- State-wide discussions
 - 2017 Integrated Water Resources Strategy
 - 100-Year Water Vision
- Highlighted problems and needs
 - Significant need for water and water infrastructure investments
 - Lack of data availability/access to support decisionmaking and investments

- 2021 Legislative Funding to DEQ
 - Initial scoping and planning for water data platform

Scoping parameters

- Oregon Water Data Portal
 - Internet accessible, single point of access
 - Water-related data and information
 - Data from across state agencies as well as federal, local governments, organizations, other sources of data
 - Users—general public, business, government, etc.

Approach

Stage 1

Current effort

- Identify priority data and information needs
- Evaluate state agencies' existing data sets and IT infrastructure
- Plan single point of access OWDP
- Legislative report with recommendations and initial resource needs

Stage 2

July 2023 - June 2025

- Pilot OWDP using available state agency data
- Develop plans to address data quality, data set and IT gaps
- Engage with local governments re: data

Stage 3

July 2025 and beyond

- Implementation of OWDP
- Agency projects to address data needs
- Continuous improvement
