

Background




The Harney Basin

- Located in southeastern Oregon in the Northern Great Basin
- Closed basin
- Malheur and Harney Lakes lie in the center of the basin and receive water from all the streams in the basin

Observation Well Network Data Collection & Analysis

- Maintain consistent and longterm static groundwater-level data sets
- Evaluate climatic, seasonal, and groundwater
- Measurements conducted quarterly

Regulation & Enforcement

- Enforce existing permit conditions through increased monitoring
- Working to set reference levels for regulating permit decline conditions
- Continuing to monitor for and address unauthorized use
- Continuing to use OpenET data to understand water use throughout the basin



Groundwater Control Tools

Regulatory Tool	Description	What does it manage?
Classification of Water	Classifies or reclassifies waters of Oregon to the highest and best use and quantities of use for the future.	Future New Groundwater Use
Serious Water Management Problem Areas (SWMPA)	Requires reporting and measurement of water use.	Measure Present and Future Groundwater Use
Critical Ground Water Area Designation (CGWA)	A CGWA designation allows for control of current groundwater use.	Present Groundwater Use



What We Heard

We heard from some RAC Members:

- Different levels of understanding around the Harney groundwater situation
- Community and Department need a plan for how to bring folks along
- Pace of rulemaking is too quick/other initiatives too slow
- Questions from the RAC have not been answered by Department
- Identify statutory requirements, policy decisions and where the RAC has influence
- Request to produce the Division 10 groundwater report
- Identify how and when the USGS model will be used



Department's Response

Here is how the Department responded to the RAC:

- Additional RACs being planned
- A portion of the questions have been answered and the rest will continue to be answered
- Department prepared a draft document identifying where the RAC can have input
- During the last RAC, we had a conversation around community learning opportunities
- Draft Division 10 groundwater report being published mid-June
- Work with the RAC to develop scenarios to run in the USGS model

- Goal for groundwater levels in the Harney Basin
- Modeled management scenarios
- Timing of implementation and allocation of the Permissible Total Withdrawal
- Allowed uses (Classification)/ Measuring and reporting
- Voluntary Agreements guidelines for Harney Basin
- Fiscal Impact Statement
- Draft rule language



Non-Regulatory Actions



Harney Community-Based Water Planning Collaborative

- Support the planning group through technical assistance and financial support
- Groundwater portion completed in June 2023





Harney Domestic Well Remediation Fund

- Financial assistance for replacing, repairing or deepening domestic personal use wells within the Greater Harney Valley Groundwater Area of Concern
- First grant solicitation closed May 31, 2024
- Applications under review for completeness and prioritization



Harney Valley Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program

- Landowners voluntarily cancel groundwater rights and in return are paid
- Establishes conservation land for and allows for future grazing
- Enrollment Summer 2024
