# **Regular Session - 2021**

- Authorized by HB 2145
- Purpose Provide financial assistance to permanently abandon, repair or replace a water well used for household purposes
- •\$2M American Rescue Plan Act
- \$100k General Fund



### What is this new fund?

# **Special Session – December 2021**

- Focus Prioritize financial assistance to persons of low to moderate income with domestic wells in areas recently impacted by drought or wildfire
- Additional ~ \$3.3M General Fund


