2024 Session

- February 5 Sine Die March 7
- Over 250 bills introduced
- Tracked roughly 70 bills
- Several technical and budget adjustments

Senate Bill 1567: Walla Walla 2050 Plan

- Directs Department to implement Walla Walla 2050 Plan
- Authority to fund projects implementing the plan partially or wholly in Washington if there is a benefit to instream, out-of-stream, or groundwater in Oregon
- Reporting on legal and regulatory framework:
 - Legislature on or before June 30, 2026
 - Walla Walla River Basin advisory committee in 2025 and in 2026



SB 5701: End of Session Bill

- \$1 million Well Abandonment, Repair and Replacement Fund
- City of Sodaville direct appropriation
 - Technical fix to clarify use of funds (2023)
 - Additional \$60k for water hauling



Direct Appropriations for Water Infrastructure related to Housing

 SB 1530: direct appropriations for water and wastewater system projects

• \$1.5 million: OWRD

• \$88.8 million: BizOR

 HB 4134: direct appropriations for infrastructure projects; several have water infrastructure component

•\$21.2 million: DAS

Budget Process

Agency Request Budget

- Development in early 2024
- Agency working with Governor's Office on POPs for ARB
- Submitted and Published July 31

Governor's Recommended Budget

- Governor and CFO review ARB
- Use Governor's priorities, budget policies, and current law to make budget decisions
- GRB published in December 2024

Legislative Adopted Budget

- Legislative committees review GRB and hold public meeting
- Legislature determines and votes on budget
- Emergency board, special sessions

POP and LC Development Criteria

General considerations

- IWRS recommended actions and be aligned with 2019-2024 strategic plan priorities.
- Realistic timelines and staff capacity given implementation of the new work from the 2021 and 2023 session.
- Potential impacts on DEIJ and underserved communities.
- Improving core agency functions and deliverables to enhance customer service and outcomes.
- LCs: urgent issues that need addressing before end of 2025
- POPs: Fill resource gaps that sustain progress on existing work or benefit the development of internal structures that build strong programmatic foundations.

- Direction to Categorize POPs:
 - Critical to Agency Operations/Customer Service
 - Supports/Enhances Execution of Existing Program Authority
 - Addressing Critical Need to Build Greater Landscape Resiliency
