin are classified only for the utilization of water for domestic, livestock, power development not to exceed 7-1/2 theoretical horsepower, and in-lake uses for recreation, wildlife, and fish life purposes.

(c) The waters of Roberts Creek and its tributaries were withdrawn by Water Resources Commission's Order of Withdrawal on October 4, 1991.

(d) The unappropriated waters of Lookingglass Creek and tributaries are withdrawn from further appropriation except for domestic and livestock watering uses under 5,000 gallons per day per appropriation and water legally stored and released from storage from June 1 through September 30 of each year, by the Water Policy Review Board's Order of Withdrawal dated August 5, 1983.

(e) The unappropriated waters of the South Umpqua River and tributaries, excluding Lookingglass and Roberts Creeks, are withdrawn from further appropriation except for human consumption, livestock consumption, irrigation of up to 1/2-acre non-commercial garden and water legally released from storage from July 15 through September 30 of each year, by the Water Policy Review Board's Order of Withdrawal dated April 29, 1985. This limitation shall not affect the withdrawals previously enacted by the Board for the waters of Roberts and Lookingglass Creeks.

(2) Applications for the use of the waters of the Umpqua River Basin shall not be accepted by any state agency for any purposes contrary to the classifications herein specified; and the granting of applications for such other purposes is declared to be prejudicial to the public interest, and the granting of applications for such other use would be contrary to this water-use program.

(3) Structures or works for utilization of the waters in accordance with the aforementioned classifications are also declared to be prejudicial to the public interest unless planned, constructed and operated in conformity with the applicable provisions of ORS 536.310; and any such structures or works which do not give cognizance to the multiple-purpose concept are further declared to be prejudicial to the public interest.

Minimum Perennial Streamflows

690-516-002

(1) For the purpose of maintaining minimum perennial streamflows sufficient to support aquatic life, no appropriations of water except for human consumption, livestock consumption and irrigation of non-commercial gardens not to exceed one-half acre in area and waters legally released from storage shall be made or granted by any state agency or public corporation of the state for the waters of the following streams when flows are at or below the levels specified in Table 1.

(2) The minimum perennial streamflows established by the October 24, 1958, Umpqua Basin program shall remain in effect over appropriations issued from October 24, 1958, to March 26, 1974.

Storage

690-516-003

All applications for appropriation of water for storage in structures impounding more than 3,000,000 gallons of water shall be reviewed by the Water Policy Review Board prior to approval. During the review, the Water Policy Review Board may establish additional minimum flows on the natural flow of the stream to support aquatic life or minimize pollution.

Out-of-Basin Appropriations

690-516-004

To support present and proposed Umpqua River Basin water resource development, no out-of-basin appropriation of the waters of the Umpqua River Basin shall be made or granted by any state agency or public corporation of the state without the prior approval of, and following a public hearing by, the Water Policy Review Board.

Water Quality

690-516-005

Rights to use of water granted by any state agency in accordance with this water-use program shall be issued only on the condition that any effluents or return flows from such uses shall not interfere with other beneficial uses of water.

NOTE: The Umpqua River Basin is delineated on State Water Resources Board Map 16.6, dated 1969, available from the Water Resources Department.

Regarding application S-81627, the Umpqua Fish District will allow human consumption only in the North Umpqua River during periods that do not meet instream flows. This should be consistent with the Sikora permit.



Regarding R-76786, the tributary flows into Loon Lake and does not contain anadromous fish. Loon Lake contains bass, bluegill, crappie, with an isolated population of cutthroat trout. Cutthroat use the upper Lake Creek watershed to spawn and rear. The application is acceptable as stated.

This letter is in response to the *Initial Review Determination* dated February 4, 1997 which we received on February 10, 1997. We are writing to provide you with additional information regarding our proposal for use of water.

Prior to purchasing the property on South Bank Road in Roseburg, we checked with the Douglas County Water Master regarding obtaining a water rights use permit for domestic use. We were told that we would be able to get domestic use expanded for part of the year and human consumption only for the remainder of the year. With this expectation in mind, we proceeded with the purchase of the property.



Number 4 of the *Initial Review Determination* states that 0.01 cubic foot per second for domestic use for one household is not available July through November. If this means that we cannot use any water during this period, this would result in a loss of reasonable expectations for use of the property. When we purchased the property our plan was to build a home on the site. Without water year round it would be impossible to live on the site. If a water use permit is issued to us, the water will be used for beneficial purposes without waste.

According to the *Initial Review Determination* we have two options. We would like to apply for "**Option #2: Accept a limited period of use: Domestic use expanded during the period December 1 through June 30 with use during the remainder of the year limited to human consumption only.**" If we are given this permit we would agree that water use will only occur under the terms of the permit during the allowed period of use.

The covenants that exist for the subdivision where we purchased our property state that no livestock other than household pets may be kept on the property. There will be no livestock damage to the river. Additionally we plan to keep the property as natural as possible and have no plans to landscape with other than indigenous plants. We would be very willing to monitor our water usage and to take whatever measures are necessary to protect fish and wildlife along the river.

This letter is to inform you of the potential limitations to your proposed use of water and to describe some of your options. Based on the information you have supplied, the Water Resources Department has reached the following conclusions:

Initial Review Determinations:

1. Your application is complete and not defective.
2. The proposed use is not prohibited by law or rule.
3. The use of water for DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE HOUSEHOLD is allowable under OAR 516, the Umpqua Basin Program.
4. Water in the amount of 0.01 CUBIC-FOOT PER SECOND for DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE HOUSEHOLD is not available July through November.

Summary of Initial Determinations

The use of 0.01 CUBIC-FOOT PER SECOND from NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF UMPQUA RIVER for DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE HOUSEHOLD is not allowable.

Because of the Departments determination, your application can be moved to the next phase of the water rights application review process. However, due to #4 above your application will likely be limited as summarized above.

Withdrawal Refunds:

If you choose not to proceed, you may withdraw your application and receive a refund (minus a \$50 processing charge per application.) To accomplish this you must notify the Department in writing by **FEBRUARY 19, 1997**. For your convenience you may use the enclosed "STOP PROCESSING" form.

To Proceed With Your Application:

If you choose to proceed with your application, you do not have to notify the Department. Your application will automatically be placed on the Department's Public Notice to allow others the opportunity to comment. Due to the lack of water necessary to maintain instream uses protected by an instream water right, water is not available in sufficient quantities to support the proposed use. However, by rule, additional uses may be allowed where public interest in the use is high and the use is conditioned to protect instream values (OAR 690-410-070(2)(a)). Human consumption of water from the proposed source may be considered a high public interest use if there is no reasonable alternative. This may be especially true if denial of the application will result in loss of reasonable expectations for use of the property. If you can provide evidence that this is the case, we will work with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife to determine conditions which will protect instream values during the months listed above in number 4. These conditions may include mitigation measures to offset the impact of the requested use.

Please provide us with:

Evidence that denial of the requested use would result in loss of reasonable expectations for use of the property;

A list of all potential alternate sources of water and a description of why such sources cannot be used; and,

A list of any mitigation measures which might benefit instream resources. (Examples of mitigation measures include but are not limited to: riparian area fencing to exclude livestock; or planting native species in the riparian area.)

Option 2: accept a limited period of use

By supplying the Department with additional information concerning the proposed use, you may be able to use water for **domestic use expanded** during the period December 1 through June 30 with use during the remainder of the year limited to **human consumption only**. If you do not either: withdraw your application; provide the additional information as described below; or provide the information described in option 1 above, the Department will propose to reject your application. This information should be submitted within 30 days to avoid any further delays in the processing of your application.

If you would like to be able to use water during the limited time when it is available, you must supply the Department with two items.

Item #1 Supply information that would demonstrate that you can either make beneficial use of the water during the times it is available,

OR

Identify another source of water that you will use during the period when water use is not allowed from the source named in this application.

Item #2 Your acknowledgment that water use will only occur, under the terms of the permit (if one is issued), during the allowed period of use.

If A Permit Is Issued It Will Likely Include The Following Conditions:

1. You may be required to measure the amount of water used and report that use annually.
2. You may be required to install fish screens at the diversion to meet Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife specifications for adequate protection of aquatic life.
3. You will be required to comply with state and federal water quality standards.


This application, and all applications filed between July 1, 1995, and October 31, 1996, must be processed by April 29, 1997. By that date, the Department must have reached a decision on your request or have scheduled a contested case hearing to settle any unresolved dispute related to your application.

If a permit is approved, the use allowed will be subject to existing Basin Program Rules, instream flow requirements, the demands of prior right holders and other limitations as needed to protect the resource. It may also be subject to new criteria or restrictions deemed necessary by the Oregon Water Resources Commission (a citizen body which oversees the agency's activities) to respond to water resource issues, including current and future Endangered Species Act fish listings.

The filing of an application does not allow you to use water. By law, an applicant may not legally store, divert or use water until the Department issues a final order approving a water right permit. Please bear in mind that the issuance of a permit is not guaranteed; therefore, the Department advises against investments in storage or delivery systems until you receive a permit.
