Driving Directions to NW Viticulture Center

From North of Salem

Take I-5 S toward Salem. Take the Salem Parkway / OR-99E Business Exit 260A. Approx. 3 miles, (just past Fred Meyer) the street veers to the left, turning into Commercial Street NE. Follow Commercial to Marion Street NE, approx. 1 mile. Turn right onto Marion Street Bridge. As you go over the bridge, stay in the left hand lane heading towards the Coast. Go approx. 4 miles to Doaks Ferry Road (Eola Inn Restaurant will be on your left and Holman State Park will be on your right). Turn right onto Doaks Ferry. Follow road for approx. ¼ mile. Entrance to NW Viticulture Center will be on your left.

From South of Salem

Take I-5 N toward Salem. Take the OR-22 / OR-99E Business (Stayton/Detroit Lake) Exit 253. Turn left onto OR-22 / OR-99E. Heading West, go approx. 2 miles. As you pass 17th Street, stay in far right lane. Take 12th Street / State Offices off-ramp. Stay to the right. You are now on 12th Street. Take 12th Street to Marion Street (approx. ½ mile). Turn left onto Marion Street (Safeway will be on your right). Follow Marion Street over the bridge (approx. ¾ mile). As you go over the bridge, stay in the left hand lane heading towards the Coast. Go approx. 4 miles to Doaks Ferry Road (Eola Inn Restaurant will be on your left and Holman State Park will be on your right). Turn right onto Doaks Ferry. Follow road for approx. ¼ mile. Entrance to NW Viticulture Center will be on your left.

The asterisk means that the item has already been the subject of a formal public hearing or contested case hearing. On certain items marked with an asterisk, the Commission may be authorized to allow public comments.

at the information table). Comments relating to a specific agenda item will be heard by the Commission as each agenda item is considered. Comments on other topics may be made during the public comment period on Thursday at approximately 11:45 am.

Directions to the Water Resources Department

I-5 South or North

From Interstate 5, take Exit 253 (Highway 22/Mission Street) heading west. Follow signs to the 12th Street off-ramp (about 3 miles). Take 12th Street off-ramp and merge with northbound 12th Street traffic. Follow 12th Street to Union Street (12th turns into Union). Go 3 blocks to Winter Street. Turn right on Winter Street. The Water Resources Department is on the east side of Winter Street between the Employment Building and Department of State Lands.

Street parking (2 hr) is available on the west side of the building. Metered parking is available along Summer Street and Union Streets. Hourly parking is available at Cliff's Automotive located on the corner of Court and Capitol Streets. Daily parking is available at the State "yellow lot" located at Marion and Summer Streets for \$6/day (machine takes bills and coins; gives change and a receipt). A Park and Ride lot is located at the State Motor Pool with buses running approximately every 15-30 minutes.
