Integrated Water Resources Strategy Update (1:00 p.m. – 2:45 p.m.) Staff will discuss with the Commission activities that have taken place related to the "Integrated Water Resources Strategy" since the close of the 2009 Legislative Session, and plans for next steps.  Request for Adoption of Rules Regarding Updates Concerning Dam Safety and the Implementation of Fees for Dam Safety, OAR Chapter 690, Division 20 (3:00 p.m. – 3:30 p.m.)

> Jerry Rodgers, Technical Services Administrator, and George Robison, Dam Safety Engineer, will present a request to adopt administrative rules to update the Division 20 Dam Safety Rules, and in accordance with the requirements of Senate Bill 788, assess an annual fee related to a dams hazard rating. *The Commission will be asked to adopt the final proposed rules*.

The nine-person citizen panel advises the Department and Commission on issues pertaining to ground water and well construction policies. *The Commission will be asked to approve the proposed appointments*.

***Public Testimony:** The Commission encourages public comment on any agenda item. However, public testimony may be limited on items marked with an asterisk (*). The asterisk means that the item has already been the subject of a formal public hearing or contested case hearing. On certain items marked with an asterisk, the Commission may be authorized to allow public comments.

People wishing to speak to the Commission are asked to fill out a comment request sheet (available at the information table). Comments relating to a specific agenda item will be heard by the Commission as each agenda item is considered. Comments on other topics may be made during the public comment period on Friday at approximately 11:30 a.m.

Early delivery of written comments is strongly encouraged so that Commissioners have sufficient opportunity to review materials prior to the meeting. 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DIRECTIONS TO THE MEETING

From I-5

Take Exit 256 (Market Street). Heading west on Market, go approx. 2 miles to Summer Street. Turn left onto Summer Street. Go less than 1/2 mile to our building. Our building is located on your right between the Department of State Lands and the Employment Building.

Parking
