- Background
 - WRD charged with ensuring that Oregon has water for economy and environment
 - Majority of funding from General Fund (64%)
 - Funding is declining and of grave concern
 - Revenue Enhancement Subcommittee formed

- Revenue options guided by key criteria
 - Those who benefit should help pay
 - Solutions should be equitable between user groups
 - Fees should be tied to services provided
 - Funds should be dedicated to the purpose for which they are collected

- Overview of process
 - Revenue Enhancement Subcommittee formed in August, 2010 to find an equitable way to stabilize funding
 - Stakeholder forum Nov, 2010 (30+ Orgs)
 - Developed potential alternatives
 - Currently exploring four proposals

Goal: Fee revenue supports 50% of costs Current budget is \$10-12 Million annually

1) Water Rights Management Fee	\$100 Annual	60,000	\$6.0 million	\$5.0 million

- Benefits of Water Right Management Fee
 - Fully support distribution of water to senior water right holders through field watermasters
 - Faster resolution to water right conflicts
 - Accurate Water Right ownership information
 - Installation and management of stream gages to manage flows
 - Provide staffing to enable the Water Resources
 Department to fulfill statutory mandates

- Benefits of Exempt Well Fee
 - Support of scientific information needed to make groundwater management and allocation decisions
 - Groundwater availability evaluation
 - Resolution of <u>well to well</u> and <u>well to surface</u> water interference/conflicts
 - More effective and timely management of groundwater resources
 - Provide staffing to enable the Water Resources
 Department to fulfill statutory mandates

- WRD currently has a \$10 \$12 million annual General Fund budget
- Legislative concepts presented to Governor in April, 2012
- Next step is to determine which, if any, fees to move forward and amounts

- Subcommittee Recommendation:
 - Pursue
 - Water Right Management Fee
 - Exempt Well Fee
 - Increased Reimbursement Authority
 - Move forward with development of legislative concept
