S. Water Measurement Training

If time allows, the Commission will get a short outdoor training session on how field staff take water measurements. Commission and staff will meet at the Mill Creek Gage that is located behind North Salem High School.

Public Testimony: The Commission encourages public comment on any agenda item. However, public testimony may be limited on items marked with an asterisk (). The asterisk means that the item has already been the subject of a formal public hearing or contested case hearing. On certain items marked with an asterisk, the Commission may be authorized to allow public comments.

People wishing to speak to the Commission are asked to fill out a comment request sheet (available at the information table). Comments relating to a specific agenda item will be heard by the Commission as each agenda item is considered. Comments on other topics may be made during the public comment period on Friday at approximately 11:00 a.m.

Early delivery of written comments is strongly encouraged so that Commissioners have sufficient opportunity to review materials prior to the meeting. 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DIRECTIONS TO THE MEETING

From I-5
